Brother Carl Burns '64, Honored by Loyal Sons of Rutgers



In April 2012, Brother Carl Burns '64 was honored by Rutgers University and inducted into the Loyal Sons of Rutgers. This award is one of the most prestigious honors the university gives, and it was given in recognition of Brother Burns's many and ongoing contributions to the class of 1964 and the university.

Brother Burns got his start at the Delta Chapter when he pledged in the spring of 1961. He later served as pledge master, Alpha Phi, and Phi. His Delta initiation name, Omega Phi, remains dear to his heart to this day.

After graduation, Brother Burns served in the United States Army and was deployed to Vietnam. He held the rank of captain and was a decorated Huey helicopter pilot. Since then, he has been an active participant in the class of '64 Reunion committee and the Rutgers Alumni Association. Carl is involved with the Rutgers Oral History Archives, especially its extension into the Vietnam era. He is a guest lecturer for the history department and greatly enjoys interacting with the students. Carl is also vice president for membership development at the Rutgers Living History Society.


Brother Burns facilitates a counseling group at


the Graduate School of Applied Psychology and the Office of Student Veterans Services to help support other veterans. He is the author of the book Centaurs in Vietnam: Untold Stories of the First Year.

Despite the time spent serving his country and the university, Carl has made time for his beloved Delta Chapter, being active on the alumni board for more than 15 years. In 2001, he led the capital campaign and has served as president, vice president, and trustee of the alumni board. He is well-known among the actives due to the many hours he spends at the house talking to brothers about Zeta Psi's past, present, and future.

Brother Burns has many fond memories of his active years at the Delta Chapter including: branding; bonding with brothers over songs at the bar and in the cold dorm; building Homecoming floats; dressing up in jacket and tie for football games; thumper and whales tales; and making memories with girls, Cliff the bartender at Corner Tavern, Mrs. Badgely (the house mother); hearing alumni from the '50s talk about how great their time was; and Brothers Dunc Matthews '51, Bob Horn '54, and Dave Beakley '51.

He famously stated that the two most challenging, but rewarding, jobs he's had in life were chapter Phi and second lieutenant in the Army. Congratulations to Brother Burns on this distinguished award!

Message from the Alumni Board President


The Delta Chapter is back—sweet words! First off, snaps to everyone who worked so hard to make this happen, including our entire alumni board and (then) active Phi Henry Coslow '12. It's been a difficult climb back to the top, but we made it.

On November 4, 2011, Zeta Psi International Headquarters Representative Dane Rude, new Alumni Trustee Dale Madan '07, and I as-

sisted in the initiation of 40 brothers, of which 17 were from the fall 2011 pledge class. The initiation marked the end of an unfortunate period when the charter was temporarily suspended, and the beginning of a new period of cooperation and respect at the Delta Chapter.

On January 1, 2012, I took over as alumni Phi. As most of you know, I started working at the house in 1997. This year, I will finish my 30th semester at Zeta Psi. I have seen a lot of things good and bad, but it has been a very positive experience so far. I have seen many brothers come and go, and thanks to Facebook, I manage to stay in touch with a lot of them including Shane Bornstein '01 (who presided over my initiation) and Mike Zindell '98 (who was active Phi when I started).

During the past few years, many of you have seen the renovations that have been completed such as new floors, remodeled rooms, and new boilers in the basement and third floor. This summer, we intend to replace about 14 windows including those in the main bathroom and ladies bathroom. During spring break, we replaced the French doors in the Blue Room, and repaired and replaced the rear fire escape. The fire escape alone cost \$8,000.



Alumni Board Members Tom Deamus '06 and Dale Madan '07, worked with the active brothers to revamp the pledge program and institute some changes to ensure safety and security. An off-duty police officer will now be present at all parties—a practice we should have adopted years ago. The presence of a police officer at parties will significantly reduce the problems we have

encountered in the past including fights, party crashers, and other safety risks. Of course, the officers do not work for free, and the cost of providing this service is significant.

I mention all of this because I have a simple request for every brother who has been initiated since I started working at the Delta in 1997. I understand that money is tight right now, but please recall the good times you shared at the house and make a financial donation to the chapter. Even a small donation will help us provide a safe but fun environment where young men can grow and mature. To the brothers who have donated in the past, thank you, and please continue to give.

I was blessed to become a brother in 2000, and it was one of the best days of my life. I now ask everyone for their support.

Seton Hall, Cornell, and the Delta Chapters.



Facilities Report: Summer 2012 Renovation Plans

This spring, we had a major emergency repair when part of the rear fire escape broke due to rust. It had to be replaced

immediately and the work has been completed.

We continue to make significant renovations every semester. The bar and basement area is almost complete, thanks to a generous donation from Alumni Brother Jim Terlizzi '86. The old "apartment" is being converted into a brothers' lounge with a flat-screen TV. The crumbling stone wall in the bar has been sealed, and beautifully stained wood paneling has been installed, giving the bar a truly "classy" look.

This summer, we hope to continue our room remodeling

and completely renovate at least two rooms. The old French doors in the front of the house have been replaced, and the new ones look



fantastic. A new arch window in the bum room has been installed, reducing drafts and saving heat. Also this summer, we would

like to replace the second-floor windows in the front of the house, as well as the bathroom windows. These will likely cost \$500 each. The dining-room floor needs to be replaced as well, and that is expected to cost about \$11,000.


