Bewilderment Book Group's April Selection

The Mountain Rise Book Group will meet on ZOOM at 7:30 on Tuesday April 18 to discuss **Bewilderment: A Novel** by Richard Powers. The book tells the story of Theo, a recently widowed astrophysicist and his nine year old son, Robin. The two forge a deeply supportive bond after the death of Robin's mother.

Robin is a deeply sensitive young man, concerned about the fate of our planet and the universe. He finds it impossible to control his emotions when his own beliefs and concerns are threatened. To stabilize his son's emotions his father enrolls him in an experimental neurofeedback study that trains Robin's thought patterns on the previously recorded patterns of his mother's brain.

Committee for Universal Justice

This is an on-the-ground report about our ministry to immigrants in Phoenix, based at the city's First UCC Church. This is an interesting and diverse congregation with which we worshipped on four Sundays. It is about the same size as Mountain Rise and is composed of all races, ages and sexual orientations. The church has a paid house band with a couple of soloists featuring all gospel music.

The congregation supports an immigration welcome center (International Rescue Mission). Busloads of immigrants come in every day and receive medical checkups, showers, legal help, clothing and food. First Church cares for upwards of 300 people each weekend while other entities staff the mission on weekdays. Sharon and I sorted clothing on Saturday mornings. The immigrants served at the mission all have sponsoring families somewhere in the US.

First Church is a wonderful, caring, and committed Christian community and is very deserving of the financial help we are providing. Our parting was emotional.

A record number of guests received lunch and a choice of clothing and household items at the Salem Nutrition Center on March 27th. Therefore, donations are requested for distribution on April 24th.

Every item of men's clothing was taken! But piles of women's pants remained without a home. So, all sizes of men's clothing are needed, especially jeans, hoodies, sneakers, boots, jackets, new and used socks. Women's jeans, practical shoes and boots, socks, bras and accessories are welcome, as well as extra large and extra small sizes of practical clothing. Raincoats and waterproof jackets were requested by men and women.

Guests also need sheets, blankets, pillows, linens, and basic household items. No glass or breakable items, please.

Donations are collected in the area outside the store room opposite the elevator on the middle level of the church. Receipts are available in the office.

Large household items can be donated to Saints' Place, which supplies refugees who are resettling here.

The Caring Connections committee, along with Fellowship, Service & Advocacy, and Communications committee chairs, invite you and all interested members of Fairport and surrounding communities to attend a three-part educational series at Mountain Rise presented by the Alzheimer's Association. The three dates are April 13th, 20th, and 27th. The time is 7:00-8:00 P.M.

The series topics are: "10 Warning Signs of Alzheimer's," "Understanding Alzheimers and Dementia," and "Effective Communication Strategies." If enough interest is shown, other educational sessions could follow as well as a monthly support group for caregivers.

Church Outside the Doors of the Church

The women of Viviendo en Amor y Fe have been meeting in the homes of neighbors to befriend and pray with them. Pastor Arely shares that many women who are experiencing loneliness and isolation in their homes have warmed to the kindness of the women and are beginning to form friendships with one another. The women recently planned a day-long retreat and thirty women, many of them with no church connection, came!



Real love sometimes looks like tutoring! This boy is the son of one of the women who has begun coming to church services through the neighborhood visits. His reading and writing are below his grade level. A woman from the church spends time with him helping him learn these basic life skills.



Mountain Rise has two updated assisted listening opportunities. One is a loop system to connect with individual hearing aids, the second is new headsets (located on the bench outside the sanctuary).


