- 50% of incoming Club Officers will complete Club Officer training by July 1, 2019.
- 100 % of Zone Chairpersons will complete Zone Chairperson training by July 1, 2019.
- Two qualified candidates will be identified to attend local & LCI sponsored institutes during 2019-2020.
- \circ 10% of District 5M2 Clubs will receive an Orientation Program by 7/1/2020.
- 10% of District 5M2 Clubs will be represented at the USA/Canada Leadership Forum in September 2019.



Greetings, all. And the new year is well underway. Christy and I will be attending our annual training on July 26 and attending our quarterly meeting on July 27. The training is always informative and it is fun to meet new directors from other districts. All directors switch out every six years. This will be my last year. Time flies when one is a part of such a great organization. I have learned so much.

This month I would like to share with you some information about Kidsight. Kidsight is not a part of Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation. Please obtain information from our cabinet members PDG Harry and Lion Loretta Klenke. However, I just want to toot that horn a bit!

Lions Kidsight USA is a project started in our country by LCI. When introduced in Minnesota, MLVF (matching a grant from LCI) gave our 5M originators a significant grant of \$100,000 to help them form their structure, obtain 501(c)3 status, and purchase the screening devices (two per district). Now many of our clubs are actively participating but this might be a goal for more of our clubs. The objective is to screen children, ages 6 months to 6 years, for vision shortcomings. The program is screening, not diagnoses, of the many visual issues. According to their information, 80% of learning is visual. If one can't see well, one does not learn well. Early detection is critical. Screenings can be set up in assorted ways - maybe through daycares, preschool screenings in your district, or even an open house. Parents are given notice that a child might have a potential eye problem. Last Saturday I took the opportunity to attend a screening training seminar put on by the Klenkes at Winsted City Hall. I am amazed at the professionalism of this program. I am amazed by the Lion volunteers who work the program (including lots of paperwork) in your communities. Be proud of the good stuff we do! If you wish to know more, the dedicated Klenke team is there for you! Give them a shout.

Next month, we will share with you news from the Vision Foundation. Surely, Christy and I will be overwhelmed with information as we finish our annual training.

We are anxious to visit your clubs and share the passion of Lions' original mission. As directors, we continue to View Forward. Our past is great and our goals will continue to be met. LIONS', LEOS' CLUBS NEWS AND ACTIVITIES Lafayette Area Lions Club

Greg Bieraugel named Melvin Jones Fellow at Lafayette awards night

Greg Bieraugel was the guest of honor when the annual awards program of the Lafayette Area Lions was held Tuesday, July 9. Past District Governor Mary Spille presented the Lions highest honor—the Melvin Jones plaque and pin—to Bieraugel. Greg is only the third non-Lion to be recognized by the Lafayette club.

Lafayette Lions president Brad DeBoer shared highlights of Bieraugel's life and Lions secretary Ruth Klossner read an article from the 2004 Centennial History of the Lafayette Band entitled "A 50-year band member at age 59."

Now, 15 years later, Greg is a 65-year veteran of the Lafayette Band and continues to play the Friday night concerts. He's a past president of the band and has also sat-in with other area bands, among them the Over 60 Band and the Schell's Hobo Band. While in military service from 1963 to 1967, Bieraugel played with the Marine Band out of Quantico, Virginia, playing for presidents, kings, and other dignitaries, as well as for many burials at Arlington National Cemetery. He had several weeks leave every summer—so was able to maintain continuous membership in the Lafayette Band, even while in the service.




