Financial Report



Holy Comforter ended the first quarter with a surplus of \$20,661. Pledged giving was right on budget, and unpledged gifts were well above budget, in part due to the previously reported Vestry challenge gift. Investment income was below budget due to the timing of certain payments, but we fully expect that category to meet budget for the full year.

Expenditures were \$20,337 below budget; of course, that variance exists because we are not currently paying a rector. The surplus we are building will help us to offer our new rector what we hope will be a competitive compensation package. Once the position is filled, any surplus will be considerably smaller than what we have experienced recently.

We have a handful of maintenance and repair items pending, but at this point funding appears to be available to cover our known issues.

Thanks to the generosity of the parish, the Episcopal Church of the Holy Comforter endowment is currently just over \$600,000. The Endowment BOARD is very pleased to report the following distribution amounts available.

Distributions from the general endowment are restricted to mission and outreach, specific capital needs, and other purposes that support the mission and goals of the church.

The Endowment BOARD is currently accepting proposals from the Vestry, parishioners, and parish committees/groups for the funds to be distributed this year. Distributions will typically range from \$500 to \$5,000. The application form is available from the parish administrator or from the Endowment Fund website. The due date for applications is May 31, 2024.

PROGRAM UPDATES FROM THE NEWLIN PARTNERSHIP

AUGUSTINE LITERACY PROJECT (ALP)

Four first grade teachers, 19 first graders and 18 tutors, plus the Newlin Literacy Coach, have worked on improving student reading skills since mid-October. From the following comments, you can see that all participants think this has been a good year for reading progress. Just look at the comments:

STUDENT COMMENTS:

- *"I liked reading the book and I got better on my sounds. Handwriting was hard."*
- *"My favorite part is getting to read more."
• "I like that I'm learning to read."*
- *"Tutoring is good, and I have learned something."
• "I love you."*



1ST GRADE TEACHER COMMENTS:

- *"All of my students in the program love going with their tutors. I have seen great improvement in reading skills."*
- *"My tutors are very respectful of their time. ...which allows instruction to run smoothly. They are positive and loving. Students are growing and looking forward to their time with their tutor."*
- *"It helps with extra assistance with my students that still need basic literacy skills. My students enjoy seeing their tutor and spending time with them. Other students want a chance to work with them."
• "I Love my tutors. They are wonderful."*



TUTOR COMMENTS:

- *"My student worked very hard during each lesson and gave it a thumbs up most days."*
- *"It gives you a real high if the student says, 'I got it' after you have been trying to explain a new concept."*
- *"I like that my student makes every day a new experience."*
 - *"It is a privilege to serve as a literacy tutor and gratifying to see how much the school values and supports our program, making us partners in this critical endeavor."*
 - *"What fascinated me this year was how my relationship with my student evolved. Once our bond was finally made and she became more trusting and confident, she really began to make progress. I have found no other work that fills me with such joy."*
 - *"The most deeply moving, challenging and wonderful experience I have had in years!"*

The Newlin Partnership's newest outreach to Newlin Elementary, The Lucky Listeners program, is so fortunate to have eight active volunteers. We wanted to introduce them to the Holy Comforter Community. These volunteers have been meeting with second

graders once a week for 30 minutes (one volunteer visits two times a week) since late January. The teachers are thrilled to have this resource and give the program very positive reviews. Though the task is pretty simple (listening to a cute second grader read and helping him or her with comprehension) the real gift is showing up for these kids. Our volunteers have been very committed, while still having flexibility if they need to have planned absences.

COMFORTER HOUSE NEWS

Exciting updates are underway at Comforter House! We recently announced the arrival of Alamance County Community Services Agency (ACCSA), a 501(c)3 that supports the community in the areas of affordable housing, employment, education, and food and nutrition services. Building on that momentum, we are thrilled to announce a new partnership with Benevolence Farm, an organization that supports women as they transition home from prison and jail. This collaboration will provide after-school care for the children of women in their program, enriching the lives of families in need. Both programs will be housed in a portion of the Comforter House building. To fund the necessary building modifications, we are utilizing leftover monies from the playschool fund, as we no longer operate a playschool. The Vestry has determined that this allocation is the best use for the unused funds, as it directly benefits children in our community. Please note that these funds were initially designated for playschool operations, not scholarship gifts. Thank you for your continued support as we strive to serve our community in meaningful ways.
