STAR Advocates provide crisis response, advocacy and support for survivors of sexual violence through one-on-one personal support sessions, medical and court accompaniment, referrals, long term services, and case management.

Standing as the core of our services, the STAR Crisis Line is free, confidential, and available 24/7. It's often the first lifeline for sexual assault survivors seeking help.

During business hours, our staff members answer every call, while in the evenings, on weekends, and during holidays, our dedicated volunteer responders step in.

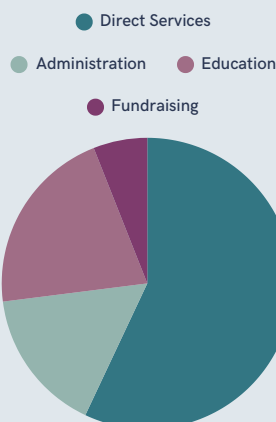
