Course	Dept	Description
CHRISTIAN CHURCH LEADERSHIP I	MIN-201	An integrating course for students, particularly those who prepare for the vocation in religious education – specific areas covered are the recruitment and training of workers, supervision of the learning situation, promotional work, relationships with the Pastor and the local church, principles, and practices of good business management of Pastors.
HOMILETICS II	MIN-255	A thorough study and preparation for the exegesis and exposition of the Scriptures — A study of the method of outlining step by step the process of preparing and delivering an effective sermon. Defines expository preaching and gives a systematic process of preparing and preaching an expository sermon, deriving sermon structure from Biblical structure.
APOLOGETICS	THY-316	This course breaks new ground by bringing together an unusually wide range of apologetically arguments. Consisting of articles written by Christians from a variety of fields, the text breaks down difficult issues into segments.
POST EXILE	BIB-103	A study of the last historical books: Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther: the restoration of the Jews; what took place after seventy years of Israel's captivity; historical record of the transition back to the homeland, struggles and oppositions faced in the transformation, Ezra's rebuilding of the priesthood; Nehemiah's struggles to rebuild the walls around Jerusalem, and the part Esther played in the saving the nation of Israel.
KINGDOM PERIOD	BIB-204	A study of historical books of the Bible, I & II Samuel, I & II Kings, and I and II Chronicles; the theocracy of Eli and Samuel; the behavior, accomplishments and failures of the kings serving Israel from Israel's greatest prosperity to its decline.
OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY	BIB-200	Each book of the Old Testament is introduced and considered in its theme and general content.
THESIS & DISSERTATION	EDU-690 EDU-790	Part I, II, III= (3) UNITS EACH SEMESTER (9) UNITS IN ALL Students in the Masters' program will develop and compile an original work demonstrating the ability to add to knowledge in their area/field of study and present the same to be accepted by the College. Must first present a Research Proposal for approval. * Pre-requisite is ENG-304
SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY	THY-204	This course will focus on God, the Trinity, and the Holy Spirit; references various interpretations of contemporary Christian groups; a wealth of information on Judaism, the Jewish views toward Jesus, anti-Semitism, and Jewish Christian reference today; will provide a helpful stimulus in understanding the relationship between the practice of one's faith and the belief context into which that practice fits, and the nature of a theological vision, inspiration and authority of Scripture, the interpretation of those Scriptures and the nature of the God whom we worship.
CHRISTIAN ETHICS	COU-504	A study of the moral principles derived from the Christian faith; how to exercise Biblical standards when dealing with ethical issues. Probes the Biblical and theological aspects of the 20th century ethics, social awareness, societal conscience, and the affection of change in society. The student will learn how to analyze moral decisions and make wise choices; develop a style of moral decision-making that enables one to respond to the issues of life with moral consistency, ethical accountability, and integrity.
CHRISTIAN COUNSELING PRACTICES	COU-415	A survey of the history of counseling theories and methods within and outside the church will be foundational part of this class. A relatively detailed study of Biblical psycho-analytical behavior and third force counseling theory will be undertaken.
