

### LEARN

- Invite an eye professional to your club to educate Lions and Leos on common eye diseases that may cause blindness if left untreated.
- · Access the "Lions Eye Health Program" to educate yourself and your club about blindness prevention.
- Invite a person who is blind or has low vision to talk about technology that aids in mobility or navigation and activities of daily living.
- Complete the free online "Blindness Basics Course" at Hadley School for the Blind to better understand blindness.
- · Serve a meal at your club and invite members to eat while blindfolded to raise awareness and build empathy.

## **ACT // BEGINNER**

- Collect used eyeglasses and send them to the nearest Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center.
- Organize a braille, large print and audio book collection to benefit a local school, library or senior center.
- Volunteer to create audio recordings of books and periodicals for people who are blind.

## **ACT // INTERMEDIATE**

- Work with local eye care professionals to provide a wide variety of community screenings including early childhood, school and all age's vision screenings.
- Utilizing the Lions Eye Health Program materials, host a public event to promote healthy vision and increase awareness of common eye diseases that can cause vision loss.
- · Sponsor a World Sight Day event.
- Sponsor visually impaired students through camps, contests or other activities
- Create a community arts program for children and adults who are visually impaired.
- Collaborate with an eye bank to promote the importance of corneal donations.
- Develop a directory of community resources and services available for people who are blind or have low vision.
- Volunteer at a recreational camp, rehabilitation or vocational training center for children or adults who are blind or visually impaired.
- Organize an inclusive sporting event for children with and without visual impairment.
- Host a fundraiser to purchase and donate white canes to people who are blind or visually impaired in your community.

## **ACT // ADVANCED**

- Work with local employers to develop an employee vision screening program.
- Develop a coupon or voucher program with local optical shops for underserved populations to receive corrective eye wear at a reduced cost or for free.
- Design a transportation program for school children, working adults and seniors who are blind or have low vision.
- Host a "Beep Baseball" game or tournament.
- Support a guide dog training program through fundraising or voluntary labor.
- Develop an assistive technology library so people who have vision impairment can access resources as their needs change.
- Create a sensory garden with plants, water features, and sculptures that engage the senses of touch, smell, hearing and taste. Provide braille or audio recordings of signage.
- Partner with a school for the blind to support their curriculum, assistive technology and maintenance needs.
- Partner with an orientation and mobility specialist to provide ongoing support to teachers of inclusive classrooms and employers of inclusive workplaces.

At this giving time of the year, if you would like to make a personal donation to LCIF, you have several options. You may donate online by credit card either as a one-time gift, or as an automatically recurring gift. Currently, there is no option to have money automatically taken from a bank account. Due to PCI (Payment Card Industry) Data Security Standard Compliance, credit card donations cannot be taken over the phone or in writing. Here are the step-by-step directions for making a credit card donation:

- 1. Go to the Lions Clubs International Website (www.lionsclubs.org).
- 2. Click on the "Donate" button on the upper right of the screen.
- 3. Click on "Give to Empowering Service Fund" or "Give to Disaster Relief Fund"
- 4. Choose the amount you would like to donate.
- 5. Choose from "One-Time-Gift" or one of the recurring gift options.
- 6. Choose the type of donor (Member, Non-Member, Club or District, or Business).
- 7. Fill in the edit fields with the appropriate information.
- 8. Choose whether you would like the "Lions Share" pin or not.
- 9. Indicate whether or not your gift is to be anonymous
- 10. Select the form of Recognition you want, if any. If so:
  - a. Fill in the edit fields with the relevant information
  - b. Fill in the Shipping Address
- 11. Indicate your payment preference (currently only Credit Card) and fill in the Name and Card Number.
- 12. Click "Submit"
- 13. Receive the gratitude of LCIF and the people "We Serve"!

Of course, you can still write a check and mail in a donation. Include the "Donor Recognition Form" and/or the "Melvin Jones Fellowship Application Form", and mail to:

### Criteria for the award -

- May be a Lion or Lioness
- ❖ Must have been a member in good standing for at least 15 years
- Must be at least 2 years removed from the Council of Governors, if a PDG
- Have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors
- Should be of good moral character and
- Should have a good reputation in good standing in his/her community
- ❖ If deceased, must have been a member in good standing of a MD5M Lions or Lioness club at the time of his/her death.

### **Process**

- Nomination fee of \$150.00 for each candidate nominated must accompany the nomination to the District Governor. This fee is returned to you if your candidate is not the chosen recipient during the Mid-Winter convention voting.
- ❖ All nominations must be received by District Governor Diana no later than 30 days, prior to our Mid-Winter Convention. January 09, 2019 will be the deadline.
- ❖ An election for the recipient from 5M-2 will be held during the annual meeting at the Mid-Winter convention on February 09, 2019. The winner of that election will be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the 2019 Multiple District Convention in Mahnomen, April 27, 2019.
- ❖ Information, as well as the nomination form, is available online at www.5m2lions.org. : Forms and Award Applications, MD5M Hall of Fame nomination form.

Each of your clubs has a Lion who fits the criteria needed for a nomination to the Hall of Fame. While only one 5M-2 Lion will be awarded the honor in 2019, every Lion nominated will be featured at the Mid-Winter convention when their bios are presented to the membership. ## **HEARING FOUNDATION NEWS**



Thanksgiving is past and I hope all were able to be with friends and family.

The Lion Multiple District Hearing Foundation was founded in 1973 to promote the advance-

ment of research and programs concerned with hearing health and communication disorders. A voice clinic has been established to treat and educate voice disorders. They aim to provide a full range of state of the art voice care.

The District 5M Hearing Foundation began a free hearing aids service to infants who are newly identified with hearing loss. This is through the Hearing Aid Loaner program now administered by the University Department of Health.

A statewide voluntary newborn hearing screening program was established in every hospital in Minnesota. The program dramatically decreased the average age at which hearing impairment was detected and improved treatment outcomes.

There are Lions Hearing Research Fellowship Awards available to be presented to deserving Lion members. Applications are available.

## Viewing Forward



MN Lions Vision Foundation

True or false? Lions Gift of Sight is another name for Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation.

This is a question I posed at a couple zone meetings this fall. Some of us are informed but others guessed incorrectly. FALSE is the answer. This can be a confusing issue but I can explain.

In 1960, the University of Minnesota founded its eye bank with great support of the Lions of Minnesota. We were there as Knights of the Blind, fulfilling the charge given to us by Helen Keller so many decades earlier. For this reason, as everyday Lions, we all know that we support the Eye Bank. And, in our busy minds, we don't think much further.

But we are so much more than that. A couple years ago, the Eye Bank at the University of Minnesota changed its name to Lions Gift of Sight (LGS). LGS is the nonprofit eye bank operating for us and the Upper Midwest. Providing corneal transplants and many research projects in hopes of improving vision compromised by many eye diseases.

So what is the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation (MLVF)? MLVF has developed over the years as the Lions foundation encompassing more than LGS. We are a 501(c)3 organization providing funds to LGS and also the Research Department

at the Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Neurosciences, the MAC Center, the Children's Eye Clinic, the Lions Surgery Center, Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center. And, on occasion, we provide funds to other vision entities, most recently start up funds for Kidsight here in Minnesota. All parts of District 5M are represented by two directors on the MLVF Board (currently Lions Mary Spille and Christy Trutnau).

Back to LGS. Lions Gift of Sight is located on Westgate Drive in St. Paul. Highly accredited by the Eye Bank Association of America, our eye bank is dependent on eye donations for both corneal transplants and eye research. We are all super proud of this first class operation. This eye bank is supported by the Department of Ophthalmology, its doctors and staff. The eye bank also has its own researchers and support staff. Attending Thanksgiving for Vision or the spring tours are ways to learn much and to feel really, really good that you are a Lion!

Note to clubs with gambling funds – all donation checks must be written to MLVF so that you are giving to a 501(c)3 organization.

Lion Christy and I are anxious to visit your clubs sharing the passion of Lions' original mission. As directors, we continue to View Forward. Our legacy is great and our goals will continue to be met. We are your directors ready to serve. Give us a shout – maryspille@gmail.com or christy1135@gmail.com. Together, "WE SERVE" continues.






