A WORD FROM RHONDA

Glorify the Lord, you angels and all powers of the Lord, (C) heavens and all waters above the heavens. Sun and moon and stars of the sky, glorify the Lord, praise him and highly exalt him for ever. Glorify the Lord, every shower of rain and fall of dew, all winds and fire and heat. Winter and Summer, glorify the Lord, praise him and highly exatt him for ever Glorify the Lord, (C) chill and cold, drops of dew and flakes of snow. First and cold, ice and sleet, glorify the Lord, praise him and highly exalt him for ever Glorify the Lord, (1) nights and days, (C) shining light and enfolding dark Storm clouds and thunderbotts, glorify the Lord, praise him and highly exalt him for ever.

A couple of weekends ago, I attended a diocesan meeting that had to be moved online due to icy, snowy weather. As we gathered on Zoom for Morning Prayer, we prayed together the portion of the "Song of Creation" that celebrates God's cosmic order. I smiled as we joined in glorifying God together with chill, cold, snow, frost, ice, and sleet: the very forces that were keeping us from meeting in person as we would have preferred to do. And yet, of course, these phenomena are our fellow creatures of God; they have their place in God's creation just as we human beings do; in some way, they glorify God just by being themselves; and it is right to thank God for them.

It's easier to imagine that cold and ice glorify God when one sits inside a warm house, with a reliable Internet connection facilitating a meeting, and a hot drink to sip on. It's harder when one is unhoused, or worrying about how to pay the heating bill next month, or stuck with an unpleasant or abusive companion, or alone and unable to get to a highly-anticipated coffee date with a friend. In those situations, we might wonder, how can the

forces that cause us pain possibly glorify God? It can be easier to blame the ice and snow for simply being, than to realize that we are caught in patterns of sin—sometimes our own, but very often stretching far beyond ourselves—that made it hard to glorify God, and hard to see the beauty in some of our fellow creatures of God.

In these situations, using our imaginations and trying a change of perspective can be helpful. That's especially true when we enjoy certain privileges or have certain forms of power at our disposal (like the knowledge that we can pay the increased heating bill that a cold snap brings). Our faith affirms that to thank God for the means to make snow angels is good; and to combine those thanks with remembering neighbors who don't have a warm house to return to, is better. To ask God for help in meeting our basic needs is good; and to join with neighbors to pool what we have in mutual aid, is even better. To share what we have is good; to work to ensure that everyone has what they need, through fair wages and necessary social supports, is better.

Friends, what are the things for which you find it challenging to glorify God? Where are the places where you find it hard to see your own fellowship with other creatures of God, including your fellow human beings? In what ways do your own privileges keep you from noting and responding to other people's needs and fears? Or, in what ways do feelings (like shame or embarrassment) about your own needs and fears keep you from reaching out to others to find paths forward together?

Trying on a change of perspective, sitting quietly with those insights long enough to see what God's invitation might be, and sharing what we learn or what we wonder about with even one sibling in Christ: these are steps that can help us to more fully glorify God, together, in all seasons.
