GOVERNMENTAL STRUCTURE For Living A Kingdom Life

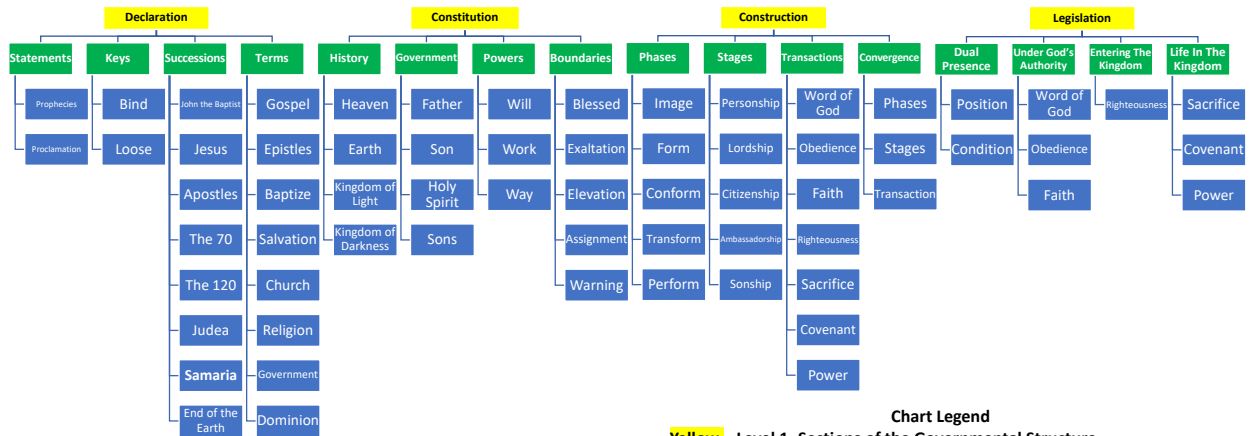


Chart Legend

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Declaration For Living A Kingdom Life

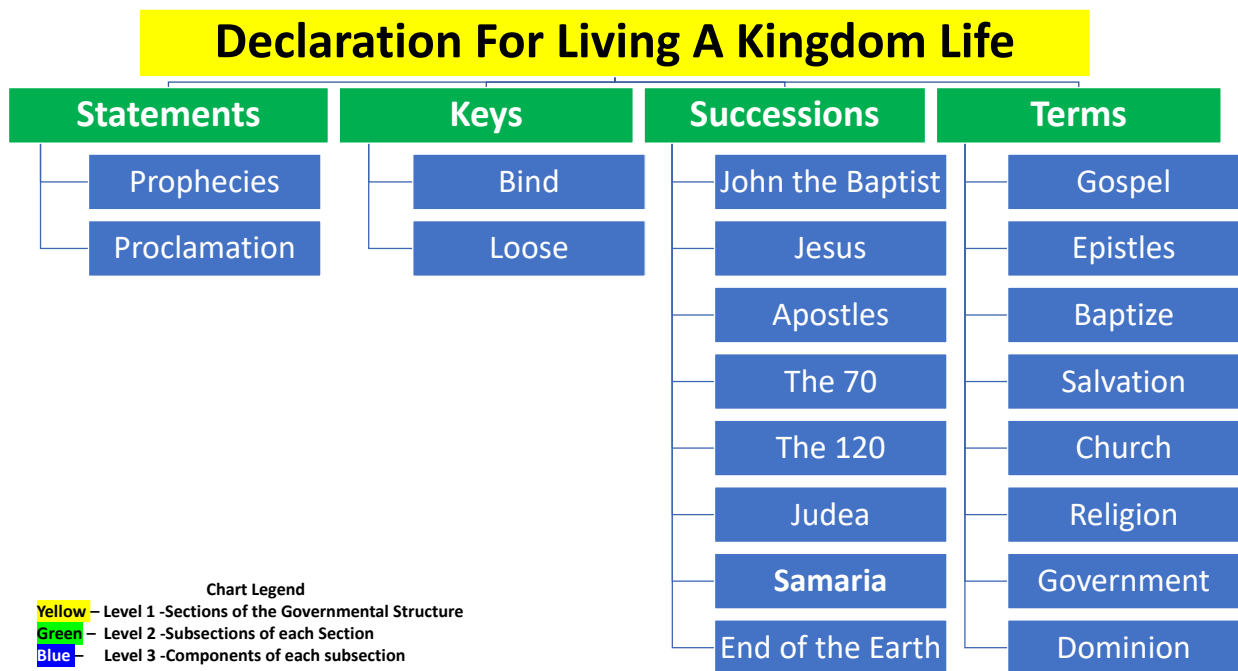
I. Declaration

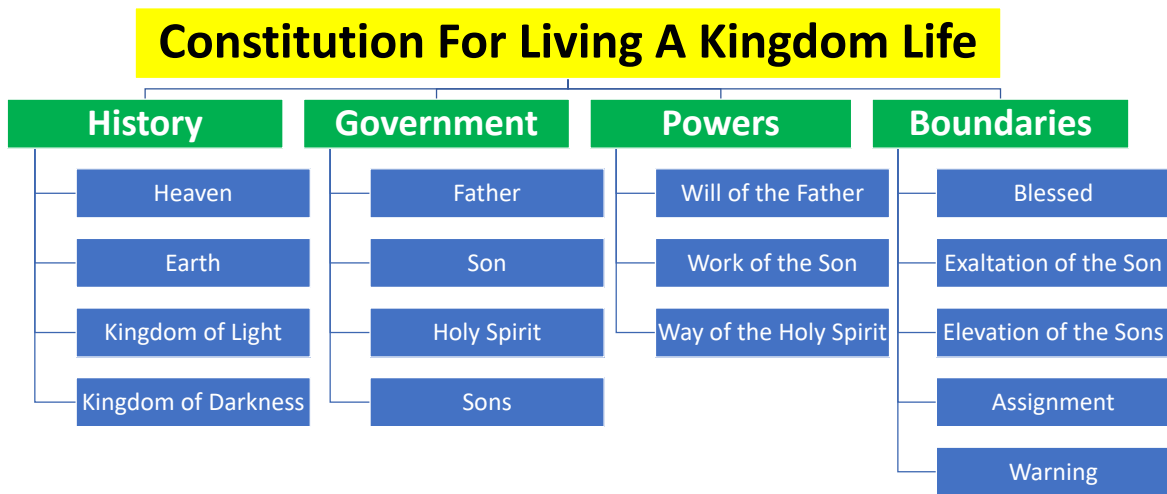

III. Construction

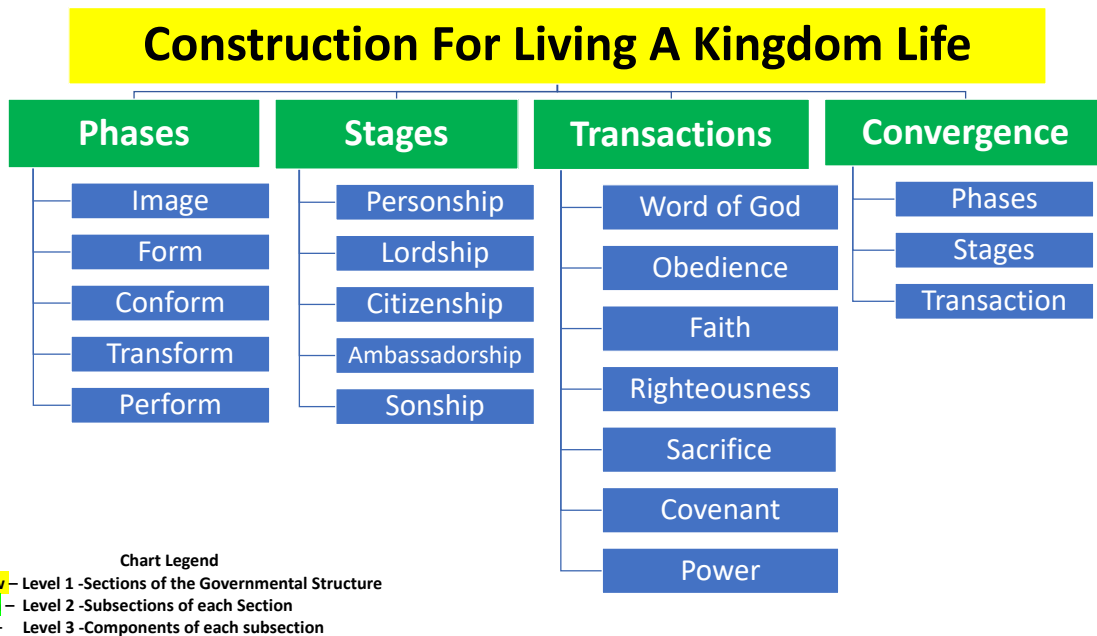

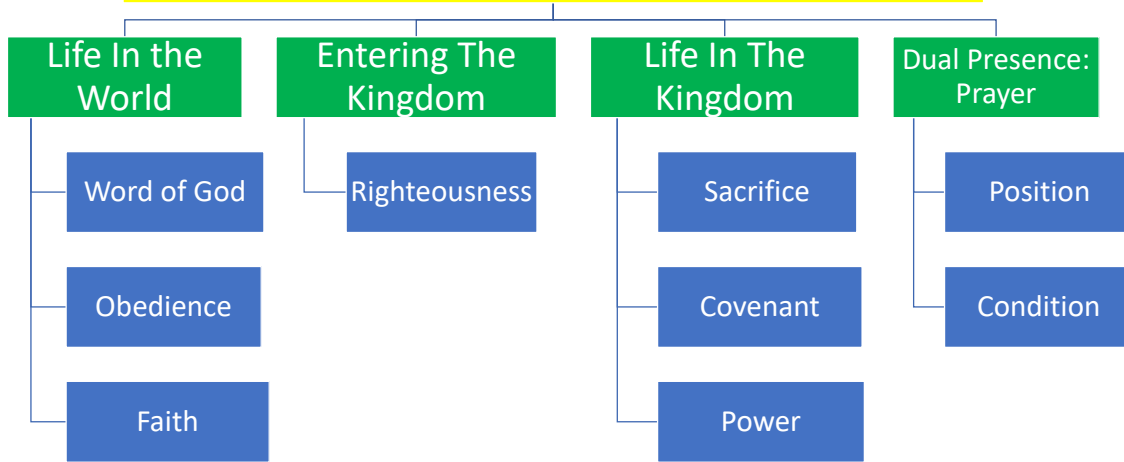


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
