Even if you have been an officer (or club member) for many years and feel you have all the knowledge you need for your club position, this is the year (2019) that you need to attend training. As with everything around us that changes, sometimes on a daily or weekly basis, Lions Clubs International is also changing to keep us current with the always changing world around us!

This year's training will have a different format. The initial, general session will be a group session consisting of information important to ALL MEMBERS, not only the officers. Breakout sessions for secretaries, treasurers, presidents/vice presidents and zone chairs will be held after the general session. - The new MyLion Application, now available to all Lions, and used by clubs to enter their activities beginning July 1, 2019. You will need to set up an account for MyLion, which is also used to access MyLCI and order supplies. You will need your membership number as well as the email account listed currently in your MyLCI profile to set up your account.
- o Review of the sales tax requirements in MN for non-profit organizations such as Lions Clubs.
- Brief review of Go to Meeting and how our upcoming district officers may use the application in communicating with Zone Chairs, clubs, etc. Download the Go to Meeting application on your phone and/or laptop before the training session.
- Review of District Governor Elect Brian's goals for 2019-2020 and updated information he learned during DGE training in Chicago in February i.e. Service Tool Kits.

## Happy 8oth Birthday "Leader Dog for the Blind"!!

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, 1939 Leader Dog for the Blind was incorporated as a Michigan nonprofit. In May 1939 the foundation leased a small farm in Rochester Hills, Michigan to house their new venture. \$50 dollars a month rented a farmhouse for clients and staff, a barn to house the dogs and a garage. With support Detroit Lions, and the leadership of three Detroit Lion's the project grew and endured time.

On October 8, 1939, the first class of official Lions Leader Dogs Dog Foundation graduated. The cost to graduate a client /dog team was \$600.

On June 15, 1940 after a request from the Lion's International Board of Directors to remove "Lions" from the name since they had not sanctioned official support of the International organization. So, the new name "Leader Dog for the Blind" became Official.

In 1951 a new executive Director, Harold "Pock" Pockingham, worked with Lion's International to strengthen their global ties. S. A. Dodge the reining International President of Lions brought Leader Dog to the highest possible level of recognition. Melvin Jones, founder of Lionism, gave his personal endorsement in 1958.

In 1963, Lions International President of Lions Jorge Bird of Puerto Rico became involved with Leader Dog when a Spanish Solder, Francisco A. Garcia, whom had been blinded by a shell explosion, lend his assistance to him to obtain a dog. Until that time, Leader Dog was unable to establish themselves in Spain due to the leadership of General Franco. Franco opposed any international associations within his country. When Garcia returned to Spain, he received much press, and Franco became aware of the endeavor. When President Bird was able to get an audience with Franco, he provided approval to establish themselves in Spain. At this meeting, Franco recognized the Lions as a group which "gave a dog to someone in Barcelona". The association of Lions of Spain and Leader Dog continues today.

On May 10, 1968, Leader Dog received permission to use the "Lions" emblem by Lions International, thus formalizing and strengthening the relationship between the two organizations.

In 1972 with support and assistance of the Shelby Township Lions, a 2,200-pound statue of a life size Lion was designed and erected to the Downtown Rochester training facility. During that decade, Pock, who still was serving as an Executive Director of Leader Dog, was twice elected to the Lions International Board (1974-75, 1978-79).

In April of 2013 LION magazine listed Leader Dog for the Blind as one of the "10 Brilliant Breakthroughs in Service". In November of 2013, Leader Dog, Lions Club International, and partners Purina Pro Plan and Iowa Department of Corrections jointly received the Community Partnership Award from Mutual of America Foundation for Leader Dog's Puppy Raising Program. The program places Leader Dog puppies with inmates for their first years of life.

Leader Dog with support of Lions Clubs throughout the world, Leader Dog has provided free dogs with training to clients in all 50 states and in many foreign countries. Leader Dog appreciates the many volunteers, including puppy raisers, breeding hosts, and many more. Many recipients of Leader Dog services have become Lions after the experience and support.

To this day, the mission of Lions, "We Serve" complements the Leader Dog mission to empower people whom are blind or visually impaired with lifetime skills for independent travel. Partnerships – that's what it is all about. We all know that Lions and the University of Minnesota partnered in 1960 as the team forming the MN Lions Eye Bank. But do we think of all the partnerships required to make any business successful? This month let's mention some of the key partnerships that make Lions Gift of Sight the premier institution that it is.

Income and outgo, not just financially. Two key professional partners are the first to benefit from the eye tissue supply. Surgeons and ophthalmologists receive the eye tissue for all vision care needs. Secondly, researchers, at the U and beyond, require the tissue to support their efforts to combat eye diseases and to develop care procedures.

And where is the tissue procured? We know hospitals are our partnerships. So are funeral directors. Sensitive times for families but donations result in final acts of kindness to the world.

Just a reminder. Becoming a donor is easy. The donor and family are treated with respect and dignity. Donation must occur within hours of death so planning ahead is critical. Checking "donor" on your driver's license is the common method of stating your wishes. And, Lions Gift of Sight has donor cards available (so important now if you wish to use our preferred eye bank). Making our loved ones aware of our wishes should be done, too.

An update from the Vision Foundation. The wish to make Lions Gift of Sight as the default eye bank used by hospitals is still somewhat alive. Original bill has been adjusted in negotiation to satisfy the needs of all parts of our state. The goal is that no eye tissue gathered will ever be distributed to a "for profit" entity. Will keep you posted.

Lion Christy and I are anxious to visit your clubs sharing the passion of Lions' original mission. As directors, we continue to View Forward. 
# VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT SPECIAL OLYMPICS OPENING EYES

Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games is at the University of St. Thomas from June 21-23.

The University of St. Thomas will host the annual Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games for the second year! Roughly 3,500 athletes will be competing in basketball, track and field, swimming and gymnastics throughout the weekend. Outside of competition, there will be entertainment in Victory Village, health screenings for athletes, Celebration Ceremonies, arts and crafts, bingo, evening activities, and visits from local pro-sports mascots! Summer Games is open to the public and family friendly!

The Lions have played a major part in this competition for many years, and will once again host the Opening Eyes screening. As part of the Healthy Athletes program offerings, Opening Eyes provides a vision screening, conducted by eye doctors and eye care professionals. During the Opening Eyes screening, athletes have the opportunity to receive new eye glasses, sunglasses or sports goggles, free of charge! Opening Eyes is presented by Lions Club International.

Opening Eyes in Minnesota was first undertaken by Lions Clubs of 5M5, but we need you to make this screening happen! Opening Eyes volunteers directly impact the health of SOMN Athletes! 


