

IRA DIRECTLY TO A QUALIFIED CHARITY

....that you can give up to \$105,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified charity (this is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution,

or QCD) if you are age 70 ½ years or older, without having to pay income taxes on the gift? And that beginning in the year you turn 73, a QCD can count toward your annual required minimum distribution (RMD), also a tax-free gift? And that Holy Comforter is considered a qualified charity?

DID YOU

KNOW

The IRS recently issued a reminder about these options:

"The Internal Revenue Service reminds individual retirement arrangement (IRA) owners age 70½ and older that they can make up to \$105,000 in tax-free charitable donations during 2024 through qualified charitable distributions...For those age 73 or older, qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) also count toward the year's required minimum distribution (RMD).

Generally, IRA distributions are taxable, but QCDs remain taxfree if sent directly to a qualified charity by the trustee. To make a QCD for 2024, IRA owners should contact their IRA trustee soon to ensure the transaction completes by year-end.

Each eligible IRA owner can exclude up to \$105,000 in QCDs from taxable income. Married couples, if both meet qualifications and have separate IRAs, can donate up to \$210,000 combined. QCDs don't require itemizing deductions."

Remember also that QCDs lower your adjusted gross income (AGI) and therefore may potentially reduce taxes on Social Security and avoid increased Medicare premiums.

If you are considering making a gift to Holy Comforter using a QCD, contact the institution that administers your IRA to ensure the right steps are followed to have these funds sent directly to the church.

Financial Report

Pledged revenues for October were \$33,062, and unpledged gifts added another \$9,082. It appears likely that we will reach our revenue budget for the year, which is a welcome change from our experience during and immediately after the pandemic. Disbursements for the month totaled \$39,304, including a large, budgeted expense. When investment and interest income were added to the mix, we finished October with a monthly surplus of \$8,881, and an accumulated surplus of \$56,616 for the year to date.

Our **cash balance stood at \$83,842**, and in addition to that we have **\$120,000 in certificates of deposit**. Giving tends to be above average in November and December, so we are optimistic that our financial condition will be stronger at year end than has been the case in recent years. We resume paying a rector in January, so the financial cushion we have accumulated will be extremely helpful as we move into 2025.

The Stewardship campaign is coming along nicely, but as I write this, I do not have up to date information including cards received on Stewardship Sunday. We have over 70 pledges so far and hope for 100 or more. It is not unusual for pledges to continue to arrive in December, I confess that mine has been among the late arrivals on occasion.

It will be helpful to have pledge cards by December 9, when the Vestry needs to complete our 2025 budget. We are fortunate to have some faithful parishioners who make **gifts of securities** towards the end of the year. We ask that any such gifts be initiated with your investment firm **no later than December 18th**, and ideally earlier. And please notify our financial administrator, Julia Buffington, to be alert for your gift. We need to have the securities in our account by December 27 to ensure cash proceeds are available by December 31. For any who might own appreciated securities but have not given in this way before, consider that such a gift allows Holy Comforter to receive the full value of the securities, the donor can deduct the full amount from their income taxes, and there is no capital gain tax liability.

In closing, we express our gratitude to our faithful and generous parishioners for your many gifts, financial and otherwise. We have endured a few challenges recently, but your steadfast support has given us a good foundation as we move into a new year with a new rector.



After a long season of waiting and preparation, it is almost time to welcome our new rector!

Rhonda Lee's first Sunday at Holy Comforter will be January 5th. As we look forward to embracing her into our Holy Comforter family, there will many opportunities be in the new year to get to know Rhonda and experience her thoughtful leadership. In the meantime, below is a glimpse into her ministry philosophy, worship style, and pastoral care approach. For those who wish



to learn even more, her book, Seek and You Will Find: Discovering a Practice of Prayer, will soon be available in the church library, with two copies ready to borrow.

WHAT IS YOUR APPROACH TO MINISTRY?

"I help Christians and seekers imagine what it might look like for us to accept Jesus' invitation to love God, neighbors, and ourselves; and I worship, pray, and serve with them as we respond together."

HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE YOUR WORSHIP STYLE?

"My style is 'mid' church, neither 'low' nor 'high,' rooted in our Anglican tradition as found in our liturgical books. As a priest who has worked with many churches, I am flexible, appreciating worship that maintains our Episcopal forms while honoring local gifts and customs (e.g., in musical choices and culturally significant celebrations)."

WHAT IS YOUR PERSPECTIVE ON LAY MINISTRY?

"I take seriously the fact that all baptized persons (regardless of age) are ministers of Christ's church. In parishes, I encourage apprenticeships and shared and rotating leadership to involve more people in ministry, make clear that ministries are the responsibility of the whole church, and reduce burnout."

HOW DO YOU FOSTER INCLUSIVITY AND SHARED LEADERSHIP?

"In all areas of my ministry, I ask, 'Whose voice is missing from this discussion, making decisions and setting direction? How can we involve more voices and share power, authority, and accountability?"

WHAT IS YOUR APPROACH TO PASTORAL CARE?

"Pastoral care offers presence and attention, both on an ongoing basis and in crisis situations. I strive to be available to listen, to pray, and to accompany people as they reflect on their lives and how God is present. This happens over lunch, on the telephone, in hospitals, in correspondence, and on buses and street corners when people approach me unexpectedly. Sometimes pastoral care means asking hard questions, accompanying people as they consider their options in tough situations, and offering professional referrals as needed. And it sometimes means addressing the root causes of suffering, sometimes, for example, by participating in non-partisan political action."

HOW DO YOU VIEW STEWARDSHIP?

"Stewardship is a lifelong practice modeled on the Eucharist: offering gifts, giving thanks, sharing them, and finding ourselves and our neighbors abundantly blessed. My financial giving has grown over the years. This practice has increased my gratitude and allowed me to speak to the joy of giving as I help fellow Christians discern how God calls us to share our gifts, whether money or time, education, and skills."

As we prepare to begin this new chapter, I once again offer my deepest gratitude to our supply clergy and our Rector Emeritus, David Williams, for guiding us faithfully through this period of transition. Most of all, I'm grateful for you - our outstanding parishioners. Your dedication has blessed our parish, and I am thankful for your service, support, and leadership.
