Greetings Mountain Rise family,

It has been my honor to be your pastor for nearly two months and will be for two and a half more. I was not looking for a call when I was asked if I was interested in being your bridge pastor. It is interesting how God puts things in front of us and leads us, if we keep our eyes and ears open. I have a call at Kirkhaven and even though I know that my time is coming to a close there, I was not looking for a new call at that time.

We keep hearing that God is our Shepherd and leads us to green pastures, but do we know our Shepherd's voice? The problem is that God talks to us through others, so we need to always listen. Listening is more important than talking (this coming from a preacher!). I do not always listen as I should, but this time I did. However, I did not go blindly into being your bridge pastor. I talked to my wife, other pastors, others that I trust, and did some research on Mountain Rise. Through this I found that doing both calls could work.

During my time with you, I have felt that I have grown as a pastor and will continue to grow. I have gotten to know many of you and you me; because of this I have changed some approaches to how I do things so as to be the pastor you need, for I serve you and not the other way. I have not been a solo pastor in the past in a congregational setting or senior pastor. This I have found to be a wonderful growing experience for me. I have found that the people of Mountain Rise are very knowledgeable, which keeps me on my toes and I pray that I keep growing until my last breath. This for me is living as Christ wants me to. We all are a village, everyone and everything that I/we have contact with is what makes us who I/we are. I am so fortunate to have all of you incorporated into who I am.

Advent is almost upon us, the season during which we prepare for Christ's birth and Christmas. Please read the weekly updates that keep us informed of church needs and programs so that we can plan to be together as a family, preparing and celebrating the birth of our Lord during this busy holiday season.

Church Council

Have you heard? Mountain Rise will be welcoming an Intentional Interim Minister in less than 3 months! Council is so appreciative of the diligent and faithful work of the Intentional Interim Minister Ad Hoc Search Committee and want to thank the members of this committee: Gail McClain, Linda Boesl, and Roger James. Their love of and commitment to Mountain Rise spoke loudly when they presented then candidate Rev. Dr. Kelly Sprinkle at the October Council meeting.

Just prior to receiving word that the Search committee had settled on a candidate, I had finally found a little time to carefully read through the NYUCC emails I had in my inbox since preparing to become Council Chair. I share with you one selection that is especially meaningful at this time from the NYUCC Happenings September Newsletter; it is Associate Conference Minister for Search and Call Rev. Gary Ferner's message:

"A congregation in transition is a lot like a garden at the end of the growing season. The produce has been harvested, and our attention turns to the next growing season (next pastorate).

Gardeners (parishioners) will want to consider what worked well over the last season, and what did not. Was there enough water, and enough nutrients for the garden to produce? What barriers prevented a robust harvest? Weeds? Inattention? Lack of resources? Were the plants in the garden the right ones for the location of the garden? Did we have all the tools necessary to care for the garden?

Sometimes choosing a different variety of a popular garden plant can make all the difference.

What does the garden (congregation) need in order to overwinter (transition)? Tilling (interim work) is always a plus, along with composting (feeding).

And most gardeners look forward to planning for the next growing season. Gardeners that do not look at past growing seasons and the details around the care and feeding of the garden as they relate to the harvest risk having difficult growing seasons in the future, so planning what to plant, how to approach the long growing season, and having the proper resources to meet the challenges ahead will go a long way to ensuring a good harvest.

Sometimes a tried and true gardening technique stops working. Having an open mind to trying other gardening techniques can lead to an even greater harvest.

If you're a gardener (parishioner) at the end of the growing season (in pastoral transition), I hope and pray that this time of reflection and planning leads to a verdant and extravagant garden with an abundant harvest!"

Gail, Linda and Roger, through their steadfast work, have selected an excellent leader to assist Mountain Rise with the interim time that exists after a long-tenured pastor leaves. It is now our turn to put in the hard work needed...and there is much work to be done. Guided by God and the Mountain Rise energy and spirit, we will create our "extravagant garden".

GVA Fall Assembly update

Mike Tiss and Fran Stiles served as Mountain Rise delegates to the Genesee Valley Association of the United Church of Christ's fall meeting on Sunday, October 30th, held at the Spencerport UCC. A feature of this fall's meeting was the opportunity to meet leaders of programs supported by our membership dues in GVA, one of which is Salem Nutrition Center. Mission grants account for almost half of the Association budget.

Members of the Spencerport Church shared their experience in revitalizing their congregation with the help of a UCC consultant. Co-moderators led the business meeting of financial and program reports and provided an opportunity for questions and comments from all participants. The Rev. Marcia Williams, our Interim Conference Minister, shared news of happenings and plans for some changes at the Conference level.

Associations are the basic units in which United Church of Christ congregations have membership and are the body responsible for the licensing and ordination of ministers. Mountain Rise is a member of the Genesee Valley Association. Pastors and lay delegates are voting members, but all interested lay people are welcome to attend.




Perinton Food Shelf Needs
