MASONIC EDUCATION

THE MASONIC CALENDER

Masons of the York and French Rites (i.e., Masons of England, Scotland, Ireland, France, Germany, and America) date from the creation of the world; calling it Anno Lucis, which is abbreviated A. L. signifying "in the Year of Light!" Thus, 1801 is A.L. 5801. This has a symbolic reference to the Light of Masonry.

In the Scottish Rite, (now known as the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite), the Era also begins from the date of the Creation; but Masons of that Rite, using the Jewish chronology, would call the year 1801, A. M. or Anno Mundi (in the year of the world), 5541. Sometimes the initials A.H. are used, signifying Anno Hebraico, or "in the Hebrew Year!" They have also adopted the Hebrew months, therefore the year ends with them on the 16th of September, and the new year begins on the 17th of the same month, which is the first of Tisri. The A. and P Rite uses the Egyptian Calendar and the Era 00000,000 to denote an indefinite period of vast extent.

In the York Rite, the year begins on the 1st of January; but in the French Rite it begins on the 1st of March, and instead of the months receiving their usual names they are designated numerically, as first, second, &c. In a French Masonic document the 1st of January, 1801, would thus be called the first day of the eleventh Masonic month, Anno Lucis, 5801. The French sometimes use L'an de la V. L, Vraie Lumdre, Signifying "Year of True Light!"

Royal Arch Masons date from the commencement of the Second Temple, which was 530 years before the Christian Era; hence A.D. 1801 would be represented by Anno Inventionis (A.. INV'), 2331 in Capitular Freemasonry.

Knights Templar have also their mode of chronology, taking their year one from the organisation of the Order, A.D. 1118; so that Anno Ordinis would be A.O. 683, instead of A.D. 1801. https://www.brad.ac.uk/webofhiram/?section=lectures_craft&page=Calender.html

Mr. Shroeder, "Brother John Shroeder, Jr" to some, was very active in Free Masonry. He was Past Master at Elmer Timberman Lodge No. 54 and Past District Deputy Grand Master in Masonic District 1B. He had many memberships in the fraternity and among his significant honors were that of being coronated a 33 degree Scottish Rite Mason, Inspector General Honorary, and 33 degree York Rite Mason, having received the Knight Templar Cross of Honor.

He spent many hours coaching little league sports, sharing his passion for the outdoors, singing songs on family road trips, and playing jacks. He loved his community, spending 20+ years on the Board of Directors for his neighborhood Swim and Racquet Club, volunteering at polling locations, and lending a hand to neighbors in need. He was an avid gardener and, to anyone who knew him, a great storyteller. Most of all, he was a loving father, grandfather, and great-grandfather who passed on his love of life to us all. He knew no stranger.

Survivors include his four children, John Shroeder (Kathleen) of Springfield, Thomas Shroeder (Tanya) of Salt lake city, Kathryn Rooney (John) and Mark Shroeder (Leanne) of Vienna; his grandchildren Shane (April), Allison (Derek), Sadie, Jordan, Ben, John Luke, and Callie, and three great grandchildren, Harper Marjorie, Maybelle, Dean.

He was born on 5/22/1938; Initiated on 9/28/1970; Passed on 5/6/1970; and, Raised on 6/12/1989, making him a 49-year Mason. WB Bo was a very valuable member of the Lodge and member of Kena Shrine. His presence will be missed. Lady Rose Ann has asked for a Masonic service on the occasion of his memorial service. The service is tentatively planned later in May, which is WB Bo’s birth month. We have offered the use of the Lodge for the service if COVID restrictions have been lifted by then. His obituary follows:

“Dallas Lee Lunceford, 82, retired owner/operator of Beltway Mobil/Sunoco in Annandale, VA, died February 2, 2021 from complications of dementia. A resident of Maurertown, Va., Lunceford was born May 22, 1938 in Alexandria, Va., and spent most of his adult life in Annandale outside of Washington, D.C. He retired to the Shenandoah Valley in 2015 to ride around on his tractor mowing grass and enjoy a slower paced mountain and river life.

Lunceford dropped out of secondary school before graduation, and worked at Eastern Airlines before moving from Alexandria in 1968 to open the Beltway Mobil service station. Throughout the next 40 years, “Bo” Lunceford’s service station was a fixture in town, providing auto repair, gas, towing and other services, as well as support for the

community by sponsoring little league teams, driving floats for school/town parades, and supporting local charities.

Lunceford was a past-Master of Elmer Timberman Masonic Lodge No. 54 in Annandale, Va., and was active in numerous related masonic organizations including the Kena Shriners. He was a member of both the Antique Car Club and Motor Corps, participating in related competitions nationwide, and winning trophies for skill-riding Harley Davidson Ultra's as part of the Parade and Precision Drill team. He also won car show awards for various restored antique cars, including his beloved 1951 Lincoln Continental. He was a member of the Loyal Order of Moose Lodge #575, Woodstock, Va.

Lunceford not only enjoyed competing with his motorcycles, he took numerous cross-country bike trips with friends to Harley-enthusiast gatherings in Sturgis, SD, as well as a once-in-a-lifetime drive through some of the nation's most beautiful landscapes in a trip from Virginia to Alaska and back. He was an avid fisherman who enjoyed catching them more than eating them.

Lunceford was married twice, first to Joyace Lea (Hurley) Lunceford, who passed from a ruptured brain aneurysm, then to RoseAnn (Brown) Lunceford.

Lunceford is survived by his wife of 55+ years, RoseAnn, his sons Stephen (Marianne) and Scott, and his grandchildren Allie and Chris. He is also survived by his sister, Janet Simmons of Springfield, Va., as well as 17 nieces and nephews.
