Registration is now open for the October 2022 MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI)

The institute is open to all lions who are members in good standing of a Lions Club except for Past District Governors, District Governors, or 1st Vice District Governors.

The \$150 USD registration fee for RLLI includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs, \$129 USD excluding tax, and additional meals are not included.

A \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program.

Early Bird Discount: Register by July 1st and save \$25 USD

Participants must attend all sessions beginning on Thursday evening and ending Sunday Afternoon.

Each district can send six (6) participants; however, if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions.

Applications are available from your District Governor or District Global Leadership Team Chairperson as well as on the MD5M website: <u>lionsmd5m.org</u> under resources. Completed applications must be submitted to your District Governor, without fees by August 31st, 2022. Your District Governor will make the final participant selection and you will be notified by September 15th if you were or were not accepted.

The use of lettering or numbering on the front of the poster, in any language, is NOT allowed. Any signatures or initials of the artist must be done on the back of the poster. Artwork should be done on a flexible material so that it can be rolled (not folded) and shipped to me in a mailing tube. You may deliver it to me if that works for you or I would certainly be willing to meet you half way to pick it up. Please sure that the poster gets mailed or hand delivered to me by November 15th. Please do not mail it to DG Kathleen as this will only delay

the process.

At the District level, I have 3 non-Lion judges who have a flair for art or work with youth. They all judge independent of each other, choosing a 1st, 2nd & 3rd place District winner, each receiving a monetary award at the Mid-Winter Convention. The top District 5M2 winner then gets sent to MD5M Council Chair for further judging.

As Lions do you ever ask yourself "why we do what we do?". I spent this past weekend reinforcing why I do what I do, why I'm a Lion and can't seem to say no when asked to serve.

Past DG Marvin and I attended the summer Lions Hearing Foundation meeting. For me it was training as a new trustee and for Marvin reporting and sharing his immense store of knowledge. I learned so much about how the Hearing Foundation operates, the Mission and the goals. The result was creating an excitement to help in any way I can to meet the goals.

It was also a time to meet Lions from around 5M and Lions from the other Foundations. I enjoyed reconnecting with Lions on the Diabetes Foundation as well as the Vision Foundation.

A real highlight of the weekend was hearing from Dr. Samir Khariwala from the U of M Department of Otolaryngology. His talk centered around the importance of a state-of-the-art Temporal Bone Lab and need for updat-

ing. (by the way I can now almost pronounce Otolaryngology.)

When the Lions helped build the Temporal Bone Lab in 1992 it led the nation in technology and training opportunities. Today, an update is necessary not only so our future health care providers can train on -the most modern equipment, but also to retain the U of M's reputation as a world-class training program.

To that end, the Foundation will consider a 3 year commitment to help fund the lab update. You'll be hearing more about this project this year. Marvin and I encourage your clubs to invite us to visit your club and provide information on this project as well as the research being done at the University.

As a retired preschool owner/ teacher of 20 years, I consistently taught empathy, compassion and how to care for others. I taught how to be courageous and kind. The children learned wonderful etiquette and manner skills from age 2.5 to 6.

I also taught a sensitivity training class at Whole Foods with my husband, Danny. We allowed children to experience walking with child-size walkers and wheelchairs and did a blindfold applesauce eating activity. This kind of makes me chuckle to think back to the blindfold activity, as I had no idea that my vision would be dwindling years later from radiation, chemotherapy and bone marrow transplant treatments for stage 4 cancer.

I received my Leader Dog, Shanti, in May of 2021. My life has been enlightened and lifted and enhanced ever since.

Our instructor, Kevin, brought Shanti to me as a home delivery. I was blessed to train for nine days in my hometown. He forewarned me about the public and how people could possibly be cruel. Cruel, how could anybody be cruel to this magnificent newly formed team of Shanti and me?

Being I was a teacher, I would like to teach you how to treat a Dog team.

- 1. People with guide dogs know their dogs are cute and that ignoring them is difficult, but it is essential that people follow this rule. Remember, our dogs are working, they are not just our pets.
- 2. Please don't yell, I am visually impaired not deaf.
- 3. Be Courteous and Kind. If I am struggling with a door for example, please ask if you could assist me.
- 4. I have low vision, I may squint, don't misinterpret this as I dislike you.

7. Loading and Unloading takes time. Please allow us time to wipe paws and remove harness.

 If you approach me, please announce yourself, and tell me where you know me from.

Please be patient, if we seem to impair you.

- 8. No Beep-Beeps. Honking will not hurry us along, and may startle the dog.
- 9. Be kind. Kind words matter as your mother said. We already get more negativity than I care to share.
- 10. Vision loss is not one size fits all. Everyone has different vision variability.
- 11. Please Respect us in public, such as a store. We are legally permitted to have a guide dog.
- 12. Sales clerks could assist with locating items. Please don't point, I can not recognize your direction.
- 13. If we are walking, please let me know which side you will pass me on. Such as coming up on your right.
- 14. We need each other. Please stop and say hello "hello". When the harness is on, the dog is working, please do not pet the dog, offer treats, or though kisses at the dog. It is a distraction, and may cause injury to me or the dog.
- 15. Playtime is when the harness comes off.

Shanti has been a real blessing for me and has improved my life more that I can tell you.

I am being authentic, raw and real to share what needs to be said: "Just be KIND to anyone with a dis-ability." Be kind and respectful to everyone, just as you would like to be treated.

Thank you for reading this and understanding more about the difficulties of being low vision or non-visual and for "opening the eyes of your heart."



Lafayette Area Lions Club

When Andrew Maidl arrived at the Lafayette Community Center Tuesday, July 12, he knew that he would be recognized as the Lafayette Lions' Melvin Jones Fellow awardee that evening.

But he didn't know that he would receive a second honor—that of being named the Zone 3 Lion of the Year.

In the surprise announcement, District Governor Kathleen Bleckeberg presented the zone award—in addition to awarding the Melvin Jones Fellow plaque as planned. Bleckeberg had hoped to present the zone award at a meeting a month ago, but Maidl was unable to attend—so she waited for the next opportunity.

With dozens of family members, co-workers, and friends present, Maidl became the 30th Lafayette recipient of the Melvin Jones Fellowship since 1994, the highest award that the Lions convey.

Andrew is the first local three-generation Melvin Jones recipient, following his father, Joe Maidl, and his grandfather, the late Clarence Maidl. Interestingly, the awards were all presented 13 years apart—Joe in 2009, Clarence in 1996, and now Andrew in 2022.

Andrew was also a third generation club president, following in the footsteps of Clarence (1987-88) and Joe (three times: 2002-03, 2008-09, and 2017-18).

Before the award presentation, fellow Lion Brad DeBoer spoke of Andrew's leadership, both during his youth and now in the community.

After describing Maidl's youth leadership in scouting, FFA, and college groups, DeBoer went on, "The main reason we are here tonight is that he is involved with the Lafayette Area Lions Club and, as you can guess, it didn't take long and a position of leadership was in the cards as he has just finished a term as president."

DeBoer continued, "It was during this term that our newest Melvin Jones Fellow's keen sense for leadership really came to light as we had some changes and transitions in our charitable gambling fundraising. That all strengthens the reasons Andrew joined the Lions Club—to give back to the community that helped raise him, to join the camaraderie of our members, watching our projects come to fruition, and becoming part of a family tradition of being a third generation Lion."

After receiving the Melvin Jones plaque, Andrew responded, noting he had watched the role models that his grandpa Clarence and dad Joe were and that he's trying to follow in their footsteps.

"It was an honor to serve with them and something I'll never forget," he said.






More Lafayette Lions


The local Lions club has made a significant contribution toward higher education, having awarded 254 scholarships, totaling \$132,800, over the past 26 years. Each of this year's recipients will receive \$1,000.


