The Property Committee

Walt Hazelton, Property Chair Rod Walters, Cochair

The Property Committee is responsible for maintaining the building, grounds, and equipment owned by the church.

Walt Hazelton, the current chair, keeps very busy with a variety of essential tasks. He supervises our custodian and the various teams that do some of the work of the committee. He negotiates and signs contracts with outside businesses that provide lawn mowing, snow removal, equipment maintenance, painting, insurance, etc. He works with the Council to arrange for the use of our building by outside groups. He arranges for required inspections of our elevator, the boiler, fire extinguishers, and the building. He prepares an annual budget for property expenses and provides research and expertise for proposed capital projects.

There are several teams that help to do the work of the Property Committee. The *Ground Maintenance* Team does cleanup, tree removal and pruning, and special plantings of shrubs. The *Gardening* Team plants and cares for flowers and small shrubs. The *Repair* Team does minor equipment repair, and maintains our building in a variety of ways (painting, plumbing, light bulb replacement, etc. The *Technology* Team purchases, programs and maintains our computers, TVs, projectors, and microphones. The *Security* Team monitors our doors and our security system.

Maintaining the integrity and beauty of our church property requires the help of many hands! If you have an interest or a special talent in any of the areas described above, talk with Walt or Rod about how you can help to maintain our church property. You will find it a rewarding experience.

The Mountain Rise Book Group will meet on Zoom at 7:30 November 20 to discuss **Demon Copperhead: A Novel** by Barbara Kingsolver. In this story a boy born to a teenaged single mother, with no assets beyond his dead father's good looks and copper-colored hair, uses his caustic wit and fierce talent for survival to brave the modern perils of foster care, child labor, derelict schools, athletic success, addiction, disastrous loves, and crushing losses. In his own voice, Demon grapples with his own invisibility in a popular culture where even the superheroes have abandoned rural people in favor of cities. Kingsolver, inspired by Charles Dickens' **David Copperfield**, revisits the impacts of institutional poverty and its damage to children which continue to challenge our society today.

"Pronouns: How to Share, Use, Gather, and Mess Them Up"

What's the best way to ask people for their pronouns without making it awkward? Should I share my pronouns if they're obvious? What do I do when I see two pronouns, like *she/they*? Should I use *they* for everyone whose pronouns I don't know? What should I do when I accidentally mess up someone's pronouns? This workshop answers these questions and much more. Participants will leave this workshop with a strong understanding of why sharing their pronouns is a great ally action, improved odds of correctly addressing people, and more confidence in their ability to respectfully gather pronouns from others.

Jeannie Gainsburg is an award-winning educational trainer and consultant in the field of LGBTQ+ inclusion and effective allyship. Formerly the Education Director at the Out Alliance of Rochester, N.Y., she is the founder of Savvy Ally Action and author of the book, The Savvy Ally: A Guide for Becoming a Skilled LGBTQ+ Advocate. Jeannie has a BA in psychology from Brown University and an MA in social work and social research from Bryn Mawr College. She was under the impression that a citation was the result of driving too fast until January of 2019, when she received one from the New York State Assembly for Distinguished Educational & Human Rights Services for her work in promoting LGBTQ+ rights and inclusion. The following speech was given by Juliet and Dorothy during the September 15 Climate Change March in downtown Rochester. Juliet and Dorothy are members of Rochester Youth Climate Leaders (RYCL). RYCL is an inter-school youth movement voicing concern for the climate and advocating for a sustainable future.

Every day that we stand by and let the fossil fuel industry continue to infiltrate politics, destroy indigenous lands, hold countless people in poverty, pollute our atmosphere, disrupt our oceans, will prevent us from having a livable future. Every day that our leaders and elected officials allow them to continue, it becomes harder to stop them.

People in positions of power have continuously turned a blind eye to the destruction caused by the fossil fuel industry for money and a few more votes.

If we continue on this path, as the youth of today, all we can see is a world where

- · we stand engulfed in the smoke of our burning world
- · our feet are wet because of the rising oceans
- · our lungs are choking on poisoned air
- · our homes are flooded by hurricanes and ravaged by tornadoes.

When that times comes, we'll stand there and wish we were standing here now to choose a future.

A future where...

- · pollinator gardens replace lawns
- · healthy forest ecosystems line the highways
- · charging stations replace gas stations
- · electric cars, bikes, and public transportation fill the streets
- · natural forests, lakes, and oceans are protected
- the air is clean, the water clear, and people live in harmony
- · corporations and governments are held accountable for their actions , no matter how big or rich they are.

We see this future, and we know it's possible, but we keep getting told that it's simply too hard, too complicated, and too expensive. Nevertheless, we are unstoppable and another world is possible.
