This month I have been struggling with what to write for my last article as the District Governor for 5M-2. Finally came up with the word which summarizes the year... gratitude. So grateful for the opportunity to lead our district and playing a part in the success we have had.

Lions Club International set many goals for our district, membership, new clubs, drops, leadership training, service reporting and donations to our Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF). With the support of every Lion in our district we are on target to meet each and every one of these goals.

Lions Year 2024-25 Goals:

Membership Goal: Add 205 new members, as of today we are 209. Thank you to every Lion who sponsored a new member.



Net Growth: End the year at +4,

we are currently at +61. Hoping the dreaded June drops does not put us under our goal. Now is the time to reach out to those members who you have not heard from. Invite them to club meetings and service projects.

New Club: Add one new club, we are very close to getting the new club through the LCI process for approval. This a specialty club focused on diabetes.

LCIF: Goal of \$69,059 and we are currently at \$84,699. At least 201 individual members in our district make a personal donation, currently we are at 205. Thank you PDG Anna Wickenhauser and Lion Rose Thies for all of your creative ideas to get to our LCIF goal.

Service Reporting: Goal of 100% of our active clubs reporting at least one activity and have two district wide service projects. Goal met! One service project focused on hunger and the other on childhood cancer, completed at our zone meetings. Thank you, Global Service Chair (GST) Lion Julie Beckius for your leadership and service ideas.

Leadership (officer training): 30% of club officers will be trained, we reached 32% and 100% of the zone chairs were trained. Thank you, Global Leadership Chair (GLT) Lion Glenn Kaufmann for your assistance reaching this goal and to all the club officers who participated.

Thank you 5M-2 Lions for what you do. We serve, and we meet our goals! So proud of the work we have accomplished this Lions year. Thank you to the district cabinet members for stepping up to serve and to help guide our district.

This is not a goodbye, I will continue to help strengthen our district and assist in meeting next year's goals. Along with some other Lions from 5M-2, Past Council Chair (PCC) Glenn and I will be in Orlando in July for the International Convention. We will be there to support District Governor Elect (DGE) Shermayne and Lion Bob and to watch her take her oath of office. 
The only thing it will NOT count for is your District and Club Community Impact Grant (DCG).

For any online donations. When you get the receipt from LCIF call into Donor Services or email Donor Services with your receipt and tell them you would like it put in SPECIAL OLYMPICS MN.

For recurring donations. You must contact Donor Services via phone @ (630) 203-3836 and tell them you want to designate your donations to SPECIAL OLYMPICS MN. Remember to change your recurring contribution back to wherever you want it to go after we have met our \$250k Goal.



Albert Lea Noon Lions Club Awarded Sheehan Foundation Matching Grant

At the end of each calendar quarter the TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation Grant Committee meets to review grant applications to award at least 3 grants per quarter that address an important humanitarian need. For the quarter ending



tions the Grant Committee has had to review.

The Albert Lea Noon Lions were one of the recipients of a matching grant for \$550 to purchase two tote carts to support the Food for Backpacks Program, which serves over 500 students each week and provides weekend meals to students facing food insecurity in the Albert Lea School system. The carts will be placed at the Southwest Middle School in the fall of 2025. The purpose of the two food carts is to allow students to choose food to their liking. This will reduce food waste. This project has the capacity to serve up to 70 students.

Congratulations to the Albert Lea Noon Lions Club for being the first club in 5M2 to be awarded a matching grant to help serve their school community better. Well

Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games is at the University of Minnesota from June 20-22nd.

The university of Minnesota will host the annual Special Olympics Minnesota Summer Games! Roughly 3,000 athletes will be competing in basketball, basketball, swimming, and gymnastics throughout the weekend. Outside of competition, there will be entertainment in the athlete Village, health screenings for athletes, Celebration Ceremonies, and many other activities for everyone! Summer Games is open to the public and family friendly!

The Lions have played a major part in this competition for many years, and will once again host the Opening Eyes screening. As part of the Healthy Athletes program offerings, Opening Eyes provides a complete eye exam, conducted by eye doctors and eye care professionals. During the Opening Eyes screening, Athletes have the opportunity to receive new eye glasses, sunglasses or sports goggles, free of charge! Opening Eyes is presented by Lions Club International.

Opening Eyes in Minnesota was first undertaken by Lions Clubs of 5M5, but we need you to make this screening happen! Opening Eyes volunteers directly impact the health of SOMN Athletes! Volunteers will also have the opportunity to meet and interact with Special Olympics Minnesota Athletes, and also meet Lions from other clubs and other districts. Volunteers will receive a Summer Games Volunteer t-shirt and Volunteers working over six hours will also receive a complimentary lunch.



Held the annual bike a thon with 5 kids participating.




