



# stephen ministry

For those who are new to the concept presented by Stephen Ministry, the following is presented from the national office:

"Stephen Ministry, founded in 1975 in St. Louis, Missouri, by clinical psychologist, pastor, and author Rev. Kenneth C. Haugk, consists of one-to-one care to "care receivers" who are facing some crisis in life, such as illness, death of a loved one, divorce, relocation, or financial setback. The ministry has grown, with more than 600,000 Stephen Ministers trained in over 13,000 congregations worldwide.

Pastors are always on the front lines of care, especially during times of crisis. But there are many more needs for ongoing, one-to-one care that pastors can't effectively meet by themselves.

That's where Stephen Ministers come into play, meeting faithfully with care receivers for about an hour each week for as long as there's a need. All communication is kept confidential. Stephen Ministers also participate in supervision groups and continuing education sessions.

Stephen Ministry provides a Biblical solution to caring for people who are hurting. Galatians 6:2 says, "Bear one another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." 1 Thessalonians 5:11 says, "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up." Stephen Ministry helps congregations put these verses into action.

Laypeople are trained through 20 class sessions to provide emotional and spiritual care and support to both congregation members and non-members alike. A foundational part of their training is learning to listen to care receivers as they share painful feelings, because Stephen Ministers may at times help people carry some of the most difficult feelings they will ever bear."

### Looking to be **BAPTIZED** or **CONFIRMED**? LET RHONDA KNOW!

Are you new to Holy Comforter or the Episcopal Church, and want to learn more? Do you or your child desire to be baptized, or do you desire to have your baby baptized? If you're baptized, do you want to be confirmed, making your statement of faith before a bishop and receiving the laying on of hands for strengthening in the Spirit? Or, if you have already been confirmed in another Christian tradition, would you like to be received into the Episcopal Church, officially becoming a member of the worldwide Anglican Communion? Are you already confirmed, but feeling called to reaffirm your Christian faith?

#### IF ANY OF THESE ARE TRUE-OR IF ANY MIGHT BE TRUE-FOR YOU, PLEASE GET IN TOUCH WITH RHONDA.

In the Episcopal Church, only a bishop can confirm or receive people into the Episcopal Church, and personal reaffirmations of faith are made before a bishop. Therefore, these rites are done when a bishop visits, or when there is a convocation-wide confirmation service. Preparation is done in advance, however, and that's why Rhonda would like to know now who might like to go through the preparation. This several-meeting course is also a great introduction to the Episcopal Church and Anglicanism, for those who would just like to learn more.

Baptismal preparation is a little different and Rhonda can perform a baptism almost anytime, although certain dates, like Easter, are preferred.

# news from the newlin partnership



#### NEWLIN PARTNERSHIP AUDIENCE GATHERED FOR WORKSHOP ON "ENGAGING NEWLIN STUDENTS FOR ACADEMIC & SOCIAL SUCCESS"

On Monday, February 10, 2025, 19 tutors, Lucky Listeners, NP Board and community members gathered at Impact Alamance headquarters for a workshop presented by Dr. Cherrel Miller Dyce, Elon University Associate Professor and Executive Director of D.E.I. for the Dr. Jo Watts Williams School of Education. This \$1500 workshop grant to the Newlin Partnership was one of seven awarded in our community by Impact Alamance. Participants explored how they "need to understand, navigate, and be sensitive as we engage in our mission of 'improving academic outcomes for children enrolled at Newlin Elementary School'." NP board member, tutor, Lucky Listener, and a champion of advancing academic opportunities for all children, Kathy Landes, applied for the grant as a follow up to her participation in Impact Alamance's Parent Engagement Program. This current workshop, custom-tailored for our group, explored the many issues, obstacles, and opportunities a community- supported program such as The Newlin Literacy Project can offer to the children, parents, and administrators at Harvey Newlin Elementary School.

The workshop ended with all of us wanting more information, and we will continue to explore this in our monthly Lunch & Learn sessions.

My biggest takeaway was the idea that how I express my thoughts and feelings about Newlin students and their families in the community affects the outcome and effectiveness of our tutoring."

"What a wonderful opportunity to 'grapple' with the difficult issues challenging our schools. Of greatest significance was a challenge to identify our own biases within the safety and support of a group of professional colleagues committed to doing our best for each child we support. The discussions and resources provided are not just 'food for thought' but the foundation for greater assistance for our students."

"This workshop gave me the understanding that I need to examine my own biases around race and privilege, and, from there, to trace the effects that my biases and my own socialization have on how I tutor my student. Dr. Dyce's hands-on approach was sometimes difficult, but rewarded my effort with insight crucial to being able to more effectively teach my student."

"Dr. Dyce guided us to pull from our experiences and beliefs to create non-racist actions for ourselves when being with those who are diverse from ourselves."

"Dr. Dyce emphasized that implicit bias is created in the unconscious, usually a result of what everyone has been exposed to through their families, the media, their schooling, and their religion. The important thing to be aware of is that you are not the default position."

"We learned why implicit bias can be so devastating, without knowing it's being done to us."

Caroline and Ben Ansbacher were members of the first tutor training class taught by Betsey Savage in the early days of the Augustine Literacy Project, now the Newlin Literacy Project. For over ten years both of them worked with one child each year to help that student improve reading skills. They noted that they paid particular attention to building a caring relationship with their student, and hoped that the extra tutoring boost in reading would impact the student's future in a positive way.
