Credentials ReportLion Cindy Walters We had 53 clubs submit their delegate rosters showing membership of 1992. There were 11 clubs that did not respond, with an estimated membership of 440. There were 154 preregistered delegates and we issued 118 delegate cards, along with 2 PID, 1 DG, 19 PDG, for a total of 140 voting delegates. #### **New Business:**

Kids Sight – VDG Steve Wasserman gave an updated report on the steering committee that is working on this project. They have purchased one spot vision screener and have partnered with the Minnesota Child Care Association and are looking for more partners. They have started a pilot project with New Horizon as well. VDG Steve reported that the Cabinet endorse this project and encourage the leadership team to appoint a chair to the cabinet to work the project as well. He requested the delegation to make a motion that the project be endorsed. Lion Lori Klein made the motion, Lion Tim Lindbo seconded. The delegation had many questions regarding how this would work. Lions will be actually doing the screenings. VDG Steve thought this could be a Centennial signature Lions project. These are screenings not exams. This process would screen for eye diseases and then the children would be referred to eye doctors. Each screening camera costs about \$8,000. PID Mike Molenda spoke in support of this project. MC.

#### Jack Webster – Centennial Event

Lion Jack Webster proposed a fundraiser. It is a three part scheme – 1) 100 years celebration of Lions International – Lions clubs do one special project in recognition; 2) Promote Project New Hope at a higher degree; 3) Bike-a-thon for 100 miles at \$100/mile would equal \$10,000 for Project New Hope. The route will travel from Waterville to Faribault back to Waterville to Mankato and back to Waterville. He will be publicizing the event in the Newsletter and sending letters to all clubs. Waterville has donated \$1,000 to get the wheels moving. September 24<sup>th</sup> is the date if supported. He has pins for sale to fundraise for this project. He has a full set of DG pins to raffle. Lion Kathleen Bleckeberg made the motion to support this project, seconded by PDG Mike Vos. MC.
