
with so many Lions from around the country. In this article I am going to share some of the information we took away from the seminars we attended.

My fellow 1VDG of MD5M, visited the Leader Dog campus in Rochester Hill, Michigan on August 24. There were sixty 1VDG from around the US in our group who learned the history of Leader Dog; learned how to be a human guide, toured the residence where clients live from one to three weeks depending on the program

they are in. We ate the infamous chili and donuts for our lunch, toured the canine center which was immaculately clean. Unfortunately, there were only a few dogs in house, several adorable puppies and a new black cat! We all participated in the Leader Dog experience with a guide dog and the use of white canes. The facility has five different programs available to teens and adults and serves approximately 300 clients each year, all free to the client thanks to Lions in the US and Canada who support Leader Dog. Before leaving the facility, we were given free time to network, shop and do a brick search. Surrounding the perimeter of the building, are engraved 4X8 bricks purchased by patrons to help support the mission of Leader Dog. I did find 3 bricks that were from Faribault members, including my dad's! Bonus. Upon returning to the hotel, we "dined in the dark". Everyone was blind folded for the meal, and we had lots of laughs wondering what we were eating and where everything was on the table. (Try to find the salt shaker????) I lost my knife about a minute into the meal-thank goodness the meat was tender! Another Lion ate his neighbor's bun along with his own. The waiter complimented all of us as we were the first group that hadn't spilled any water!

We had wonderful inspirational speakers at our luncheons and dinners, along with meeting IP Fabricio Oliveira from Brazil and 1VP AP Sing from India. We came home tired but energized with new ideas, solutions, and looking forward to the next forum in Atlantic City in September 2025.

the Portal yet. Please contact me with your club officers and I can put them in for you. Or if you are having problems with the Portal. Please contact me.



Can Do Canines invites you to attend an open house on Saturday, November 11, from 12-2 p.m., at its Can Do Canines campus (9440 Science Center Drive, New Hope, Minnesota). Potential volunteers, clients, or anyone who might be interested in supporting the organization are invited to attend to learn how an assistance dog changes the life of a person with a disability.

Through a self-guided tour, attendees will be able to watch a trainer working with an assistance dog, hear from a volunteer dog host, talk with staff members from the volunteer



department, pose questions to client services coordinators about the application process, and meet graduate teams from each of the five types of areas Can Do Canines trains dogs: hearing, mobility, seizure, diabetes, and childhood autism. The assistance dog demonstrations will be held at 12:15, 1:55, and 1:35, and the dog host will speak at 12:15, 12:35, and 1:15.

We have sent out reminders to Club Presidents and Secretaries in late Spring, sign up also has information in the 5M-2 newsletter, and have put sign up Genius info with those notifications. Kidsight offers FREE admission tickets to the Fair and still we continue to get a low response of volunteers from our District. If it was not for other District's volunteering, we would struggle to complete this FREE project that promotes Lionism. This is a great project to observe Helen Kellers request to be "Knights of the Blind". We are open to suggestions on how to engage more members from our District. This year we screened a total of 3420 Youth during the course of the fair. We referred 340 children which allows parents time to get vision screening done by a professional prior or in early days of the new school year to assist with the success of Minnesota students in education.

5M-2 District has 4 cameras for use for vision Screenings. We are getting more Schools accepting this Program. October continues to have many dates that all four of the districts' cameras are being used. It is great to get into the schools. When middle School students reach puberty, their vision is also changing. Also, with more Cell Phone

use and computers the eye strain has resulted increase vision problems. Kidsight it a SCREENING, and not a diagnostic tool. It refers children who the camera identifies as possible problem. Kidsight was initially started as 6 months to 6 years of age program and now has become 6 months to 18 years of age tool. So please continue to promote with Daycares and your local schools. We also have 2 clubs who have purchase Cameras, NEW Lions and Chaska Lions Clubs that I am aware of owning cameras. We can borrow those cameras if available if Kidsight has a need. As a Kidsight Director, we take the reports from screenings and report those number to a Kidsight USA board which continues to compute and analyze the findings. This board has a few Optometrists on board to analyze. Kidsight is now an INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM BY Lions Club International.




