

On Friday, February 23, 2024, about 30 New Horizoners found their way (despite somewhat sketchy directions) to the Southern Museum of Flight. The museum is in a residential neighborhood adjacent to the Birmingham-Shuttlesworth International Airport.

Our trip had been suggested by a fall term speaker, Randy Law, a curator at the museum, who told us about an upcoming exhibit –

Leonardo to the Wright Brothers – which he offered to host. Unfortunately, Randy was ill, but his stand-in. Charle Phillips, was a real treat.

Charlie had spent a lifetime in aviation and is a born storyteller. His down-home manner and comprehensive knowledge had everyone enthralled. And he quickly connected with the pilots in our group as when he spoke of the museum hopefully acquiring a tanker which both he and Jim Schmidt had flown. Or in pointing out a single seater on display in which both he and Keith Tenney had learned to fly.

Charlie led our group through the Leonardo exhibit and the history of aviation leading up to powered flight by humans. Then he continued with the museum's many other exhibits. It turns out that the museum has the only full scale models of both the Wright Brothers' Kitty Hawk Flyer and Charles Lindbergh's Spirit of St. Louis. The originals are in the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum. Even after Charlie left us, our group was free to wander and wonder at the museum's many outstanding exhibits.
