



The following are the apprenticeship tax credits for employers in AL, AR, LA, MD, SC, TN, VA and WV

Alabama, \$1,250 per apprentice, up to 10:

Arkansas, 10% of wages earned by a youth apprentice, up to \$2,000 per apprentice:
