

Phil was a member of the NC Army National Guard for six years from 1971-1977. In the spring of 1971, the last semester of his senior year in college at Western Carolina University, He was in the first US Draft Lottery and received a low number (105).

He will be telling several "mini" stories with a larger story of his time in the Guard, primarily focusing on his basic training from August-December, 1971 at Fort Polk Army Post in Louisiana. At that time, Fort Polk was well known in Army circles as "Little Vietnam". Phil enlisted with the Guard in Salisbury, NC and was in a Mechanized Infantry Unit.

Phil's entire basic training was focused on preparations to fight in the Vietnam War. About half of the battalion were guardsmen and half regular Army guys. The guardsmen returned to their homes after training while EVERY regular Army serviceman was sent directly to Vietnam. The guardsmen received the exact training alongside the regular guys so they were equally prepared to fight in the war if called. Phil looks forward to being with you.




