Fellow 5M2 Lions,

Watching the news these days I feel overwhelmed by the descriptions and videos showing the horrific destruction in Ukraine. I also feel overwhelmed in a good way reading the social media posts describing how Lions are meeting the needs of people directly affected by the war in Ukraine. Between March 1 and March 18 \$200,000 in humanitarian aid was granted by LCIF in 8 countries. As the refugees move further into Europe, Lions districts welcoming numerous refugees will become eligible to request grants of up to US\$15,000 through the Lions Clubs International Foundation's Refugees and Displaced Persons Fund.

Lions from around the world are stepping up to assist the relief efforts. Here is just a sample of how Lions are showing kindness right now. Here is some information that I obtained from social media posts:

- Lions in Denmark, Netherlands, Germany, France, Italy, Spain, Portugal, and Switzerland are making offers to take refugees home
- A club in Italy has made a huge collection of medicines, baby products, personal hygiene products, food, blankets, and clothes. They loaded the eyeglass recycling center van and left on a humanitarian mission towards the Romania / Ukraine border where everything was delivered directly to the local refugee camps.
- Lions in Germany have collected tons of donations in kind such as food, animal feed, hygiene items, warm blankets and clothing, as well as utensils and electronic items. All were brought to the people of Ukraine. After the goods had been handed over, they were transported directly to Lviv or Kiev where they are so urgently needed.
- In France, the leisure committee and the school of the Little Princes have joined forces with the Lions Club of Toul to collect consumable products for Moldova, a country bordering Ukraine, which currently hosts many Ukrainian refugees.
- In the USA, the Northwest CT Cyber LEOs Club and the Sage Park Middle School LEOs Club of Lions District 23-B gathered to package sunflowers for their Sunflowers for Peace fundraiser through Lions Clubs International Foundation.

We all want to do something to help those suffering in Ukraine! Lions stand for peace and understanding, and we unite through kindness to serve those in need. Your donation to LCIF's Refugees and Displaced Persons fund will help ensure that Lions are there to help them find the safety and security they desperately need. Just go to the LCI website and click on the banner at the top of the page to donate by credit card. You can also mail a check to me, and I'll forward it to LCIF. Write "Refugees and Displaced Persons Fund" in the memo line. As always, 100% of your donation will go towards helping those most in need.

This is also a good time to update your club roster, email addresses, etc.! New officers MUST be in by May 15th, but a great way to do it is to enter it in when you enter in your end of April membership and service reports.



Laura's Story

Laura's hearing loss as an adult didn't keep her from enjoying life and exploring new things. As a wife, mother of four, employee and volunteer, she kept very busy. She even learned to salsa dance by following the beat of the music through the vibrations on the floor. Then she received **cochlear implants** at University of Minnesota Medical Center, and everything changed.

Patients with **cochlear implants** have to re-associate the sounds they perceive with their auditory memory, and they use visual cues in the process. As Laura explains, "Engineered hearing is very different. For example, I couldn't tell the difference between the faucet running and my dog lapping water. Making the visual connection helped."

She even had to re-learn to dance. When she could hear the music, she had to train herself differently. It took hours of listening to the music and practicing dancing at home in her living room. Her positive attitude and determination paid off—she continues to dance and assists the instructor, too.

Thanks to all the Lions who donate to the Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation. You are helping to change the lives of many with hearing loss—and changing the world.



letter. Remember, if a poster is submitted, something as simple as it being the wrong size, could disqualify your clubs entry. The contest rules must be followed.

Rule # 1 A kit must be purchased for each contest sponsored. Clubs that have multiple schools (or organized youth groups) in their area can sponsor a contest in each school which means you must order a kit for each. Each kit includes a sticker that MUST be placed on the back of your clubs winning poster prior to it being forwarded to the next level of judging. The sticker states the following: Attach the sticker to the bottom right hand corner on back of the winning poster. All signatures are required – (a parent and the club president). The student's information is required as well as their quote.

Come back next month to read about another one of the rules and in the meantime, why not order a kit!!


