	Budget- DG Christy						
	$\square$ The preliminary budget was discussed. PCC Thies asked a question about contracted services.						
	Lion Sue indicated that amount represents the annual audit. For 2023-2024 will be a full audit and the final budget amount will be slightly higher. Motion by PCC Thies, second by Lion Breimhorst to approve the preliminary budget. Motion carried.						

- Dues Increase (starting 2024-2025) DG Christy discussed the dues increases by LCI and the Multiple District of \$7.50 increase over the next three years. Lion Sue added that our preliminary budget is not a balanced budget, it is \$11,000 in the negative. We cannot continue to operate this way. There will also likely be a dues increase to help fund the International Convention in 2029.
- П IPDG Kathleen moved to increase District dues by \$7 (total to \$15.60). The additional would go to Admin Fund. Second by Lion Ebenezer Howe. Discussion that this would almost double the dues. Would this be too much to pass on to clubs in one year. We have enough to last four years. However, if all cabinet positions spent their allocated amount, we would spend more than is in our checking. This does need to be voted on by the membership at the Mid-Winter before it passes.

PCC Thies moved to lay the motion on the table. Second by PDG Steve Wasserman.
<b>Lions Lights on for Life</b> - DG Christy – This is not a project that is currently being funded. There is \$1455.48. Can this be moved to the general fund. It was money from PDG Rick Wegner's year – tail twisting and club visit money. PDG Rick will be contacted to learn more of his wishes.
Lions Quest- DG Christy – There is currently over \$40,000 in the fund. The program is currently not being utilized. PCC Thies indicated that since the money was given at the Parade of Green for that program, it cannot be moved to other programs. The money has largely gone untouched since PCC Brian Thies's year. The COVID years did not help in getting the program into schools. It can be organized outside of the schools, other community youth programs can be utilized. It is used much more extensively in Canada. Lion Rose said there is a need in schools. QUEST cover social emotional learning (SEL). PID Debra suggested contacting LCI legal regarding dispersing previously designated funds – as a point of information. DG Christy will contact.

<b>Mission 1.5</b> - PDG Joan Blank drive to reach 1.5 million members worldwide. Mission of IP Dr. Hill. PDG Joan has a list of resources. More information will be shared at fall zone meetings.





PDG Kathleen – Goal: to work with Wanda on 100% contributions to parade of green – to attend club visits in 50% of the clubs in her half of the district.


#### MN Lions KidSight Foundation:
