

Willow Creek Restoration on Forest Service and Private Lands

Forest Service Portion of the Willow Creek Restoration

- The \$327,00 funding for the District contribution was obtained from the Water Trust Board.
- Improvement of fish and riparian habitat in and along the Meadow Reach of Willow Creek on Forest Service land in Catron County, New Mexico including willow plantings, bank sloping, cross vein weirs, channel realignment, brush revetment, and J-hook vanes.
- Partners included U.S. Forest Service, New Mexico Game and Fish Department, Trout Unlimited and San Francisco Soil & Water Conservation District.
- Natural Channel Design provided the watershed restoration plan funded by the New Mexico Environment Department.















Private Land Portion of the Willow Creek Restoration

- The \$986,430 funding was obtained from a New Mexico Environment Department Watershed Improvement Grant.
- Improvement of fish and riparian habitat in and along the Private Lands Reach of Willow Creek in Catron County, New Mexico including willow plantings, bank sloping, cross vein weirs, channel realignment, brush revetment, and J-hook vanes.
- Partners included U.S. Forest Service and San Francisco Soil & Water Conservation District.
- Natural Channel Design provided the watershed restoration plan funded by the New Mexico Environment Department and contracting the restoration work.
