Membership – Just Ask!

Such simple words, "Just Ask! and yet these words can make the difference between a healthy, thriving club or a struggling club.

We are in the last quarter of the 2013-2014 Lions year and now is the time to take a look at where your club is in membership and to develop an action plan to end the year on a strong note with increased membership and retention of existing members.

As you can see in this newsletter, our total membership for 5M-2 is down 22 members. At the end of December, we were up 8 members. Then the January billing for dues came out and there were huge drops. I believe that these numbers can once again be in the positive and should be in the positive to ensure our clubs serve to the best of their ability. Now is the time to get "Fired Up" for recruiting. There is an excellent New Member Recruiting Guide for Clubs on the Lions International website at www.lionsclubs.org. If you go to this website, on the home page there is a search box in the very upper right hand corner and type in "Just Ask". This should bring up a comprehensive 20-page guide.

Just Ask! is designed to guide your club through the process of recruiting new members and effectively managing club growth. The strength of your membership and the health of your club will determine your ability to do what all Lions love to do – serve. If you are unable to access this document, just ask me and I will promptly send you a copy. It is well worth your reading and implementing!

One of my Governor's goals for this year is to have 50% of the clubs in our district achieve the "Club Excellence Award". In order to quality for this award, a club must have a plus one in membership. At the present time, District 5M-2 has 23 clubs that qualify out of 63 clubs, for 36%. I am confident that with some creative planning and just asking our friends, coworkers or even our family members to become Lions, we can strive to make a plus one for every club.

I do have to give a shout out to the following clubs who have make recruitment a priority this year: Lake Crystal Lions, plus 7; Cologne Lions, plus 6, Jordan Jordaness Lions, plus 5, Silver Lake Lions, plus 4 and Waterville **Lions**, plus 3. The following clubs have a plus 1 or 2; Albert Lea Lions, Albert Lea LakeView Lions, Arlington Lions, Hamburg Lions, Hutchinson Lions, Jordan Lions, Lafayette Lions, Lester Prairie Lions, Mankato Sunrise Lions, N.E.W. Lions, Owatonna Lions, Prior Lake Lions, St. Peter Lions, Stewart Lions, Waconia Lions, Waseca Lions, Watertown Lions and Winnebago Lions. Congratulations to all these clubs for Just Asking! I will be thrilled if I could add another 20 to 30 clubs to this list. That would mean 20 to 30 more Lions helping to serve. That is a great dream!



After researching "Little Free Library" on line, Lion Diana Kroells decided this would be the perfect project and she knew the perfect person to build the library, Lion Willard Fuellner, an excellent craftsman. It was decided to model the library with a German theme. Lion Diane Hoffman assisted in the painting and even put little flower boxes on each window.

The library works like a neighborhood book exchange. Readers are encouraged to take a book out and replace it with one of their favorite books so that others may enjoy it. The mission of the "Little Free Library" is to promote literacy and the love of reading and to build a sense of community as we share skills, creativity and wisdom across the generations.
