Call to Order: DG Joan Blank called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance: Led by 2nd VDG Marv Grimm

Invocation: Led by 2nd VDG Marv Grimm

Welcome: DG Joan Blank welcomed everyone to the cabinet meeting

Roll Call: Taken by Lion Cindy Walters showing 43 in attendance and 8 absent.

Introduction of Guests: Lions Kathy Van Hove and Lion Don Van Hove - Kiester Lions; Lion Bill

Vandersluis - Mankato Lions, Lion Chris Lund - Hamburg Lions

<u>Adoption of the Agenda</u>: Added new business item – confusion over reimbursements. Lion Janet Knakmuhs moved to adopt the agenda, seconded by Lion Arlene Richter. MC.

<u>Secretary's Report</u>: Everyone was e-mailed a copy of the minutes. Motion to approve was made by Lion PID Maynard Rucks; 2nd by Lion Cathleen Williams. MC.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Lion Dale Oldenburg presented his report in succinct fashion as usual. Total revenue so far is \$50,279.82 and expenses at this point are \$37,585.98. Balance as of 10/25/2013 is \$12,693.84. There is \$82,844.8 in the special funds account and \$6,047.08 in the Core 4 Grant. Three clubs are unpaid dues PID Maynard Rucks made a motion to approve, Lion Lori Klein seconded. MC. The audit has been completed without finding any discrepancies and taxes have been submitted. PID Maynard Rucks made a motion to accept the audit; Lion Jack Webster seconded. MC.

<u>Communications</u>: DG Joan Blank thanked Lions Mary and Duane Pipping for assisting with the meals. Lion Wanda and Lion Dennis Hewitt made some bars. DG Joan made a special presentation to Lion Shirley Hespenheide a puppy has been named in her honor from Leader Dog...the puppy has been named Hespy. DG Joan read a letter from the man who will be training the dog. DG Joan also recognized that service dog Darwin has been placed and the Leos have raised enough money to name a dog as well.

Old Business:

- **New Speaker System** Has been purchased and is being used tonight. The bill for the system was \$387. Thank you to 5M2 for allowing us to have a nice new sound system.
- Leo Book Drive Leo Hillary Wickenhauser gave a report about their book drive. On October 8 20,000 books were collected from Lions clubs. \$874 was collected along with the \$500 from the cabinet toward their library in Africa.
- Approval of payment for Quest Training PDG Eunice Rucks requested payment for the Quest training that happened in August. The bill is \$4500. PDG Marlys Meskan made a motion to pay this bill, Lion Cathleen Williams seconded. MC.
- Bid for 2016 MD5M Convention PID Maynard Rucks reported that we are not able to host the conference because the dates are not open for the conference center in Mankato. Mystic Lake will not work either. Lion Bob Harms gave Maynard a couple of additional dates to check and he will do so.
- Lap Top Computer for Mid-Winter Lion Steve Wasserman took the old, old, old computer from the district, cleaned it up and installed a spreadsheet to use for registrations for mid-winter. It is now with the Lion in charge of registration to use for mid-winter registration.

New Business:

• Camp Sweet Life – Lion Cathy Van Hove, Kiester Lions gave a presentation on Camp Sweet Life. It is the only camp in the State of Minnesota for kids with Type 1 Diabetes. Their website is: www.campsweetlife.org. Her email is: crvanhove@gmail.com and she would love to come present to your club. The Camp is held in August over 4 days and 3 nights. Their mission is: Enhancing the life of

young people and their families by providing fun opportunities for learning, connecting, and sharing. They also offer monthly family activities. It is great support for the families and the students. The cost for the camp is \$200 for those that stay over night and \$100 for day campers. The capacity for the camp would be 100. This year there were 40 campers and 52 staff.

- Mankato Lions/Recycling Glasses Lion Bill Vandersluis, Mankato Lions Last year we made a motion to send our eyeglasses to the MN Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center in Sauk Rapids. That decision impacted the Mankato clubs because they used those eyeglasses as a fund raising project as well as a service project. They have been processing eyeglasses for over 25 years. It began with VOSH as their partner. The last VOSH trip that the Mankato Lions were involved with was in the 90's. They have the equipment to test glasses, and they clean and sort the glasses. They continue to provide eyeglasses for various trips to 3rd world countries. They have harvested the precious metals out of the eyeglasses as well. Averaging over \$2000 in sight requests and the salvation army provides them a room. He stated that this information may not have been available to this cabinet prior to making the decision to change where the glasses were sent. Perhaps the decision may not have been made. He would really like to have the Mankato Clubs continue with their practice of collecting the glasses from the mid-winter.
 - PDG Mary Spille asked if the recycling center was Multiple wide and PDG Mary Ferleman said yes it was. PDG Mary Spille made a motion to hold to our August decision; Lion Nancy Mathwig seconded. MC.
- Golf Trophy Lion Chris Lund, Hamburg Lions Proposed to establish a Lions Cup to be awarded at
 Mid-Winter Convention to the Lions Club with the highest point total from participation in Lion sponsored
 golf tourneys. The purpose would be to increase interaction between Lion Clubs in our District while
 increasing the number of participants at Lion sponsored golf tourneys. Following are the proposed rules:
 - 1. All team members must be current Lions to qualify
 - 2. Each qualifying team that enters into a Lion Sponsored Golf tourney will receive 10 points toward the Lions Cup.
 - 3. 125 addition points will be awarded to participating Lion teams based on performance.
 - 35 points for top team
 - 30 points for second best team
 - 25 points for third best team
 - 20 points for fourth best team
 - 15 points for fifth best team
 - 4. If less than five qualifying teams participate then those points will not be awarded; i.e. if only 3 qualifying teams participate only 90 points will be awarded.
 - 5. Lion Clubs can enter more than one qualifying team in Lion Sponsored Golf tourney.
 - 6. All points awarded qualifying teams go toward the club total and not the individual team.
 - 7. The Jungle Day tourney all points will be doubled.

A question was asked regarding who would pay for the trophy and would it be a traveling or purchased yearly. His vision is for the trophy to not be extravagant and to move yearly. The winning club to be announced at the mid-winter convention. DG Joan asked what he would like to see happen from here and he stated that if approved, he needs help knowing which clubs have tournaments and getting the information to them and the winning information back to him for the tally.

- Lion Steve Wasserman made a motion to go ahead with the golf tournament; seconded by Lion Jim Spille. MC.
- **5M2 Constitution Update** Lion Steve Wasserman gave a presentation on recommended changes to match LCI's constitution, Multiple District, etc. He compared our constitution to those and found many things that he thinks should be changed. He requested the support of the Cabinet to send the proposed changes to the clubs to be voted on at the mid-winter convention. PID Maynard suggested sending the file to the PDG's as they have a meeting coming up and they can look it over and see if there is anything that they would like to see changed. Lion Steve would like to get these changes voted on this year. Lion Laura Maki made a motion that Lion Steve send the file to the PDG and let them look it over at their

meeting December 1 and they can make a recommendation; Lion Diana Kroells seconded. PDG Mary Spille asked if the PDG's would make the decision. The consensus of the cabinet was yes the PDG's would make the recommendation and then Lion Steve would send the document to the clubs in time for them to look at it and be able to vote at the mid-winter. MC.

- Special Olympics Chair Position Lion Laura Maki presented about the Special Olympics. Lions International has strengthened its ties with Special Olympics. She is asking 5M2 to consider adding a project chair to represent Special Olympics. Some other districts in the multiple have already done so. She stated that Lion Joe Maki has been involved in Special Olympics and just finished training as an ambassador. She feels that it would be a great use of his training to have him fill a position such as this. In assigning a project chair to Special Olympics she also requests adding this project to parade of green. PID Debra said that this is actually two issues; adding a position to the cabinet and adding to parade of green. Lively discussion followed. DG Joan tabled the discussion until the Mid-Winter Cabinet meeting.
- Environmental Chair Position, Lions 100th Anniversary Chair Position DG Joan Blank brought
 these forward from the Council of Governors meeting. She tabled the discussion until mid-winter but the
 information about them is in the packet at each member's seat. Please read the information and come
 prepared to discuss at the next cabinet meeting.
- Camp Confidence/Parade of Green Lion Jerry Wohlers sent a request to have Camp Confidence put on Parade of Green. PID Maynard Rucks made a motion to not add this project to the parade of green; seconded by PDG Mary Ferleman. MC.
- Travel Reimbursement for CEP Facilitators PID Debra Wasserman exclaimed that she is so excited about this cabinet meeting since we are actually making decisions (and she said she was not just sucking up). She then talked about the Club Excellence Process. When a club signs up to go through this process they are assigned a facilitator or two. Currently there are 10 facilitators trained. The goal this year is to have two clubs involved in the CEP/zone. Our facilitators are really incurring some travel expenses that hadn't been considered last year. She then requested that there be an amount of money moved out of somewhere in the budget and put into GLT so that the expenses can be covered: mileage at .41/mile and assist in other expenses as occurring to provide CEP to the district. The current GLT budget is for officer training so additional dollars PID Maynard made a motion to set aside funds up to \$2,000 for the CEP funds specifically; PDG Tom Ferleman seconded. PDG Mary Spille asked if the clubs should cover some of the costs. PID Maynard said that they really want clubs to sign up and don't want them to have to incur expenses. MC.
- Midwinter is coming Thinking about running for a second vice district governor? Lion Steve Wasserman declared his intention to run for second Vice District Governor.
- Waconia Lions sponsored the Wounded Warriors softball team in July. Channel 4 was there taping for "Life to the Max" with Mike Max. It will be broadcast on Saturday November 2nd at 11:05 pm.

<u>DG Comments</u>: DG Joan thanked everyone for the meeting. She really appreciates everyone's work. She introduced Lion Ron Theusch and welcomed him to the cabinet. He didn't make the last meeting. THANKS TO EVERYONE.

Next Meeting is February 7th at 2 p.m.

Motion to adjourn made Lion Jim Spille and seconded by Lion Dennis Hewitt. MC. Meeting adjourned at 7 p.m.

Region/Zone Reports:

Once meeting visit date has been set she has asked the President or Secretary to e-mail me confirmation of the meeting date.
 - All Club Presidents & Secretaries have received an introduction e-mail along with a request to schedule her Zone Chair visit for 2013-2014 Club Visits. She had the honor of attending the Belle Plaine Lions meeting on October 8th and participating in the presentation of awards to club members and community members for their outstanding community service. Congratulations to all award recipients!
 - She also received an invitation to attend the N.E.W. Lions meeting on October 24th. It was a pleasure meeting Lions members & hearing about all of the interesting fundraising activities going on in our local clubs.
 - She has scheduled her Club Visit with the Shakopee Lions for January 22nd, 2014 and will schedule remaining club visits. Her goal is to have them all completed by the Mid-Winter Convention.
 - The Fall Zone Meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 30th, 2013. Social Hour at 6:15 p.m. & Dinner at 7:00 p.m. She is looking forward to seeing everyone at the meeting.  - To her knowledge, two of the zone 5 clubs participated in the Cologne Leo Book Drive. Arlington Lions collected 207 books and Henderson collected "a back of the van full" of books.
 - Fall Zone 5 meeting is Tues, October 29th hosted by the Green Isle Lions. The program for the Zone meeting will consist of 2 young Arlington students, Parker and Paige Pflanz, who have attended Camp Needlepoint; Leo Hilary Wickenhauser, Cologne Leos, on their summer reading program and update on the Book Drive; Leader Dogs for the Blind puppy raiser, Elaine Tohal from LeSueur and PDG Orville Trettin on the Lions eye glass recycling he uses for Vision Honduras.

Committee Reports:

<u>Can Do Canines</u>: Lion Deb Koehnen reported that she attended the Lions Chairperson Training on Saturday, Sept. 21. The day was packed with an overview, goals, reports, brainstorming, and 3 wonderful testimonials from clients and their service dogs. 5M2 was recognized as the leader in the Multiple with 96% of our clubs contributing to Can-Do-Canines in 2012-2013. Also mentioned - the Cologne Leos raised enough money to name a puppy. We will advise when the name is announced.

In 2014 Can-Do-Canines will be celebrating 25 years of providing assistance dogs. Look for an open house sometime in the summer. There have been 37 teams placed in 5M2 during that time. They will be looking for ways to increase contributions in 2014 to help close out their capital campaign and recognize 25 years. Future goals include obtaining reliable vehicles for transporting clients/dogs, improving the breeding program, and increasing training staff.

Another aggressive goal is to increase the number of teams graduating by 10 per year. At that rate they will double the number of teams in 4 years. Currently there are 181 potential clients on a waiting list. 5M2 chairs continue to work on setting up club visits.

Constitution & By-Laws: Lion Steve Wasserman reported that he has completed a review of the 5M2

Constitution, comparing it with the LCI Standard District Constitution and the LCI and MD5M Constitutions. After having done so, he concluded that it would be a good idea to revise our constitution to be more consistent with the LCI Standard District Constitution, while retaining any provisions unique to District 5M2. Doing so would make it much easier for future Constitution & By-Laws chairs to do the comparisons and be assured that the 5M2 Constitution was not in conflict with the LCI Constitution.

He did find some provisions of the 5M2 Constitution where substantive changes may be desirable. They include:

- 1. Officers of the District: Exclude the Club Presidents and Secretaries in the list of officers, and adding that the officers must be members in good standing of clubs in good standing in the district.
- 2. District Governor's Cabinet: Make the Committee Chairs voting members of the Cabinet as is our practice.
- 3. District Governor's Honorary Committee: Indicate that the Immediate Past District Governor shall (as opposed to may) be the chair.

He prepared a marked-up copy of the 5M2 Constitution showing the insertions and deletions necessary to bring our constitution substantially in line with the LCI Standard Constitution, retaining the existing language where we are unique, and making the proposed substantive changes as delineated above. He attached that document to this report.

<u>Conventions/USA/Canada Forum</u>: IPDG Ron Dahlke reported A very successful USA-Canada Lions Leadership Forum was held at Overland Park, Kansas, September 19-21, with a large contingency in attendance from MD 5M and from District 5M2. Plans are already being made for the 2014 Forum to be held September 11-13, at San Juan, Puerto Rico.

The 2014 Mid-Winter Convention Committee, consisting of Club members from Zone 9, is busy with plans for an educational and entertaining event February 7, 8, and 9, 2014 at the City Center Hotel, Downtown Mankato. More details will be made available in upcoming issues of "The Flame", and also on the District 5M-2 WebSite.

The MD5M Multiple Convention will be held April 25-27, 2014 at Jackpot Junction Convention Center, Morton, MN. This event is hosted by the Milroy Lions Club and the Lions Members of District 5M3. Convention registration and hotel registration information is available on the Multiple 5M WebSite. Lions Clubs International is making plans for an exciting 97th Lions Clubs Annual International Convention from July 4–8, 2014 in the city of Toronto, Ontario, Canada. More information will be made available for this convention opportunity in issues of "The Lion" magazine and on the LCI WebSite.

<u>District Activities</u>: PDG Eunice Rucks reported that she has received only two memorial info's for the Memorial Ceremony. DG Joan has sent her a report of deceased members from January 2013 and there are others. She will be contacting those Club Presidents and asking them to forward the information. She continues to encourage clubs to report their deceased members.

She has Bird Pins and 2013-2014 Snowman pins available for sale. They are again priced at \$2.50. She attended the three Region Meetings and sold several there.

GLT: PID Debra Wasserman reported on her goals.

- 1. **2 clubs in each zone will complete the Club Excellence Process. (18 clubs in 9 Zones.)** In August 1 Zone Chair held a meeting with club Presidents and others, including both the GLT and GMT Coordinators, to present CEP. All clubs in the zone received follow up information including 2 personal presentations by the GLT Coordinator. As of this date 1 club in this Zone is committed to beginning the CEP in the 2nd quarter. Several clubs may follow later in the year. The District GMT Coordinator presented on CEP at each of 3 Region meetings in September. Several clubs expressed interest in further information. The GLT/GMTs met on October 2 to plan for follow up presentations to individual clubs and at Fall Zone meetings.
- 2. Offer a seminar at the Mid-Winter Convention on leadership opportunities within our district. DG Joan and PID Debra have been in conversation.
- 3. Develop a plan with Region/Zone Chairs to meet IP Barry Palmer's goals towards Zone Chair Awards.

Zone and Region Chairs have been made aware of the award through meetings, personal contacts and via email. A significant number of the Zone Chairs are new to their job and the DG and GLT chair are working to not overwhelm them. At least 1 Zone Chair did submit the 1st quarter application for the Presidential zone Person Award. We hope others will be able to submit application forms in the 2nd quarter.

- 4. Encourage Zone chairs to have CEP speakers at their fall Zone meetings.
 - Most if not all Zone Chairs have made arrangements for speakers. At least 2 clubs in Zones who have already had their fall meeting have requested a CEP presentation at a club meeting. The GMT and GLT Coordinators are working on this.
- 5. Have quarterly joint GLT/GMT meetings, including the DG Team.

The 1st quarter GLT/GMT meeting was held on September 4 and the 2nd quarter meeting on October 2. Both meetings were held at the City Grill in St. Peter.

<u>GMT</u>: PID Maynard Rucks reported that GMT has been working to get clubs interested in having a CEP presentation for their club. Pitches for the CEP were given at the three Region Meetings and at the zone meetings that have been held so far. Those pitches have had some results both have someone come to club meetings, or to have a CEP program started in the future.

There has not been any Extension work done yet at this time.

<u>Historian</u>: Lion Ken Farrell reported that he is happy to report that things are going pretty good, with just a few loose ends to tie up.

He has had only a few queries from clubs this summer. Hopefully with the 5M-2 History information on the Web site, lions/clubs can access the information they are looking for. But please contact him if you need some help.

Part of his dream has been fulfilled, getting most of the 5M-2 History records updated and posted on our Web site. It has been a pleasure working with Lion Laura to accomplish this task. She has been working very hard at getting the formatting done and he thanked her for that.

<u>Journey for Service</u>: Lion Jack Webster will again be spearheading the Journey for Service, this is his 23rd or 24th year! The Journey for Service will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Wednesday, April 9 with breakfast with the Faribault Lions – Lions Debra and Steve Wasserman hosting. The trip will continue the next two days --- April 10 and 11. The final stop will be at the Lions Park in Northfield, scheduled for about 11:30.

He is once again asking for support of the Cabinet members to make this another successful Journey. This will be his 'Farewell' Journey for Service as he has decided to relinquish the position to a younger Lion so that someone else can share the great experience of visiting all of our great clubs in 5M-2. He is looking forward to this final 'jaunt' with Lions Joan and Kevin.

He attended the Zone 4 meeting Oct, 15th, in Courtland and presented our program and the Mankato Lions Club meeting Oct. 17th, they are seriously thinking of getting the program started in a surrounding school.
