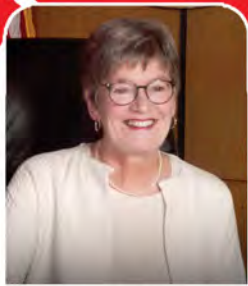

Expecting the Impossible

I'm writing this mid-way through Holy Week, knowing you will be reading it early in Eastertide. Easter is the 50-day season of the year, from the Great Vigil through the day of Pentecost, when the church especially remembers that Jesus Christ's resurrection is the foundation of our faith. This is the season when we proclaim, "Alleluia! Christ is risen! The Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia!"

With those words, Christians remind ourselves and each other that, as the apostle Paul wrote to his siblings in faith in Corinth, "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died" (1 Corinthians 15:19-26; from the Easter Sunday readings).

In Jesus Christ, God has vanquished death. This doesn't only mean that you and I will live again with God and other people after our earthly life has ended. It also means that what look like dead ends in this life can, in fact, open into new pathways, by God's grace.

My faith in the resurrection is what allows me to pray for peace and justice at home and abroad, even though evidence of human cruelty and our propensity to violence piles up every day.

My faith in the resurrection is what spurs me to pray for people in power, at home and abroad, with whose policies and practices I disagree. I pray for them to know God loves them, and for God to guide them. And when I engage in civic action, writing and calling my representatives, attending vigils and rallies, giving money to non-profit

organizations, I ask for God's help to do so in a prayerful spirit, with the goal that God's love be revealed more fully in the world.

My faith in the resurrection reminds me to engage in prayerful self-examination, too, noticing the (many) ways I fall short of Jesus' call to love God and my neighbors, and asking God's help to live more faithfully. Since God called Jesus out of the tomb, God can call me, too, into new beginnings.

It's understandable to be frightened in the face of uncertainty. It's understandable to be angry in the face of cruelty. It's natural to grieve in the wake of death, whether the death is of a person, a fondly-held illusion, or a dearly-loved principle.

But our faith proclaims that fear, anger, and grief are not the end of our story. Death is not the end of our story. God is always creating new life, always finding new ways to free God's beloved children from all forms of bondage. God continues to do impossibly good things for the benefit of the world God so loves. And Easter reminds you and me to expect the impossible, to seek it out, and to help uncover it.

FROM THE DESK OF OUR SENIOR WARDEN

We have recently been blessed with several generous and unexpected gifts, as Sid notes elsewhere in this newsletter. These gifts are an outpouring of support that reflects the deep affection so many of you have for Holy Comforter, and they arrive at a moment when our vestry is actively engaged in discerning our future, with a strong focus on stewardship. Beginning with dedicated time in our May and June meetings, we are entering a strategic planning phase to help us prioritize projects and programs with care, purpose, and clarity.

We've heard excitement around many worthy endeavors: improving security and sound systems, supporting youth and children's ministries, enhancing the beauty and accessibility of the Grove, and deepening ministry and outreach within the church and broader communities. Each reflects the vibrant life of this parish and our shared desire to grow and serve. At the heart of this discernment is stewardship—not just as financial giving, but as a broad commitment to nurturing our church home, honoring our history, and preparing wisely for what's next.

As The Episcopal Church reminds us, stewardship is about living from a perspective of abundance. It's about time, talents, relationships, and shared responsibility. The vestry's focus on stewardship is a commitment to sustainable growth, faithful service, and thoughtful planning. We look forward to sharing more in the months ahead—and to listening, learning, and discerning with all of you.

Financial Report AS OF 3/31/25

For March, we report revenues of \$34,445, of which \$30,104 came from parishioner pledges. Disbursements were \$45,652, resulting in a deficit of \$11,207 for the month. The accumulated deficit for the year to date is \$8,170.

I have wrestled with how to best present our financial situation since I began writing these updates. The numbers in the paragraph above do not read very well, but they don't really give a clear picture of our current financial situation. We have received prepaid pledges of over \$73,000 that have not been recorded as income yet; this is because of our practice of pro rating prepaids over twelve months. Also, March disbursements included several larger, nonrecurring expenses, including HVAC repairs, elevator repairs, replacing sanctuary light bulbs (those very high ones), and installation of a dedicated outlet for our new copier. Thus, the month of March is not necessarily representative of what we expect for the full year.

At month end we held \$245,000 in interest bearing accounts; this total is above and beyond the cash in our operating account. Our reserve accounts are funded at 116.97%. So we currently enjoy a comfortable financial position. We have recently received two very generous gifts, one of which arrived after March 31 and is not included in this month's totals. One gift is from a current parishioner who wishes to remain anonymous, and the other was part of the final distribution of assets from the estates of Thomas and Jean Hogen. The Hogens were residents of Twin Lakes, having moved there in retirement.

The Vestry will deliberate on how to best use these magnificent gifts in ways that honor our benefactors and best serve Holy Comforter. You will be hearing more in the months ahead. It's nice to be able to write a positive financial report; there have been times in the recent past when things were not quite so upbeat. The arrival of Rhonda Lee has certainly contributed to our recent successes, but momentum was building even before her arrival. We are grateful and pray for continuing progress.

We recognize there are some emerging signs of a slowing economy. We don't pretend to know what is ahead, or how we might be affected, but we will be watching closely. The current Vestry is a thoughtful and cautious group, committed to being good stewards of the resources entrusted to us.

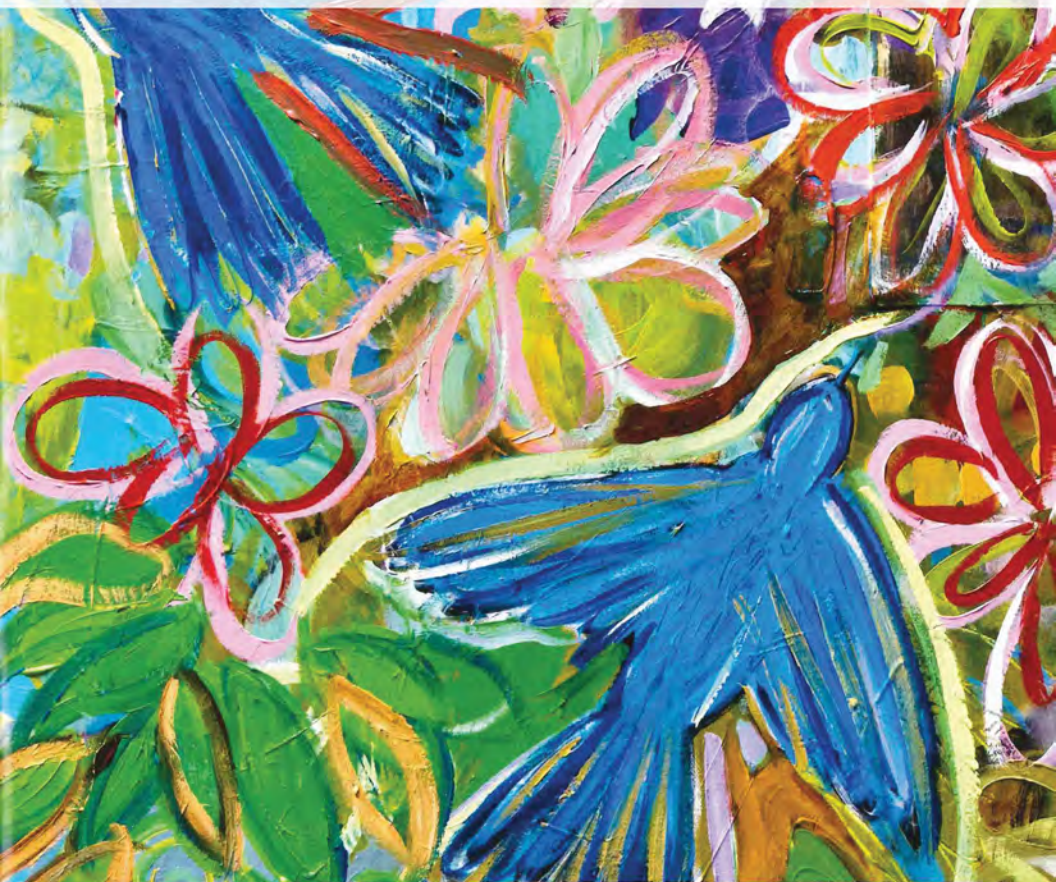

Newlin Partnership News Update



Volunteers welcomed into ESL/ML classes this spring

For 13 years the Newlin Partnership has been evolving. From the beginning the main focus has been on young readers learning the important phonics of reading. Hundreds of Newlin Elementary students have benefited greatly from the active involvement of those who volunteer as tutors and those who volunteer as listeners, encouraging the children to practice their new skills and become better readers.

34% of Newlin students are learning to read, write and speak in a second language - English. After initial planning last fall, two English as a Second Language (ESL)/Multilingual (ML) teachers, Ms. Taylor and Ms. Jones, welcomed two Newlin Partnership volunteers into their multi-lingual classrooms this March to observe how their students learn to read, write and speak English.

Children differ in how they learn. The volunteers also sought to increase their understanding of the variety of elements which impact student learning in an English-speaking environment.
