Why Is The Delta Chapter Important To Me?

The Delta Chapter is very dear to my heart. The house was, and remains, a home for each of us for many different reasons. I would like to share with you some of mine.

s a freshman, I had no idea that I would be joining a fraternity—or any idea what one truly was. An upperclassman named John Zdebski stopped by the dorm room that I shared with Robert Strawderman '88. He told us that his roommates (Bill Ludwig, '86 and Eddie LaPerche '86) had also lived in Mettler 115 as freshmen and had together decided to pledge the fraternity. Rob and I attended a few events during rush and surprisingly were given a bid to join. We weren't quite certain that this was something we wanted to do in addition to getting accustomed to the new life at college. Our decision not to accept the bid was not a question of Zeta Psi being the right house. What fraternity on campus had (or still does have) a nicer house, the best brothers, or, as I would learn, the best parties? During rush some brothers discovered that I played soccer so they "unofficially" brought me into the fold—or should I say field—by joining them on their Keller Cup team. From my first game I was sold on the Delta Chapter. In the spring semester,

when I told my mother that I was pledging a fraternity named Zeta Psi, she told me, for the first time, that her father was a Zete from Yale, class of 1914. This confirmed that I was in good company.

The house has meant many things to me as an undergraduate as well as an alumnus. As an undergraduate, it has been a source of pride, a symbol of status among my peers, and a place to socialize, have fun, meet women, and share good and meaningful conversations. Fire Doors, Sprinkler System At House Needed To Meet State Regulations For Fraternities

here have been many improvements at the Delta Chapter of Zeta Psi house during the past summer and fall semester. The Delta Chapter, in accordance with New Jersey state law for dormitories and fraternity houses, has installed new magnetic fire doors. This step was taken to meet the 2004 deadline established by the state of New Jersey.

Our next major renovation project is the installation of fire suppression sprinklers throughout the house. The state mandated this project following the tragic Seton Hall fire. Targeted completion time is September 2002. During the installation various parts of the house will have to be torn apart to accommodate the necessary fixtures. We are working with the system de-

signers to maintain the esthetics of the house. With these additions, the Zete house will be among the safest on campus.

Among other improvements this summer, the alumni of Delta Chapter funded the reconstruction of the Wayside room on the third floor. The room has been furnished by its tenants and has become even more desirable by the brothers of the house. Other renovations planned for the near future include the renovation of the deteriorated pillars and the reconstruction of the Heaven's Gate and Farside.
