

Kidsight is a program that has been affected greatly by the virus. Back in March we went on hiatus. We have had several virtual meetings since then. At the last meeting it was determined we can resume with many limitations. We must wear masks and face shields. We need to check every person (people operating screeners, children and individuals assisting with the screening on site) temperature before we can begin screening. Only three Lions are allowed at the site at one time. We must have antiseptic wipes along and use them on equipment after each child is screened. All Lions must sign a waiver stating that they will not hold the Lions organization liable if the catch the Covid virus. Also, the head of the facility or home care provider must sign a waiver to not hold the Lions responsible if Covid is contracted after screening. Our new policy requires us to go paperless. This means all consent forms would be emailed to a Lion from your club and all results must be emailed back to parents. This



means all data must be entered into the cameras prior to the screenings. Data includes each child's name, birthdate, and age prior to entering the facility to begin any screening.

I will be purchasing the face shield and thermometers if there is any interest in a Lion's club doing Kidsight screenings before vaccines are adequately given to provide herd immunity in our area. I will also need

to purchase antiseptic wipes. (I do not plan to purchase these supplies unless we have someone in the district that really want to attempt this at this time) This sounds like a lot of work just to complete a Kidsight screening. But if a club is willing to attempt it, I will help with whatever I can. My club, the Prior Lake Lion members have decided we will not do Kidsight screenings until we have had a vaccine. We do want to get back at this worthwhile program, but we need to do it safely.

Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation

Early Identification by Newborn Hearing Screening



In 1999, the Lions Multiple District 5M Hearing Foundation established the first and only statewide screening program for the early detection of hearing problems in newborns.

With more than \$417,000 in contributions and a matching grant from the Lions Clubs International Foundation, WE created the Lions Newborn Hearing Screening Program.

This was an ambitious initiative designed to establish newborn screening, without state funding or mandate, in every birthing hospital in Minnesota. All newborns in Minnesota are now screened.

The critical part of this is the early detection of the hearing problem so help can begin right away. This help may be in the form of hearing aids and/or cochlear implants. With this help at a young age, children do not fall behind in the learning curve and can keep up with other children without hearing problems.

Thank you to all the clubs that contributed to the Parade of Green at our Virtual Mid Winter Convention. If your club did not send a check before the convention, you can still do so. Just be sure to marker it in the memo line for Parade of Green 2021 and mail it to Marvin or Vern. We like to see all clubs donate to the Parade of Green and to the D-Feet Hearing Loss Walk. Each of these fund raisers is designated for different projects areas. The D-Feet Hearing Loss Walk will be a Virtual event this year due to the covid pandemic. There will be more details on this fund raiser as the plans are still being finalized.

When COVID says no you can't, the Green Isle Lions say YES WE CAN.

The Green Isle Lions for the past 7 years have planned, prepared and served a multi-generational meal once a month to area residents. These dinners were a highlight to many of our residents' social calendars and a helping hand to working Mom's and Dad's that found a hot meal prepared and served to them on the 3rd Monday of each month. On average 100 to 125 people were served, not bad when you consider the entire population of Green Isle is only 558 people.

When COVID entered the scene last March, there was much discussion on how we could continue to serve our guests, but also doing so in a socially responsible way. Our Project, Compassion Cares, was born by thinking outside of the box. We knew that many of our senior citizens not only missed the comaredire of the monthly dinners, but we also recognized that we provided a warm meal

that they might not otherwise be able to afford.

With corporate sponsors and many community supporters, we came up with the idea that if the residents couldn't gather together, we would deliver the fixings for three meals to their homes. Once a month, our shoppers prepare a meal plan, shop, gather and pack and the items for a bag full of goodies that our Lions Members along with the Green Isle Fire Department members deliver to their homes.

Upon delivery, we are met with many smiles, a few tears and many "you shouldn't have or you are too good to us". In these times when we are often faced with many things that we can't do, it is not only fun but gratifying that we can find ways to Serve.
