

Prior Lake Lion's sponsoring a Leader Dog in Memory of Lion Tim Lindbo

"Daxos"

Recently Leader Dog for the Blind contacted Club Presidents to request Lions Clubs to "sponsor a puppy." In return for a \$500 donation by the club, a Lion or individual they designate could have the honor to "sponsor" a puppy or sponsor in memory of someone. The Prior Lake Lion's have decided to sponsor a Leader Dog puppy in memory of Lion Tim Lindbo. The Prior Lake Lions have chosen to "sponsor" "Daxos". Our Lion's club hopes "Daxos" will graduate and provide a lifetime of service to a visually impaired individual to allow that person more independence and mobility in his or her life. "Daxos" is a German Shepard, described as bold, inquisitive and snuggly. His favorite toy is what ever toy another dog is playing with. He is growing up in Michigan.

Lion Tim joined the Lions in November of 1998 joining the New Market Elko Lions. In September 2008 he transferred to the Prior Lake Lions. Lion Tim served as Club President in 2013-2014 term. He had a deep passion for the Prior Lake Lion's and especially enjoyed the Mid-Winter Conventions. He washed dishes at pancake breakfasts and enjoyed giving back for the many whom helped him with his disabilities.

Tim passed away at the age of 37 following a long hospital stay on April 15th, 2016. He was the third child of four children. His parents were his biggest supporters. He became visually impaired as a youngster. He always loved the outdoors. Tim's Grandpa Jim encouraged his interest in carpentry and woodworking. In 2002 he purchased land in Hill City and began building a cabin to fulfill his love of the outdoors and carpentry, his father, brother and friend assisted him in completion of his dream. Tim and his dogs Casey and Remer hosted friends and family at the cabin. He loved ice fishing, spring turkey hunting, and his annual fishing trip to the Lake of the Woods, fishing on Leech Lake, fall pheasant and duck hunts with Capable Partners. He loved hunting deer on his land. His love of the outdoors endured though a positive attitude, sense of humor and determination to live life to the fullest. One story has him driving a car from Lydia to take friends home after an evening of libations at the local bar since he was the soberest one of his friends. True or not, quite a feat for Tim, since back roads are laden with curves, and approximately 10 miles to his home. Also, some documentation of Lion Tim building a gun case out of old wood heavily embedded with oil. He was not allowed to complete the cutting task at the facility he was building his gun case due to the offensive odor of the wood. Of course, once completed he was unable to store the gun case inside his cabin, again due to the odor embedded in the wood. Lion Tim attended many Lion's meetings thanks to PDG Gordy who went out of his way to give him rides to the events. His parents often assisted in this endeavor also.

Lion Tim attended the School of the Blind in Faribault, graduating in 1997. He continued has education at Hennepin Technical College and Dakota County Technical College graduating with a degree in Retail Management. He attended Blind Inc. in Minneapolis, to gain confidence, improve his positive attitude toward blindness to build a future in today's changing world. He gave back to Blind Inc by mowing the lawns at the location. He worked at Lowes for a period.

Lion Tim had at least two service dogs to increase his mobility and provide him the opportunity to live independently. Tim did live life to the fullest and loved his parents and siblings. He looked forward to time spent with nieces and nephews. He especially loved his "Lion's "family and has been truly missed at Mid-Winter Conventions. Leader Dog's Summer Experience Camp "Making Teens Unstoppable!"

Application Deadline March 31, 2019!

Do you know a visually impaired teenager whom could benefit by a summer experience to gain confidence and increased mobility to assist with possible changes with their life occurring with high school graduation? Summer Experience Camp is a week of outdoor fun, friendship and skill building. The program combines activities like rock wall climbing and tandem biking with leadership building exercises and things exclusively Leader Dog—GPS training and spending time with Leader Dogs in training. The combination helps increase independent travel skills, interpersonal skills and leadership skills.

The free program is for boys and girls ages 16 and 17 who are legally blind. Leader Dog covers all costs including airfare to Michigan—and everyone receives a free HumanWare Victor Reader Trek GPS device. The 2019 camp dates are June 22—June 29. Applications are due by March 31, 2019. You can view a Fox Sports clip about camp, read camper stories and download an application at <u>LeaderDog.org</u>. Two days after her 16th birthday, Ashley Eisenmenger came to Leader Dog for the first time for Summer Experience Camp. What followed was a week of new experiences that changed her life. "I rode my first tandem bicycle there," she says. "I attribute my love of cycling to that, which led to me competing in triathlons."

The opportunities that Ashley received while at Leader Dog that summer helped her to realize that just because she is visually impaired, she does not have to limit herself or her expectations. Her time at camp represented such an important change that she soon found herself coming back to Leader Dog as a volunteer camp counselor. "It's one of the highlights of my summer," she says. "Some of the kids are super confident in what they can do and some of them, it's the first time they've been around other kids their age who have visual impairments."

Now in college, Ashley is majoring in communications and considering graduate school for sports psychology or looking for a job in her field once she graduates, preferably in the nonprofit sector. She has spent more time behind the scenes at a nonprofit than most others her age since Ashley is a member of Leader Dog's Voice of the Client Committee. "It's cool to be on the ground level of all that's going on here and get an insider perspective," she says. "It's reaffirmed the genuine care the Leader Dog staff have for the clients and the dogs."

When she isn't studying or volunteering at Leader Dog, Ashley trains as a competitive triathlete and endurance runner, qualifying for the Boston Marathon in 2017.

Ashley's experiences at Leader Dog and her guidance of other teens at Summer Experience Camp have contributed to her confidence, and she sees similar changes in the campers coming here for the first time. "It's a really cool thing to see the kids realize that there don't have to be limits." Her message to other young people with visual impairments is to not let difficulty turn into impossibility. "I run triathlons tied to another person, and that's not how that's normally done," she says. "The best advice I could offer is to understand that while the ways you do things might be different, don't be afraid to try."

They work to develop medications, surgical techniques, and equipment. They practice and perfect eye surgeries. All of these things help patients to return to more active and productive lives. The services provided by Lions Gift of Sight are so many and varied. Our financial contributions, no matter the amount, are critical. So, we serve in two ways, donors and dollars.

Just a reminder. Becoming a donor is easy. The donor and family are treated with respect and

dignity. Donation must occur within hours of death so planning ahead is critical. Checking "donor" on your driver's license is the common method of stating your wishes. Eye donations are procured in hospitals, hospice settings, and funeral homes.

Many hearts are touched by donation - the donor, his loved ones, an individual recipient, his loved ones, and even the benefactors of modern day research. We Serve!

Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games is at the University of St. Thomas from June 21-23.

The University of St. Thomas will host the annual Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games! Roughly 3,500 athletes will be competing in basketball, track and field, and swimming throughout the weekend. Outside of competition, there will be entertainment in Victory Village, health screenings for athletes, Celebration Ceremonies, arts and crafts, bingo, evening activities, and visits from local pro-sports mascots! Summer Games is open to the public and family friendly!

The Lions have played a major part in this competition for many years, and will once again host the Opening Eyes screening. As part of the Healthy Athletes program offerings, Opening Eyes provides a complete eye exam, conducted by eye doctors and eye care professionals. During the Opening Eyes screening, Athletes have the opportunity to receive new eye glasses, sunglasses or sports goggles, free of charge! Opening Eyes is presented by Lions Club International.

Opening Eyes in Minnesota was first undertaken by Lions Clubs of 5M5, but we need you to make this screening happen! Opening Eyes volunteers directly impact the health of SOMN Athletes!
