Although I was not able to attend the full USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum last week, I came home passionate about service and leadership. The Forum is designed to strengthen Lions through practical training, inspiring speakers and meaningful connections, and this year was no exception. I attended the Lions Speed Learning

where 12 table hosts introduced topics they would be presenting for a full hour later in the forum. There were over 100 seminars participants could choose from over the 2 ½ days. Topics included: grant applications, new club development, Leo clubs, Lions University, retention, expanding service just to name a few. Beyond the workshops, keynote speakers shared powerful stories of courage, innovation and kindness-reminding us why Lions are needed now more than ever. Walking through the Forum, one could feel the energy of Lions united under the banner of service, ready to take on new challenges and opportunities. The next Forum will be in Memphis, Tennessee September 3-5, 2026, mark your calendars and I hope many more of you will consider joining us. Each year I think they can't make this any better, but they always do....

The first Focus Week--Mental Health and Wellbeing is scheduled for Oct. 3-12. LCI has extended the time frame for all the Focus Weeks, and now we have ten days before and ten days after to do our projects. Some suggestions of projects include: speaker at your club meeting, share daily social media posts (tips, hotline numbers, etc.), comfort kits (journals, stress balls, tea, puzzle books), wear green ribbons during the week, visit a shut-in neighbor, share tips on managing stress and check-in with Lions that you haven't seen for a while. Remember to post your activity on the Portal as there will be no paper applications for the Club Excellence Award. Participation in all three of the Focus Weeks is a new requirement of the Excellence Award.

Rob Hed, the multiple GST, announced that the Portal will be doing updates with Improved Page Layouts! Looking forward to having streamlined navigation, enhanced filters, and simple export options. Keep watch for the updates.

Watch your mailbox for Zone Meeting invites. Final preparations are underway and should be out shortly. We combine two Zones together for the Fall meetings and single zone meetings in the spring. So, Zone 1 & 3, Zone 2 & 4, Zone 5 & 6 and Zone 7 & 8 will meet together. The purpose of Zone meetings is to strengthen communication between clubs, share district updates, recognize club successes, share ideas/solutions and to ask questions. Throw in a fun Fundraising activity to complete the evening. Zone Meetings are open to ALL Lions not just officers so plan on attending and having a fun time.

Treasurers, have you renewed your club's business filling with the Secretary of State? Now is the time to check and make sure you have registered for 2025, and you renew for 2026. You must also file with the IRS form 990-N if you are a 501 (c) 4 club and your yearly income is less than the \$50,000. Form 990-N is due every year by the 15th day of the 5th month after the close of your tax year. Our fiscal year ends on June 30, so your form needs to be filed by November 15. If you fail to file, the IRS gives you 3 years grace but after that it'll cost you to reinstate your non-profit status. Google Form 990-N for further instructions.

2025-2026 LCI Club Excellence Award Criteria

The Club Excellence Award recognizes clubs that demonstrate outstanding service, strong leadership, membership growth and community impact. Below are the minimum requirements that must be met to receive this award. Plan now, start early and lead with service. That is how we build a future where Lions truly shine.

2025-2026 LCI Club Excellence Award Criteria

The Club Excellence Award acknowledges the dedication and legacy of service within individual clubs.

Applications will not be necessary for the 2025-2026 award cycle. Awards will be distributed by Lions International to clubs that meet the following criteria and eligibility requirements.

Membership

- Induct a minimum of two or 20% new members, whichever is greater (not including transfer, reinstated or charter members). Eligibility is determined based on the club's membership count on June 30th of the previous Lion year.
- Or sponsor a new Lions club.

Service

- Report a minimum of four (4) service activities to Lions International. Three (3) of these activities must show participation in each of the three (3) International Weeks of Service.

Leadership

- Report newly elected club officers in Lion Portal by May 15 of the current Lion year.
- A minimum of 10% of the club's members complete any three courses in the Lions Learning Center.
- The club president for the current Lion year must not have served more than two consecutive terms.
- A minimum of two or more club officers (president, vice president, secretary or treasurer, of which, one must be the club president) complete Club Officer Training (online with the Lions Learning Center or in-person as reported by a GLT coordinator in Learn) between July 1-December 31 of the current Lion year.

Donations

- Contribute to LCIF a minimum of the club's membership total on June 30th of the previous Lion year, multiplied by US\$20.

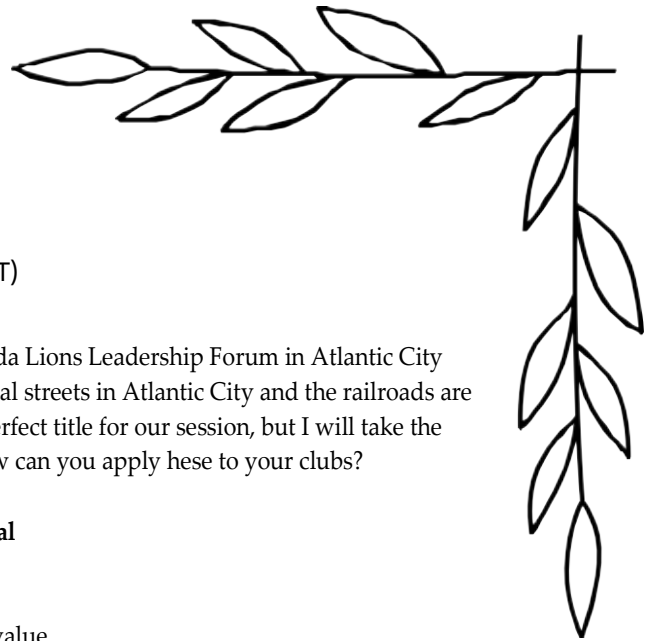

Leadership Lessons from Monopoly

PCC Glenn and I had the opportunity to present at the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Atlantic City last month. A little trivia for you, the properties are named after real streets in Atlantic City and the railroads are based on local lines. Leave it to Lion Glenn to come up with the perfect title for our session, but I will take the credit for our costumes. Below are the 10 lessons we spoke on, how can you apply these to your clubs?

Leadership Lessons from Monopoly for Lions Clubs International

Turning Game Strategy into Community Impact

1. **Invest Strategically** Monopoly: Buy properties with long-term value.
Lions: Focus time and resources on service projects with lasting impact.
2. **Diversify to Strengthen Impact** Monopoly: Own a variety of properties across the board. Lions: Support diverse causes—vision, environment, hunger, youth.
3. **Adapt to Change** Monopoly: Each turn brings surprises; stay flexible.
Lions: Respond to emerging community needs and shift plans accordingly.
4. **Build Incrementally** Monopoly: Start with houses, grow to hotels.
Lions: Pilot small projects and scale up when successful.
5. **Collaborate and Negotiate** Monopoly: Deals and trades are key to winning.
Lions: Partner with clubs, members, and local groups for greater impact.
6. **Value Every Member** Monopoly: All properties have strategic value.
Lions: Recognize every member's unique skills and contributions.
7. **Plan for the Long Game** Monopoly: Think beyond short-term profits.
Lions: Develop sustainable programs and future leaders.
8. **Stay Out of "Jail"—Act Ethically** Monopoly: Jail stops progress.
Lions: Lead with integrity, follow the Code of Ethics.
9. **Be Resourceful Under Pressure** Monopoly: Creativity can keep you in the game.
Lions: Innovate when facing challenges in funding or manpower.
10. **Celebrate Wins, Learn from Losses** Monopoly: Every game teaches lessons.
Lions: Reflect, improve, and honor successes and service.

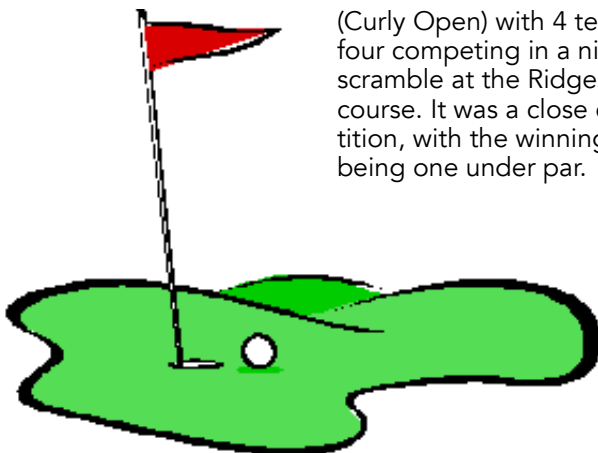
Jordan Lions
