

The October Cabinet meeting of the District 5M-2 Lions was called to order by DG Christy Trutnau. Second Vice District Governor Shermayne Cross led the Cabinet in the pledge of allegiance. First Vice District Governor Lisa Kaufmann provided the invocation. District Governor Christy Trutnau established protocol and welcomed the cabinet members to the meeting. Roll call was taken Lion Pam Koenen and showed 31 members & 2 guests present. Guests were introduced by DG Christy.

Adoption of Agenda – one addition under Old Business – the Winsted Club. Motion by Dave Williams, Second by Joan Blank to approve the agenda as modified. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report - Lion Pam Koenen, Secretary - Correction: results of a vote were not stated. The correction was made before the meeting began. Motion by PDG Anna Wickenhauser, second by Lion Wanda Breimhorst to approve as corrected. Motion carried.

Council of Governor's Report



Dues

Motion by Anna, Second Bleckeberg to take the motion regarding dues from the table. Motion Carried. Discussion – concern that doubling the dues will be a hard sell to the membership. There was discussion about a slow increase rather than increasing all at once. Dues have been flat for 21 years. DG Christy presented information on an alternative plan:

The last time 5M-2 raised its dues were in 2002, when they were set at \$8.60. Since then dues have remained flat, while inflation has gone up just over 70% in the last 21 years. If dues would have kept up with inflation, they would be set at \$14.68.

While the district has reviewed areas to try and tighten its budget and cut expenses where it can, the realty is the district has a budget shortfall. In addition to continuing to look for ways to stretch our dollar, increasing 5M-2 dues is an option that should be explored.

A smaller committee of 5M-2 Lions met to find a path forward and are recommending the following phased-in approach to dues increases: (DG Christy, 1VDG Lisa, 2VDG Shermayne, PCCs Brian and Glenn, PDG Mike Vos and Lion (Treasurer) Sue Vos)

Motion by Steve to table the motion to the next cabinet meeting, Lion Rose seconded. Motion to lay on the table was withdrawn.

Discussion on budget – some things are place holders – not all money allocated will be spent each year, will not have a balanced budget – we don't know how many members we will have each year. Motion to raise dues \$7 fails.

PCC Glenn made a motion to do a phased in increase of dues starting in 2024 - \$3, 2025 \$ 1, \$2026 - \$1 and a 5% inflation adjustment from 2027-2031. Second by PCC Brian. Question about what the International and Multiple dues increases are that will go into effect in 2024. International increase is \$3, \$2, \$2 (starting in 2024) and the multiple is \$.50. District treasurer sends dues statements to the clubs. It is up to the clubs to pay the increases or pass on to membership. COVID helped us to not have travel expenses for 2-3 years – the effects of not raising dues were not noticed. We need to cut expenses or raise more funds. Budgets are based on membership. This would be a recommendation from the cabinet to the membership at the Mid-Winter. Motion Carried. Clubs need notification 30 days prior to the convention. This proposal should be in the newsletter and by zone chairs at club visits. There should be hard copies so members can see actual numbers and rational.

- Winsted Club on September 29 the club charter was cancelled.
 - ➤ Members that were still involved have gone to other clubs 3 to Silver Lake. The rest were dropped in good standing so they could join other clubs, some to Howard Lake (District 7).



Wells Lions are scheduled to host the Spring Zone meeting.




■ Peace Poster:
