#### "Sprinkle Service with Kindness"

Where has the summer gone? The State Fair has begun, the stores are full of back-to-school supplies, grandson is off to college, walnuts and acorns are falling, and the last summer holiday-Labor Day is next week. Lions Clubs are having their summer picnics and gearing up for the start of another year of service. Has your club

set up goals for the year; decided on what service projects you will work on (maybe try a new one too), discussed a monetary contribution to LCIF, booked a speaker from one of the foundations, installed your clubs new officers and reported them in the Portal, and lastly booked a club visit with the DG team?

The cabinet met on July 10 and adopted new guidelines for the Service of Remembrance, reviewed the new criteria for the Club Excellence Award, approved language change to the Leo budget so it aligns with the policy manual, PCC Brian reviewed liability coverage through LCI and additional information will be coming on what is and what is not covered under their policy. Camp Sweet Life Director Rene'Maes and President Nick Kilgren asked permission to submit a grant application to LCIF for \$250,000 for additional camp experiences in 2026 and 2027, this motion was approved. Reports from Zone Chairs and Cabinet Members rounded out the evening.

Zone Chairs are working on setting up the Fall Meetings for October. These meeting are for ALL Lions, not just Presidents and Secretaries. We will be discussing the Club Excellence criteria, Service of Remembrance Guidelines, Service Focus Weeks, Special Olympics and Club Activities.

5M-2 has added 28 new members since 7-1 and dropped 27 so we are at a +1. Keep up the great work and keep asking JUST ONE! Hats off to Victoria for adding 10 new members and to the 13 other clubs who have added a total of 18!!! LCI set the growth goal for 5M-2 at 183 new club members, and I am confident we will surpass that number. Thank you to all who sponsored new members also.

On August 27, the LeSueur County Camp Sweet Life (LCCSL) was officially chartered, new officers were installed, and 17 charter members were inducted. This is the first virtual club in our district and



will focus on children with Type 1 diabetes along with support for Camp Sweet Life. If anyone would like further information, they can contact Lion Rene' Maes at 507-995-6910.

I have several club visits scheduled in September and will be attending the USA/Canada Forum in Atlantic City on September 18-21 along with 1VDG Chuck and several other 5M-2 Lions. Watch for pictures on Facebook!

But we must not get complacent. The fall months are going to be just as busy. Zone meetings will begin in September and go into October. About two weeks ago Linda and I were out in Michigan to visit the Leader Dog Facility. Something that Leader Dog does every year for all the 1st Vice District Governors in the US and Canada. We spent a day with their staff and learned about how a puppy's life is, from the time they are born to the time they retire from being a leader dog. Next, they taught us how to approach a blind person without scaring them. They showed us how to best lead a blind person without having them stumble or run into any objects. While leading, talking to the person about what is around them all the time. They had us blindfolded and had someone lead you around. Thankfully Linda did a fantastic job of not letting me run into anything. They served us a great meal at noon of chili, donuts and salad. I didn't think that would be a great combo, but to my surprise it was a great meal. Afterward they showed us around the campus. Then they had us blindfolded again and they had us walk beside a trained Leader Dog. I think I was beyond blown away. What an experience. They had us blindfolded once again so we could experience what it is like to walk with a white cane. And again, it was quite an experience. They finished the day up at the campus with the financial funding. It costs \$22,000,000 a year to run this facility and the program. Not one person needing a Guide Dog ever gets charged for anything. It is funded only by donations with no Federal or State funds. It is funded by Lions from around the world and by philanthropy funding. That evening we all ate a great meal while being blindfolded. I know this experience has changed my idea of how much harder it is for a blind person to navigate the world than

a seeing person. Even with a Leader Dog. Truly this was a great experience.

Remember to get in touch with your Zone Chairman and find out when your Zone will be having a meeting. If any club or individual can see it in your financial budgets to please donate what you can to Leader Dogs. Please Donate.

This month I am going to leave you with a quote from Helen Keller. Many of you have heard it many times. But as I was going though Leader Dog this quote came to my mind. The experience truly gave me vision about blindness I didn't know about before attending.

"The only thing worse than being blind is having sight but no vision." Helen Keller

#### 2025-2026 LCI Club Excellence Award Criteria

The Club Excellence Award recognizes clubs that demonstrate outstanding service, strong leadership, membership growth and community impact. Below are the minimum requirements that must be met to receive this award. Plan now, start early and lead with service. That is how we build a future where Lions truly shine.

#### 2025-2026 LCI Club Excellence Award Criteria

The Club Excellence Award acknowledges the dedication and legacy of service within individual clubs.

Applications will not be necessary for the 2025-2026 award cycle. Awards will be distributed by Lions International to clubs that meet the following criteria and eligibility requirements.

#### Membership

- Induct a minimum of two or 20% new members, whichever is greater (not including transfer, reinstated or charter members). Eligibility is determined based on the club's membership count on June 30th of the previous Lion year.
- Or sponsor a new Lions club.

#### Service

 Report a minimum of four (4) service activities to Lions International. Three (3) of these activities must show participation in each of the three (3) International Weeks of Service.

#### Leadership

- Report newly elected club officers in Lion Portal by May 15 of the current Lion year.
- A minimum of 10% of the club's members complete any three courses in the Lions Learning Center.
- The club president for the current Lion year must not have served more than two consecutive terms.
- A minimum of two or more club officers (president, vice president, secretary or treasurer, of which, one must be the club president) complete Club Officer Training (online with the Lions Learning Center or in-person as reported by a GLT coordinator in Learn) between July 1-December 31 of the current Lion year.

#### **Donations**

<u>Contribute to LCIF</u> a minimum of the club's membership total on June 30th of the previous Lion year, multiplied by US\$20.

### **GLT Corner**

#### What does it mean to be a District Governor (DG)?

This is a question I have been asked a number of times. While it can be challenging, it is very rewarding leadership role within Lions Club International (LCI). Along with a lot of the fun, you have the opportunity to meet great people. LCI has many learning opportunities available on www.lionsclubs.org and there is a training program. What are some of the duties of the DG:

- 1. **Representation & Leadership**: As the official representative of LCI in your district, you lead clubs, inspire members, and engage the public.
- 2. **Communication & Connection**: You serve as the main communication link between clubs and the larger LCI organization, fostering effective communication and collaboration.
- 3. **Goal Setting & Vision**: You along with the DG Team (1st and 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice District Governors) play a crucial role in setting the district's vision and goals, ensuring clubs are aligned with LCI's mission.
- 4. **Mentorship & Development**: You mentor club leaders, helping them develop their leadership skills and manage their activities effectively.
- 5. **Training & Education**: You along with the GLT are responsible for organizing training programs and events to equip club leaders with the knowledge and skills they need.
- 6. **Planning & Organization**: You are involved in planning and executing district-level events, including the District Convention.
- 7. **Financial Oversight**: You have a responsibility for managing district finances and ensuring responsible use of funds.
- 8. **Community Engagement**: You actively engage with the community, promoting Lion's service projects and public image.
- 9. **Team Building**: You assemble and lead a team of volunteers, including Vice District Governors and committee chairs, to support your efforts.
- 10. **Networking & Collaboration**: You build and maintain relationships with club members, multiple and district leaders, and LCI representatives, fostering a strong network of support.

If you are interested in being a leader in 5M-2, a great first step is to attend the Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI). As luck would have it, it is being held in our district in Mankato in September. See the flyer in this newsletter for more information. #### District 5M-2 Service of Remembrance Guidelines

#### **Purpose**

The Service of Remembrance at the 5M-2 Mid Winter Convention honors the lives and service of Lions members who have passed away. This ceremony reflects our commitment to Service, Integrity, and Recognition of those who dedicated themselves to improving their communities and embodying the values of Lionism.

#### **Eligibility for Inclusion**

To maintain the integrity and clarity of the Service of Remembrance, the following criteria apply:

- 1. Current Membership Requirement
  - Only Lions who were members in good standing at the time of their passing will be honored during the Service of Remembrance.
  - O A member in good standing is defined as:
    - Listed on the official Lions Clubs International (LCI) roster at the time of death.
    - Not under suspension or having voluntarily resigned prior to their passing.

#### 2. Scope of Recognition

- O The service will include all qualifying Lions from clubs within the District who have passed away between the conclusion of the previous Mid Winter Convention and an adequate time before the current Mid Winter Convention to ensure proper handling and notification.
- O The District Governor or designated Cabinet members (Service Activities Chair) are responsible for verifying membership status and submitting names for inclusion.

#### 3. Former Members

- O While we deeply respect the service of former Lions, only those actively holding membership at the time of their passing will be formally recognized during this ceremony.
- O Clubs wishing to honor former members for their contributions may do so at the club level or during other appropriate local memorials.

#### **Rationale**

These guidelines ensure:

- Consistency with Lions Clubs International's policies regarding member recognition.
- The sustainability and meaningfulness of the Service by maintaining clear parameters.
- A respectful space for current members while encouraging clubs to celebrate the legacy of former members through other appropriate avenues.

#### **Additional Notes**

- Questions or special circumstances may be submitted to the District Governor and/or District Cabinet for consideration prior to the deadline for recognition.
- This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure it continues to reflect the values and needs of our Lions family.


#### 2025 Theme: "Together As One "
