

### **RECTOR AND FRIENDS BIBLE STUDY** SECOND SESSION THIS SUNDAY "JESUS, ANXIETY, AND US"

SUNDAY, MARCH 9 / WHERE: AUDITORIUM / 9:30-10:15

On Sundays in March, we are gathering in the auditorium between our two services to study some New Testament lessons with something to say about anxiety. Please bring your Bible – but if you forget it, come anyway! Each Sunday, we will read the lesson together. No advance preparation is necessary, but if you would like to read this week's lesson beforehand, you'll find it below. This Bible study is appropriate for adults and teens. See you there!

<sup>\*33</sup>Now many saw [Jesus and the disciples] going [to a deserted place to rest] and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them. <sup>34</sup>As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

<sup>35</sup> When it grew late, his disciples came to him and said, 'This is a deserted place, and the hour is now very late; <sup>36</sup> send them away so that they may go into the surrounding country and villages and buy something for themselves to eat.'

<sup>37</sup> But he answered them, 'You give them something to eat.'

They said to him, 'Are we to go and buy two hundred denarii worth of bread, and give it to them to eat?' <sup>38</sup> And he said to them, 'How many loaves have you? Go and see.' When they had found out, they said, 'Five, and two fish.'

<sup>39</sup> Then he ordered them to get all the people to sit down in groups on the green grass. <sup>40</sup> So they sat down in groups of hundreds and of fifties. <sup>41</sup> Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to his disciples to set before the people; and he divided the two fish among them all.

<sup>42</sup> And all ate and were filled; <sup>43</sup> and they took up twelve baskets full of broken pieces and of the fish. <sup>44</sup> Those who had eaten the loaves numbered five thousand men."



# lent and altar flowers – A CLARIFICATION

The tradition in the Episcopal Church, and in our parish, is to observe the penitential season of Lent by removing the color of flowers from our altar arrangements. The "altar flowers" become "altar greens" during this time of the church year.

This is a challenge to the creativity of the Flower Guild, as we endeavor to make beautiful arrangements in a monochromatic palette. It is also a challenge to parishioners, as many are (understandably) reluctant to pay the usual \$75 charge for altar arrangements when no flowers are involved.

Moving forward, Flower Guild has decided to reduce the price for altar arrangements during the Sundays of Lent. **\$25 for 2 arrangements** will cover our costs of materials, and hopefully encourage more donors during this time of the year. If you have already paid for a Lenten Sunday at the higher rate, then the difference will be refunded to you.
