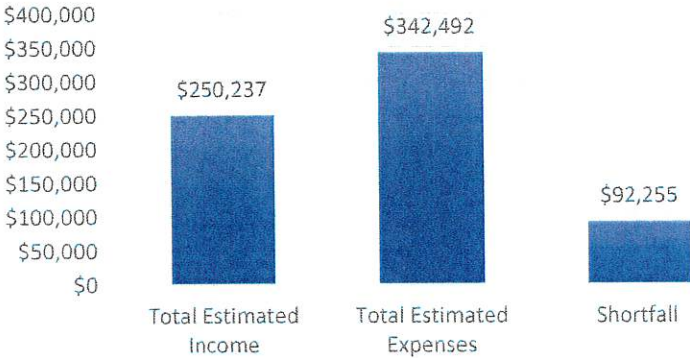

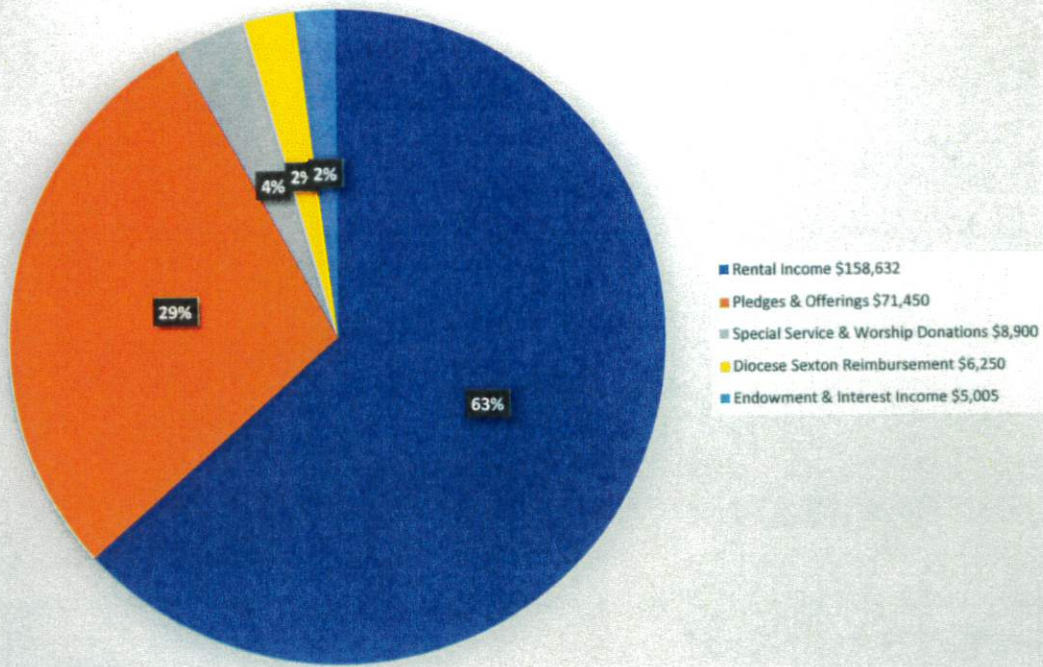

Christ Church 2024 Estimated Income, Expenses & Shortfall



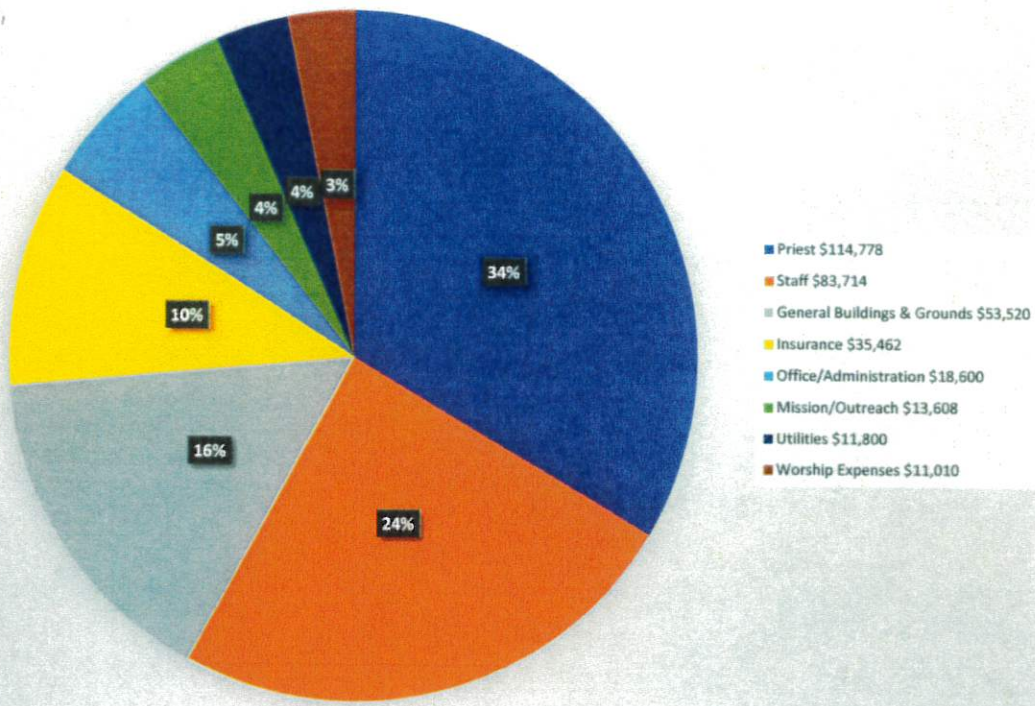
2024 MINISTRY PLAN GRAPHS

Even though our 155th Convention adjourned only a few weeks ago, it is already time to elect our parish's delegates to the 2022 Diocesan Convention. Please consider being a convention delegate for The Diocesan Convention coming up in 2022. The 156th Convention of the Diocese of Long Island will convene on Friday, November 11 and Saturday, November 12, 2022 at a location to be determined. Convention & Hotel expenses are paid by the church.

We need to elect one delegate to represent the congregation and one alternative (in case they are unable to serve.) NOMINATIONS are now open.

TREASURER'S REPORT FOR ANNUAL MEETING (2/6/2022)

Our budget for 2022 as adopted last month by your Vestry projects a total income of \$135,938. This includes rental income from AT&T for their cellphone tower (\$30,508) and from the 12 step programs that use our facilities (\$5,000) as well as \$24,000 from gains in our endowment portfolio. The rest comes from anticipated pledges and donations.

The budget projects total expenses for 2022 to be \$207,513. This includes our contribution to the Diocese (\$12,000), office expenses (\$14,900), priest expenses (\$39,893), staff expenses (\$38,250), taxes and fees (\$22,760), buildings and grounds expenses (\$20,900), insurance expenses (\$27,650), utilities (\$18,000), endowment management fees (\$4,700), and some other miscellaneous expenses.

Our shortfall (the difference between expenses and income) is projected to be \$71,575 for 2022.

As of the end of 2021, our endowment fund contains \$592,486. We are currently getting a return of about 7% largely because of the robust performance of the stock market. Our portfolio is a mixture of stocks and bonds to protect against fluctuations in the stock market. Our total assets as of the end of 2021 are \$642,179 which includes the funds in our day-to-day money market and checking accounts.

What does all this mean? \$642,000+ is a tidy sum so we are in no imminent financial jeopardy. However, we have a deficit of \$71,575 projected for 2022. Obviously that shortfall will have to come from our endowment unless there are substantial unexpected increases in our income or decreases in our expenses. Most financial experts advise not extracting more than 4% annually from an endowment to avoid someday exhausting it. Four percent of \$592,486 is \$23,699.44. \$71,575 is more than three times that amount. Therefore, it is clear that to ensure our long-term solvency, our income will either have to be substantially increased or our expenses substantially decreased or a combination of both.

Be assured that your vestry and the Diocese are working very hard to devise possible solutions to our financial situation. In the meantime our parishioners can certainly help by making a pledge, increasing an existing pledge, making a donation, and/or considering remembering Christ Church in a will.

- Combining AA, NA, & ODA programs = meetings per week. These programs save lives.
- Maureen's Haven: We have been the host site for this wonderful program that houses ten homeless men and feeds them once a month for six months.
- Two new artworks by Roz were permanently gifted to the church by Lyn & E.T. Williams with plaques dedicated to E.T.'s sister, Joanne Carter coming soon.
- Two new hires: Claudia Ward, Finances and Roz Dimon, Communication Arts/Admin are working out very well and hopefully will help see us through this transition period.

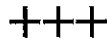
