WOW!! As I write this news
article I can reflect on three (3)
fantastic days of information,
networking, and meeting fellow
Lions, both new friends made
and reacquainting with others at

the 41st USA Canada Lions Leadership Forum held in Portland, Oregon. If you have a desire to learn more about leadership, Lions or service in general, consider traveling to one of the upcoming USA Canada Leadership Forums. There are between 50 – 60 seminars from which to choose, dynamic and motivational speakers during the meals and just plain fun meeting Lions from throughout the USA and Canada and beyond.

I like to attend the legal sessions to keep up to date on what we can and cannot do as a club and generally come away with a wealth of information. This year was no exception. I learned there is a "Lions Club Self-Inspection Checklist" available on the LCI website that will assist our clubs in evaluating our risk when thinking about, planning or holding an event. Some of the examples that Amy from LCI legal gave us dealt with safe food and safe environments i.e. carpets. I knew that LCI liability insurance does not cover issues related to the serving and distribution of liquor at an event; however, I learned that LCI liability insurance still covers an injury that might arise at the same event but not related to the liquor. The use of funds raised from the public was again a topic of discussion. Amy explained that LCI is very strict on the use of all funds received from the public. Even if IRS code allows certain procedures with public funds, LCI go above IRS standards in order to protect our brand. This means that all funds raised at an event open to the public, even those from our Lions members, are to go back to the public. In other words, if your club has a fund raiser and sells tickets to the public, you should not take a percentage of the proceeds as Lions contribution or have a different colored ticket for your Lions members. More on this issue will be presented in future newsletters.

On Saturday afternoon, the 2017 Lions University

Graduation was held. This year, five (5) District 5M2 Lions completed online courses and received certificates. Graduating from the Bachelor's Program were Diana Kroells – Hamburg Lions, Martha Reger – Jordaness Lions, Brian Thies – Green Isle Lions, and Don Wickenhauser – Cologne Lions. Receiving a certificate for the Master's Program was Anna Wickenhauser – Cologne Lions. Congratulations to all of you!!!! LIONS HEARING FOUNDATION



tember 17. It was a fun event for recipients and their families to enjoy great food, games and activities. There were over a 100 guests of all ages, very young and elders.



August 28, 2017 (Waconia) – The Waconia Lions Club has announced that they are organizing a trip in April 2018 to take Korean and Vietnam War veterans to Washington DC.

The trip will take place on April 25, 2018 and will be similar to a trip organized for World War II veterans 10 years before, in 2008. Veterans who are current residents of Carver County, or were at the time of their service are eligible for the trip.

"Our Lions club has had a focus on honoring our veterans for many years, most recently when we brought the Wounded Warriors Amputee Softball team to Waconia in 2013, and our annual military mailing program," said Lion Richard Beckett. "The World War II trip was an amazing event, and we have decided to do it again."

The trip includes transportation to the airport, flight to Washington DC, lunch and transportation to the Korea and Vietnam memorials and other monuments, memorial ceremony in Washington, return flight, and a welcome reception when the group arrives back in Waconia. Interested veterans should visit the Club website or Facebook page for the application form and more details.

The Lions have estimated that the trip will cost around \$83,000 to organize, and they will begin looking to the people and businesses in Carver County to raise the funds. Current Waconia Lions President Jason Wagener said, "The last time we did something like this, we concentrated our efforts and received amazing support from Waconia. For this project, we are going to try to involve the entire County in raising money and identifying eligible Veterans."

The Lions will be visiting other organizations around Carver County to spread the word about the project and ask for participation. Anyone is welcome to donate in any amount, but there are also several specific donation opportunities available for anyone who wants to be involved.

"We are looking for a business or organization to step up and cover the cost of ground transportation for these veterans, which would be a \$7500 commitment," said Lion Rick Wagener. "We also need a major donor to cover the cost of the lunch for the guys in Washington, which would be about \$4,000."

The Club estimates that it will cost about \$750 for each veteran on the trip, plus several volunteers from the club and a few other support people to participate.

Donations can be mailed to Waconia Lions Veterans Memorial Trip, PO Box 21, Waconia, MN 55387, or made in person at Hometown Bank in Waconia. Several participating businesses will have donation

boxes available at the counter, and the Lions will have an online donation portal available soon on their website (www.waconialionsclub.org).

The Waconia Lions have a long history of taking on large projects to benefit the community. Since 1945, they have worked to clean the shores of Lake Waconia, and to establish "Lakeside Park" in the 1940s which eventually grew into the Waconia Regional Park. They designed and built the gazebo in Waconia City Square Park, and have been a large supporter of Ridgeview Hospital since its inception. They have been sponsors of Boy Scout Troop 327 since the troop was founded in 1946.

More recently, they have worked to install five service branch flags in City Square Park, helped to purchase lighting and a new grandstand for the ballpark at Lions Field. They also helped build the skateboard park, and the "Lions Den" at Safari Island.

The Club has an annual Wild Game Dinner fundraiser, and supports many annual service projects in Waconia: Take a Kid Fishing, delivering poinsettias to nursing homes at Christmas, Adopt-a-Highway cleanup on Highway 5, the Easter Egg Hunt, Military mailing, and blood drives twice a year.

"This organization has always been about giving back to the community," said Lion Ron Machtemes. "Whatever we can do to help, we usually find a way. This is one of those projects where a guy says 'hey we should do this' and the rest of the Club steps up to make it happen."

Lion Jim Sanborn said, "We have seen how a project like this can bring the whole community together, not only for raising money, but to honor these men for their service to our country. Many of them did not receive a welcome home when they returned from the War, and we want to make sure they know how much they are appreciated."


