<u>Introduction of Guests</u>: DG Brian Thies introduced all guests: ID Bob Block and Lion Brenda Block, PDGs Ellsworth Becker, Arden Severson and Orville Trettin, Lions Duane Kroells, Don Wickenhauser, Evelyn Grimm, Darlene Breamer, Rene Maus, Kevin Blank, Jack Stewart and Shirley.

<u>Adoption of the Agenda</u>: Motion to approve agenda Lion Kathleen Bleckeberg; seconded by Lion Emmy Koch; **MC**.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Motion to approve by PDG Joan Blank, seconded by Lion Janet Knakmuhs, **MC.**

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Lion Sue Vos sent her report. Motion by PDG Marvin Grimm and seconded by Lion Shirley Hespenheide to accept the Treasurer's Report, **MC**. Copy is attached at the end of this report.

<u>Comments</u>: DG Brian Thies – Governors did approve the nomination of 1st Vice President Candidate Douglas Alexander for International President.

<u>St. Charles Training</u>: 1st VDG Anna Wickenhauser – Recently returned from 1st VDG training in St. Charles, III. We do a great job in our multiple with training our members but you always can learn new things from others. It was exhausting, emotional, tiring, awesome and many other adjectives.

Communications: None.

Old Business:

 Update on LCIF Grant for Camp Sweet Life: DG Brian Thies, Lion Rene Maes – He thanked all the Lions Clubs for making donations for Camp Sweet Life. He handed out the grant report, financial report and budget to the cabinet. Last year's camp they anticipated 100 kids and had 120.

Report follows:

- Our Camp Sweet Life Camp Committee continues to meet on a monthly basis to plan and organize camp 2020.
- 2. Camp goals for 2020- 120 overnight campers. 15 day campers, and a staff of 75 (this is similar to 2019 as our camp committee feels the need to work out a few details with Camp Courage.
- 3. Camp Theme for 2020 "Around the World 2020"! Camp Registration for Campers, Medical Staff, Counselors, Counselors in Training, and Program Staff is now open.
- 4. Camp Courage held three meetings with Camp Courage in reference to:
 - a. Fiber Optics improvement needed for diabetic devices

- b. Camp Food and Menur: our Registered Nutritionist is taking the charge on working with Camp Courage staff on CSL Carb Books and Menu.
- c. Staff meeting with Camp Courage staff consultant on camp staff and utilizing like camp staff for Courage and Camp Sweet Life.
- 5. Budget and payments from LCIF Grant attached to report.
- Donations received by Lions Clubs and other donations (this money is held in Camp Sweet Life Checking account and will be transferred to LCIF checking account set up at the Cornerstone State Bank in order to receive \$25,000 matching yet to come in from LCIF
- 7. To date donations received from Lions Clubs: \$25,825.

This report is the 6th month mandatory report for LCI. Lion Wanda Breimhorst made a motion to accept the report as submitted, seconded by Lion Kathleen Bleckeberg. **MC.**

- Constitution and By Laws: PDG Steve Wasserman Constitution and By-Laws went out to all clubs.
 - He pointed out that LCI has put forward language that GAT; GLT, GMT, GST and LCIF shall be non-voting members of the cabinet. So that will be a change to our By-laws.
 - Language mandated by LCI regarding Region Chairs that they need to attend a meeting of every club in the District and every Clubs Business Meeting.
 - Language in our constitution that the District Convention shall be held within the district. It is being
 proposed that that language be struck. Proposing to allow us to hold a District Convention outside of
 the district.

PDG Steve Wasserman made a motion that the cabinet endorse these By-Law changes; Lion Chuck Toltzman seconded. **MC.**

- 2021 MD5M Multiple Convention Report: PDG Nancy Mathwig and PDG Mike Vos The 2021 MD5M Host Convention committee has met on November 20, 2019 and January 29, 2020. The following items are completed or close to completed:
 - Convention will be April 30, May 1 & 2, 2021 at the Mayo Clinic Health System Event Center (formerly known as Mankato Civic Center or Verizon Wireless Center). For ease of reference, Mayo Event Center is being utilized.
 - 2. Hotels will be Hilton Garden Inn (Headquarters Hotel), City Center Hotel and Courtyard by Marriott. Contracts for the Hilton and Marriott have been reviewed by MD5M legal, signed by PDG Nancy and returned to the hotels. An updated contract for the Mayo Event Center has been received and will be sent to MD5M legal for review after a meeting with Event Center staff today, 2/14/2020. We are still attempting to obtain a contract for the Mankato City Center hotel. PDG's Nancy and Mike hope to meet with a hotel representative this weekend. Mayo Event Center will be assisting us in obtaining the needed contract, if necessary.
 - 3. PIP Frank Moore and his wife, Rita, will serve as our International guests for the MD5M Convention in Mankato. Frank was President in 2001-02 but has been our current LCI Executive Administrator and Secretary in Oakbrook for the past numerous years. Lion Frank is current on what is happening with all divisions in LCI and can speak on where LCI is headed in the future. PIP Frank was our International guest for the 2001 MD5M Convention in Duluth when he was 1st International Vice President.
 - 4. Registration development is moving forward. We will be utilizing the Eventbrite program for our online registration. This is the program that is being used by the Northern Pride Lions Forum. A huge thank you to Lion Christy Trutnau for working on this and working out the details needed to have both an online registration and the traditional "hardcopy". MD5M Executive Secretary Vicki Violet and Lion Christy met early this morning to set up the 2021 convention site in order to have it ready by the 2020 MD5M Convention in Rochester on May 1 3, 2020. As has become tradition, we will be present in Rochester to take early registrations from convention attendees.

- 5. Theme for the convention will build on our previous themes. Theme chose is "Bend in the River III Join the Jamboree".
- 6. We have not received an update from the current Council of Governors convention committee on their recommendation for choosing the silent auction/raffle room Foundation. PDG Nancy has had a couple requests from foundations that have not participated before in a raffle room at the MD5M convention.
- 7. Committee members toured the Mayo Event Center today since many had not seen the section that was opened since the 2016 convention. Lions Mike, Sue and Nancy then met with the Mayo Event Center staff to work out the final details on set-up and food before the contract is signed due back by April 1, 2020. PDG's Nancy and Mike also met with representatives of the Hilton Garden Inn to discuss details of the block of rooms that will be available at the Hilton.
- 8. There is a pending contract to sell this hotel which includes major construction. Depending on timelines the event center will work with us to find other spaces.
- 2020 5M2 Midwinter Convention: Lions Lori Klein and Brian Rykhus –Are we ready...Driven to Serve....Loads of Fun. We are happy to have ID Bob Block and Lion Brenda with us for the weekend. The Clubs of Zone 5 have been meeting monthly to plan the convention. Committee members have taken on various roles and attended the meetings to put all the plans together for the convention this weekend. During set up, staff from the City Center Hotel have been very flexible, helpful and have gone out of their way to make sure this year's convention runs smoothly. Currently, there are 278 people registered. The schedule contains a full and informative weekend of events that will make us all realize why we are Lions. We are excited to have the Tuxedo Band for Friday night entertainment. Saturday night entertainment will be "Minute Games" following the banquet. Lots of time has been put to work to make sure that this year's 5M2 Mid-Winter Convention is "Loads of Fun". Tentative numbers for meals: Saturday 227 Banquet 140; Sunday Brunch 118 people. 69 for the ID Dinner this evening. Lion Lori gave an update on a former Lonsdale Lion Dr. Bruce Lieske had a major heart attack. He went home Wednesday. She passed around 2 cards to send our thoughts to Bruce.
- **FMSC District Project:** Lion Dar Gave an update on the project. She has a table with information our district has 240 slots to fill and she is able to help everyone with sign up.
- **District Bird Pin:** Lion Tom McCarthy made a motion to continue this motion as tabled until the next meeting, seconded by PID Debra Wasserman. MC.

<u>GLT Orientation</u>: PDG Joan Blank and Lion Christy Trutnau – "The Magic of Service" will be a new orientation session at DG Brian's Mid-Winter Convention. It will be offered at 8:00 AM on Saturday morning, February 15th. Lion Christy Trutnau and PDG Joan will be presenting an event offered to newer Lions members and their sponsors, along with any Lion who may want to know more about the workings of Lions. Lion Christy and PDG Joan have been working diligently on this presentation, trying to figure out how we want to inspire Lions about the 5M2 District programs and the Parade of Green.

They will introduce the District Governor Team and have PID Debra Wasserman speak on behalf of LCIF, Lion Tom McCarthy will speak on behalf of MN Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation and Lion Christy will speak on behalf of the MN Lions Vision Foundation. They will briefly highlight all the projects that are part of the Parade of Green.

They have 50 Lions registered, which they are excited about as that was the cutoff for registration. They have 16 different clubs represented. There are 14 Lions registered who have been Lions for less than 3 years, with 3 of those being new members in the last year. There are 2 Lions who have been Lions for 3 or more years. They have 25 Lions who have been a member for 10 plus years. They have one Lion who has been a member for 52 years. Lion Christy and PDG Joan hope they won't be boring these Lions!

PDG Joan did present an orientation presentation to the Arlington Lions on Thursday, November 7th.

GMT: PDG Marvin Grimm – He has been busy trying to find a town for a new Lions club. The task has not been easy. If there is not a contact person (someone interested in Lions Clubs) in the town, it is very difficult to get people out and to commit. We have attempted 3 towns to date with no results.

Lion clubs need to work on retention of the members they have. It is easier to keep the members you have than to get new Lions. We need to continue to "Just Ask" to gain new members. The district is down in total members. The Lions clubs have done well this year adding 72 members, but have lost 111 members. The district is minus 39 members at this time. This is as of January 2020.

We still have 14 clubs under 20 members. So, we still have work to do.

<u>GST</u>: Lion Dar Mondor –Date to remember for our great opportunity to help feed many, many people – **Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) date is April 20, 2020**. Information to register for any of the three sessions either individually or as a club has been listed in the current newsletter and will also be listed in the March newsletter. There are currently 67 members for the 6:00 – 7:30 p.m slot and there is room for 100. There are other times listed that also have room for more to sign up. She will have a display at mid-winter convention in February, however if any of your clubs need help registering, please have them contact her.

For quite a few months she has been working with Benita Craig who is a school nurse at Halton Elementary School in Town Creek, AL on a diabetes kit idea for public and parochial schools. Lion Dar organized all the information she needed, the pricing per each kit and where she could get the items, then she met with the school nurse, school superintendent and principal. All were very interested and excited about placing these kits in the schools and all the buses. Her board approved the cost per kit of \$7.50 per kit to be placed in the classrooms and buses at the start of this year's school year and my club will monitor any items that might expire annually. She would like to share this information with all our clubs in our district as an idea that might work in their area schools.

She shared another idea that is being used in our schools. It is ice pack covers. She will share an example of these and instructions on how they are made. This idea was discovered on a visit to the Green Isle Club.

Lion Dar has been invited to attend a computer and phone "My Meeting" discussion with other districts, which she thinks will continue – She has only been on one so far, but is hoping to get some ideas that are working in other districts to bring to our district.

If you are having problems recording your activities on MyLion there is a U-tube program that shows you step by step instructions and she believes there is a power point program available, however she is here to help, just contact her.

<u>Historian</u>: PDG Nancy Mathwig – The Hall of Fame board has been updated and is again on display this weekend. At this time, no additional updates have been made to the Historian page on the District 5M2 website.

<u>Journey for Service</u>: PDG Mike Vos – It is nearing that time of year again to tour the countryside of 5M2 for our annual Journey for Service, April 1-3, 2020. This year DG Brian and PDG Mike will be traveling over 700 miles making some 63 stops meeting with Lions, Lioness, and Leo clubs collecting money for various service projects in our District.

He will be contacting all the club presidents to verify meeting locations, time and a contact person. He is looking forward to another successful Journey For Service with a goal of 100% participation.

LCIF: PID Debra Wasserman – Below are DG Brian's LCIF goals and her plan to assist in accomplishing them:

 - "Change for Change" jug will be available ongoing during the Convention.
 - I will seek invitations to present a program about LCIF at club meetings.
- 2. Promote members giving \$2 each week to Campaign 100: LCIF Empowering Service.
 - Personal contact will be made with clubs after the Midwinter Convention if they did not donate during the Parade of Green.
 - The July District newsletter contained an article on this concept.
 - Club presentations will include the concept.
- 3. District 5M2 will raise \$30,000.00 during fiscal year 2019-2020 to support Campaign 100: LCIF Empowering Service.

<u>MD5M Lions KidSight Foundation</u>: PDG Harry Klenke and Lion Pam Koehnen: Kidsight in District 5M2 is going quite well. We need to set up a new training session for the Spring.
