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Description: Diplomatic Concepts

It is to this end the student will receive a comprehensive understanding of the following subsections: Statements (5.5 credits), Keys of the Kingdom (5.5 credits), Succession of the Kingdom (5.5 credits) and Language and Terminology (5.5 credits). Each subsection will require the student to learn the kingdom of God through verifiable documentation from the scriptures as the fundamental and developmental official announcements, not according to their opinions. This section of the Governmental Structure of the Kingdom is essential for building assurance and confidence in the kingdom of God relative to what the word of God when communicating the composition orally or in writing. The ideals of the kingdom of God will be expressed emphatically as the decreed by God.

Constitution of the Kingdom is the second section of the four sections of cumulative courses on the Governmental Structure of the Kingdom. Constitution of the Kingdom is designed to reveal the established precedence of the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth as the Kingdom of God. The Constitution gives us the design structure (architecture) of the Kingdom of God. It is to this end the student will receive a comprehensive understanding of the following course subsections: Precreation History of the Kingdom (5.5 credits), Governing Body (5.5 credits), Division of Powers (5.5 credits) and Territorial Boundaries (5.5 credits). Each subsection will require the student to learn the kingdom of God through verifiable documentation from the scriptures as the fundamental and developmental official announcements, not according to their opinions. This section of the Governmental Structure of the Kingdom is essential for building assurance and confidence in the kingdom of God relative to what the word of God when communicating the composition orally or in writing. The ideals of the kingdom of God will be expressed emphatically as the decreed by God.

Construction of the Kingdom is the third section of the four sections of cumulative courses on the Governmental Structure of the Kingdom. Construction of the Kingdom is designed to reveal how the Kingdom of Heaven is developed on Earth as the Kingdom of God. Construction of the Kingdom gives us the design structure

(architecture) and development (establishment) of the Kingdom of God. It is to this end the student will receive a comprehensive understanding of the following course subsections: Phases of Kingdom Development (5.5 credits), Stages of Kingdom Development (5.5 credits), Transactions of Kingdom Development (5.5 credits) and Kingdom Development Convergence (5.5 credits). Each subsection will require the student to learn the kingdom of God through how the scriptures reveal models for manifesting and operating the kingdom of God. This section of the Governmental Structure of the Kingdom is essential for designing modalities for applications of prevention, intervention and sustainability of local, regional and international projects. The concepts of the kingdom of God will be implemented from the decreed word of God.

Legislation (Culture) of the Kingdom is the fourth and final section of the four sections of cumulative courses on the Governmental Structure of the Kingdom. Legislation of the Kingdom is designed to establish policy for those who participate in entering, developing and representing the kingdom of God on earth. This volume of course study will reveal what is the culture for which the society will take shape. It is to this end the student will receive a comprehensive understanding of the following course subsections: Dual Presence: Prayer (credits 5.5), Under God's Authority (5.5 credits), Doorway into the Kingdom (5.5) and Life in the Kingdom (5.5 credits). Each subsection will require the student to learn the importance of practicing the previous studies of Governmental Structure of the Kingdom on a daily and repeated basis until it becomes a way of life. This section of help the student understand what to focus on as he/she become a partaker of the studies of the Kingdom of God. This is considered the section where the student practices the concepts as a lifestyle.
