### A WORD FROM RHONDA

Dear siblings in Christ,

These are challenging times.

I wonder: did reading such a banal sentence about the days we are currently living, made you snort or laugh out loud? And yet, how many adjectives did I really need to pile on? Everyone can supply their own.

Here we are, facing conflicts and violence I feel sure none of us wanted; conflicts and violence that may have escalated or been expressed in new ways between the time I write this and when you read it. And by grace, maybe some of the conflicts we read about in today's news stories may have been de-escalated or achieved some peaceful (or relatively peaceful) resolution by then.

I know many of you serve as partners in lament, thoughtful conversation, and fervent prayer with each other. That is one of the many things I value about the community into which I have been so kindly welcomed in Holy Comforter. Thank you for comforting, encouraging, and exhorting each other as fellow disciples of Jesus Christ and citizens (or non-citizen residents) of this country.

As I mentioned at recent celebrations of the Eucharist, I, too, am available if you need a partner in conversation and prayer about current events. This is, of course, true however you vote, or whether you vote at all.

As your priest and pastor, one of my roles is to accompany you by prayer and listening, as you discern which words are yours to speak and which actions are yours to take, in this moment, in what Greek philosophers called the "polis": the public square, the common life we share with

everyone who finds themselves within the boundaries of this state and this country at this time.

Christians' political decisions are meant to be guided by what we call "the great commandment." Discerning how best to love God, our neighbors, and ourselves can be a challenge at times, but I do know that these three things are deeply connected. Our personal well-being is interwoven with the well-being of our neighbors, and how we care for each other and for ourselves is an expression of how we love God.

As you and I seek out ways to follow that great commandment, I do trust the Triune God will guide us. Do not lose heart. As our brother Paul wrote to the church in Philippi in another challenging moment:

"Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in [the apostles], and the God of peace will be with you." (Philippians 4:)
