Every quarter the Multiple District has a Council of Governors meeting where all 12 District Governors from our MD5M multiple gather to discuss what is happening in each district, the multiple and at International. Our last meeting was at the Shooting Star Casino in Mahanomen, MN this past October. It is always an exciting time to visit with my fellow governors and compare notes on what is working well in our clubs around Minnesota and Canada. The main topic, of course, is growth in membership. I visited the Lake Crystal Lions recently and the Club President, Lion Tom Cooper, has a dream of doubling their beginning membership of 38. Wouldn't that be outstanding?

I applaud all the interest and activity in membership as that is what will keep our clubs strong, thriving, invigorating and fun. Best of all is that we will be able to serve our communities better by having enough manpower to undertake more projects, brainstorm new ideas and to work together to raise funds for all the worthy causes we choose.

There is an excellent tool on the Lions International website for any club looking on how to recruit new members. It is called "Just Ask" and the link to this resource is www.lionsclubs.org/EN/common/pdfs/me300.pdf. This is a 22 page guide that gives you 4 steps on organizing a successful membership drives. Part of this process is using the CEP (Club Excellence Process). CEP has been promoted at the Region meetings and at some Zone meetings. I highly encourage your club to check it out as it is a very useful tool to help make your club "more excellent". It has been great to see the good attendance at the Region and Zone meetings. I felt clubs are working to increase membership and have good programs going. When all the tables are full and it gets to feeling a little crowded, that is wonderful. Continue to encourage new Lions to attend the Zone meetings. I am sure they will have questions about the happenings at the meetings. Make sure to answer these questions or find the answer for them. Commitment is a prerequisite to success. Are you committed to Lions?
