Hi all. Lion Lisa and I just spent a long weekend up in Duluth celebrating our 5th wedding anniversary. It's nice to get away, take some time to relax, and to reflect on how lucky I am to hang with someone who gets me, challenges me to be a better person and makes me want to belong.

Maybe not in quite the same way, but we want our members, both new and seasoned, to have similar feelings about their Lions Club. Along with welcoming new members, it is important to engage them in club activities as soon as possible. If your club members feel welcome, comfortable and involved in community service, they will remain part of your club.

Research has been conducted on new members with less than three years of experience as well as members with longer tenure as a Lion. The research shows that regardless of the length of tenure as a Lion, there are some key needs, listed in order, that most members want to have met to remain a part of your club:

- 1) Being able to "take pride" in service activities
- 2) Being confident that they are "making a difference"
- 3) Being informed of club goals.

In addition, new members require some special attention their sponsor should provide in order to be highly satisfied with their experience:

- 1) Be able to develop friendships
- 2) Feel like they have a sense of belonging.

How can your club provide the experiences your members are seeking? Keeping your club efficient, productive and meaningful to your members results in many benefits:

- A club that is a vital and respected part of your community
- The ability to provide and support both local and global service
- The ability to offer personal and professional growth opportunities to your members
- A club that provides enjoyable fellowship



Did you know one thing you can do is ask your members! Members feel involved when you ask for their opinions. Consider conducting a Member Questionnaire. Ask your members:

Why is the club here? Do our activities demonstrate this? If a non-Lion looked at one year of our activities, what would they think is important to our club?

 You can find the Member Questionnaire on line or ask me for a copy and I'll send it your way.

As a club leader (board member or not), you have opportunities to shape the future of your club and the direction it goes. Make your club something you ALL can be proud to be part of.

USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Louisville, Kentucky has been cancelled

It is with great sadness that the Forum Executive Committee has decided to cancel the 2020 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Louisville, Kentucky. As we said earlier in the year, the safety of our attendees is our number one concern. We had hoped for a significant flattening of the curve on cases of COVID-19 throughout our geographical area but that has not been the trend. Travel between the United States and Canada has also been a concern.

Although the planned Forum is still three months away and conditions could improve over the summer, there is enough uncertainty that we feel it best to make the decision to cancel now.

The Forum will offer a choice of a full refund or a rollover of your registration fees to the 2021 Forum. You can make that choice in writing by e-mailing our Registrar at registrar@lionsforum.org or by mailing your choice request to PO Box 723, Rapid City, SD 57709-0723. Please do not call the Forum office to request a refund or transfer of funds to 2021.

Our goal for the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum has always been to provide a rich learning experience and

a social environment where we see our old friends and make new ones. This 44th Annual Forum promised to be one of the best as the City of Louisville has so much to share with us.

We extend our sincere appreciation to the City of Louisville and to the Kentucky Lions for inviting us. We hope to be back soon.








Nicollet Lions...
