In this workshop students will discover how to make a charcoal pour to create interesting texture in their watercolor paintings that can't be created with a brush. Wear shoes that can get wet or be prepared to take their shoes off! We will literally be throwing a bucket of water onto the charcoal powdered surface. (Outside, of course!) Linda will provide an 11" x 14" sheet of watercolor that has already been prepared for you. But participants will learn the process, create a full sheet to take home and use their own imagination to make beautiful textured filled artworks.

We will paint the subject, using watercolor, and adding some collage, creating a beautiful textured work of art. Linda will demonstrate a crow or a cardinal. This process also works well for florals and landscapes. It makes great markings for rocks and trees. Linda will bring images of crows and cardinals for students to use or they may choose their own favorite species of bird to use. See supply list for size image needs to be. Keep in mind that White birds or White flowers don't work well for this. Linda will also bring a variety of papers for collage and discuss how you can make your own collage papers which are acceptable in most watercolor society exhibitions.
