Recurring donations: You must contact Donor Services via phone @ (630) 203-3836 and tell them you want to designate your donations to SPECIAL OLYMPICS MN. Remember to change your recurring contribution back to wherever you want it to go after we have met our \$350k Goal.

What are you doing to make sure your community knows your meeting dates / locations. Attached here are easy to use "We are Lions Meetings Posters". Resources like these are located on the Lions International website. Each month we will add some of the resources for you to see and hopefully use!

Goals and Action Plans:

Each club is asked to set membership goals for Lions year 25-26. It is important for each club to set membership goals, develop an action plan for each of those goals, and communicate those goals to all members in the club. Membership growth is not solely the responsibility of the membership chair, rather a collective effort for all members in the club. If your club doesn't have a membership team, ask to be part of the team! More members = more service in your community.

Included here is a Membership Action Plan template for your club to use. As a membership team, create membership goals and then create a plan on how you are going to achieve your goals! It is critical that you SHARE your plan with all members of your club. Continue to monitor and adjust your plan as we move through Lions Year 25-26! Good luck!

Lions Portal: Adding / Deleting / Editing Membership

Club secretaries enter membership into the Lions Portal. All Lions have access to Lions Portal. If you do not know your login, or if your club needs help walking through the membership process, please reach out to your District Membership Coordinator or District Administrator for help! It is best to stay current with your membership entries in the Lions Portal.

Lions is often associated with local Lion's Park or as the group that collects eyeglasses. While these are part of us, we need to make sure that we are sharing ALL the good we do! As mentioned in our last update, we are in the process of upgrading our Kidsight cameras. Our current cameras are over eight years old, and due to technological advancements, we can no longer obtain extended warranties for them.

At our recent Zoom meeting, we had the opportunity to see a demonstration of the new cameras by a representative from Plus Optix. The presentation was highly informative, and all our questions were thoroughly addressed.

To ensure our program remains efficient, we may need additional funding from Parade of Green next year to purchase new cameras for our district. Investing in updated technology will allow us to continue providing high-quality screenings for children.

Expanding School Screenings

Kidsight has seen great success with several clubs gaining access to schools, leading to an increase in screenings. It's important to remember that a screening is not a diagnosis—it simply identifies potential vision issues and recommends further evaluation by parents. To streamline the process, we recommend working with school nurses to include the blanket consent form in the packet of forms that parents complete at the beginning of the school year, giving the parents an opportunity to Opt out if they choose.

Additionally, we now recommend screening students in 6th, 7th, and 8th grade, as vision changes often occur during puberty. Some clubs have also started participating in spring kindergarten roundups, which is another great opportunity to ensure children receive vision screenings. Once schools see how efficient our process is, they will likely invite us to do even more.

Kidsight's International Growth

Our Canadian counterparts in the Multiple District are doing an excellent job with screenings, and we are excited to see Kidsight expanding internationally. The success of our program continues to grow, thanks to the dedication of our volunteers.



Club Training & Reporting

To improve training, we are shifting to a club-specific training model for Kidsight. This approach will provide personalized instruction on camera use and reporting procedures. Reports are essential, as they document screenings and referrals, ensuring that children who need further evaluation receive the necessary follow-up.

Recognizing Outstanding Clubs & Volunteers

We are incredibly grateful for the Lions clubs and volunteers who have made Kidsight a success. Some of the standout clubs include:






