


As we enter this Advent Season, Lion Evelyn and your District Governor wish you a Happy Holiday Season for you and yours. Merry Christmas.


### **More Good News!**

### GLOBAL LEADERSHIP TEAM - GLT

By now you have undoubtedly seen the origami crane symbol our International President is using this year. Have you wondered why he chose it? Read the below story to learn why.

"EVERY YEAR, thousands of small cranes cross over the Himalayas at an altitude of 8000m in V formation for their seasonal migration. They are known as demoiselle cranes and they are the smallest species in the crane family of birds. During the summer, they reside in the steppes of Mongolia. As winter approaches they form groups and begin their southward journey to India. At 8,000 meters, the temperature is minus thirty Celsius and the oxygen saturation is only one third of the terrestrial oxygen level. Those brutal conditions make their migration a life or death journey in the truest sense. This grueling route would be impossible for a small number of birds. By flying in a large V formation, each bird can make use of the backflow of air over the wings of the other birds in front of them and by doing so, reduce the total energy expended. The leading bird expends the greatest amount of energy so it is necessary to continually rotate new birds into the position. The demoiselle crane depends upon the cooperation and harmony of every other member of the flock. While each bird is small, every bird has great dignity."

### LIONS CLUBS OFFER 'PROJECT NEW HOPE' TO HELP OUR RETURNING COMBAT VETERANS

The Lions of Multiple District 5M have adopted a new project, Project New Hope. In the opinion of many Lions, this undertaking is one of the most impressive, and necessary, projects the Lions have become involved in for years. Project New Hope was founded by caring individuals right here in Minnesota. This project has established Military Family Retreats for veterans and their families. There are several such retreats around Minnesota, and are available to all U. S. Veterans and their families.

The cost of these camps is FREE to all veterans and their families, and all meals are provided at no charge. The entire family is involved, and counseling is available to all. The effects of combat service are often felt throughout a soldier's entire lifetime, and can have an impact on each family member as well, often in ways that may be quite subtle or hidden from view.

The process of healing and understanding is a vital component to a successful life after their service. All family members, including the returning soldier, deal with what has happened in their own way. This is where the Lions hope that our camps will be of help, as counseling is available to individuals or to the family as a group. The counselors are licensed by the Veterans Affairs Association, but they are volunteers and available to all who attend the camps. An added feature is that ALL of these camps and facilities are handicapped accessible.

The established camps are: Camp Friendship, Annandale; Camp Eden Wood, Eden Prairie; Camp New Hope, McGregor; Camp Courage, Maple Lake; Camp Courage North, Lake George; Camp Vanasek, Brainerd; Inspiration Point Camp, Clitheral; Ironwood Springs, Stewartville. These Camps are all located among woodlands featuring lakes, wide-open spaces, waterfronts, hiking trails, fire pits and most have year-around recreation opportunities.

It does not matter in which era the soldier served, starting with WWII and right on through Korea, Viet Nam and the recent wars in the Middle East. All U.S. veterans and their families are welcome at our camps. As stated, all services are free and financial concerns will NEVER prevent us from offering our services to soldiers and their families. In some cases, there are gas cards available.

All of the staff members are volunteers, and there is no administrative cost. Absolutely no cost is passed on to the attendees at these camps. As an added touch families are presented with a hand-made quilt at the end of their week end. Again, volunteers have made the quilts and donated them to the camps.

Project New Hope began its journey back in 2007, and one of the driving forces behind this newest Lions project, was Lion Dale Johansen of the Underwood Lions. Lion Dale, himself a Viet Nam veteran realized that returning veterans often need help and he has worked tirelessly toward that end. At the moment there is work taking place in other states to urge them to follow Minnesota's lead and provide much-needed assistance to our returning heroes.

Project New Hope is a most deserving project and the Lions of Minnesota ask for your help in supporting returning veterans who have risked their lives on a daily basis for us here at home. Please help the Lions Clubs of Minnesota help our returning veterans. Lion Darlene Wondra, a member of the Montgomery Lions Club, is District 5M-2 chairman of Project New Hope. If you could save a child's sight with the press of a button, wouldn't you?

That's the idea behind Lions KidSight USA, a new national initiative announced by Lions in the United States. Lions KidSight USA was launched to help ensure that children between the ages of six months and six years receive vision screening and professional follow-up care when needed.

To accomplish this, KidSight USA will work with new and existing screening programs to get more handheld screening devices into the hands of Lions—and more kids in front of them.

"KidSight USA is an important national initiative that will help families protect the eye health of their children," said International President Joe Preston. "It builds on our proud history of saving sight and our belief that all children deserve to see the world clearly. With the help of Lions, we hope they will."

Lions KidSight USA wants to reach kids early because some vision problems can become permanent by age seven. But vision issues can be easily detected with hand-held screening devices that even generate the results on-site. With only a few minutes of training, Lions and volunteers can learn to screen the vision of a child. Lions in the U.S. currently screen more than 500,000 kids per year through state and local programs often known as "KidSight." Lions KidSight USA wants to expand the number of screening

programs so Lions can change the lives of even

more children around the country.

I am privileged to be part of the team that is in the process of developing a comprehensive plan to bring KidSight to MD5M. Working with the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation, we recently purchased our first optical screener from Welch Allen, and received training on its use. We will also be evaluating the latest screener from Plusoptix. We are currently exploring partnerships with Head Start and the Minnesota Child Care Association. Look for more information in the near future as this exciting Lions project makes its way to our District 5M2 and all of MD5M!






