Book Group to Explore Native American Wisdom

The Mountain Rise Book Group will meet on ZOOM on Tuesday, **January 17** at 7:30 to discuss *Braiding Sweetgrass: Indigenous Wisdom, Scientific Knowledge and the Teaching of Plants* by Robin Wall Kimmerer. Kimmerer is a mother, scientist, professor and an enrolled member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation. She is the distinguished Teaching Professor of Environmental and Forest Biology and director of the Center for Native Peoples and the Environment at the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry.

The book is a series of essays which explore how we can learn about the central importance of the Native American belief that we are custodians of the land. As custodians we need to be aware of our responsibility to live in a way that will help us sustain the health of our planet. Kimmerer introduces readers to new ways of observing the world around them and introduces them both to Native American indigenous wisdom and ways in which it relates to scientific knowledge.
