



### FIRST READING: Isaiah 62: 1-5

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent,  
and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest,

until her vindication shines out like the dawn,  
and her salvation like a burning torch.

The nations shall see your vindication,  
and all the kings your glory;

and you shall be called by a new name  
that the mouth of the Lord will give.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 12: 1-11

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

Reader: Hear what the spirit is saying to God's people.

**People:** *Thanks be to God*

THE GOSPEL: John 2: 1-11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the

bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

### **THE NICENE CREED**

**We believe in one God,

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

## PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE

Celebrant: In peace, let us pray to the Lord: In trust, we bring before God our hopes and fears, our wonder and confusion, our joys and sorrows, asking God's blessing on our lives and the life of the world.

Let us pray.

For the Church of God, that we may be filled with love, generosity and truth so to transform our communities and our world.

[The congregation takes turns reading the prayers]

Reader: We pray for The Church, for Michael, our Presiding Bishop, for Lawrence our Bishop, for Gerlyn and Daniel our assisting Bishops, and for Karen our Priest-in-Charge and our supply priest, Joseph Cundiff. For the family of Christ throughout the world, remembering particularly all the baptized who minister in this congregation and community, especially; the Vestry. In the prayer cycle of the Diocese of Long Island, we pray for St. Mary's, Shelter Island; St. Anselm's, Shoreham; St. Thomas of Canterbury, Smithtown; the Hispanic Ministry Commission; Iglesia de la Santa Cruz, Brooklyn; St. John's, Southampton and Stony Brook. *(Pause for spoken prayers)*

**People: *May your light guide us and shine through us.***

Reader: For the leaders of our nation, especially Donald, and the leaders of all nations;  
**People: *May your light instill in them compassion and good judgment, and guide them in the ways of justice and peace.***

Reader: For all who hold authority in your Church, that they may shine your light brightly;

**People: *May your Spirit inspire them with creativity, renew their energy, and give them wisdom and love.***

Reader: For blessings on all of our human endeavors, and for the just and proper use of the beauty and abundance of creation; We ask your forgiveness for our destruction of creation; We pray for solutions to climate change.

**People: *May each of us love and serve you in ways that shine your light in our communities and beyond to free your world from poverty, famine and oppression.***

Reader: For the sick in body, mind or spirit, especially those waiting for asylum; those living in Haiti and for those we now name in our hearts;

**People: *May your light bring hope and healing to all who suffer.***

Reader: For all who have died and for those who grieve, especially Martin, and for those we now name in our hearts;

**People: *Dear Lord, We thank you for your servant, Martin Luther King. We honor his courage and wisdom. As we take a day of service on Monday to honor his memory, we ask you to send us a new brave leader who will risk their life for the lives of others. We pray for people who will follow pouring out their lives for the lives of the vulnerable.***

Reader: May your perpetual light shine on all the saints who have gone before us.

**People: *Oh God, in your infinite generosity you have created a world with resources to sustain all of your children with abundance of food, work and recreation. Help us to let our light shine so brightly the whole world can witness your glory. In the name of Jesus, we pray.***

***And may God bless us with enough FOOLISHNESS, To believe that we can make a difference in this world, so that we can do what others claim cannot be done. Amen***

## CONFESSION OF SIN

Celebrant: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

*[kneel as you are able]*

Celebrant and **People:**

***Most merciful God,  
we confess that we have sinned against you  
in thought, word, and deed,  
by what we have done,  
and by what we have left undone.  
We have not loved you with our whole heart;  
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.***

*We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.  
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
have mercy on us and forgive us;  
that we may delight in your will,  
and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.*

*The Priest stands and says:*

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

## THE PEACE

*[stand as you are able]*

*Celebrant:* The peace of the Lord be always with you.

**People:** *And also with you.*

*Then the Ministers and People may greet one another in the name of the Lord.*

## GREAT THANKSGIVING

**Eucharistic Prayer D**

*[The people remain standing.]*

*Celebrant:* The Lord be with you.

**People:** *And also with you.*

*Celebrant:* Lift up your hearts.

**People:** *We lift them to the Lord.*

*Celebrant:* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People:** *It is right to give him thanks and praise.*

It is truly right to glorify you, Father, and to give you thanks; for you alone are God, living and true, dwelling in light inaccessible from before time and for ever.

Fountain of life and source of all goodness, you made all things and fill them with your blessing; you created them to rejoice in the splendor of your radiance.

Countless throngs of angels stand before you to serve you night and day; and, beholding the glory of your presence, they offer you unceasing praise. Joining with them, and giving voice to every creature under heaven, we acclaim you, and glorify your Name, as we say:

Celebrant and **People**: LEVAS 255

***Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,  
heaven and earth are full, full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest. Hosanna in the highest.***

*[The people stand or kneel.]*

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures.

When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation.

Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy. To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new. And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ's death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us,

this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

*Celebrant and People*

***We praise you, we bless you,  
we give thanks to you,  
and we pray to you, Lord our God.***

Lord, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name.

Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to you alone; bring them into the place of eternal joy and light. And grant that we may find our inheritance with the Blessed Virgin Mary, with patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and all the saints who have found favor with you in ages past.

We praise you in union with them and give you glory through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold and glad to pray:

**People and Celebrant**

**Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the kingdom,  
and the power, and the glory,  
for ever and ever. Amen.**

*Celebrant:* Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us .

**People:** *Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia*

*Jesus, Lamb of God: have mercy on us.  
Jesus, bearer of our sins: have mercy on us.  
Jesus, redeemer, redeemer of the world:  
Give us your peace, give us your peace.*

Celebrant: Let us pray.

*Celebrant and People*

*Eternal God, heavenly Father, you have graciously accepted us as living members of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ, and you have fed us with spiritual food in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood. Send us now into the world in peace, and grant us strength and courage to love and serve you with gladness and singleness of heart; through Christ our Lord. Amen.*
