SUMMER EXHIBIT AT REDDI ARTS

We will be participating in an exhibition at the new Reddi Arts location at 1731 Main St., Jacksonville, for the month of July. This exhibit is not juried; it's more of an opportunity to show and maybe sell your work. There will be a 30% commission charged by Reddi Arts for paintings that sell but there is no charge to enter and only a few framing guidelines. In addition to metal, the frame can be wood or plastic frame, but no glass, please. Also, please have a wire hanger attached securely to both sides for ease in hanging, <u>no</u> fixed metal hangers.

We have had a number of people sign up to participate so we will limit the paintings to a medium to small size, no larger than 28" in either direction. The work should be done in watercolor media.

Take in will be Saturday, July 1, from 11:00 to 1:00 and will be hung as entries are delivered. Come early for the best location and maybe help hang!

Take down will be Saturday, July 29, from 11:00 to 1:00. Anyone that cannot be there during those hours should contact Barbara Holt before July to arrange a different delivery or pickup. If you have any questions please feel free to contact Barbara Holt at

There will be a small reception at Reddi Arts on Sunday, July 9, from 2-4 pm. There will be a cake and a few refreshments. No awards will be given but Mary McCormick has invited us to join them for a meet and greet with customers at the store.

No online entry for this show. Paintings entered are not disqualified from entry in the Fall show. If your name is not on the sign up list and you would like to participate, please email Barbara. She will contact the names on the list in June to get painting title, size and sale price for each. Currently, we can fit two entries for each participant. 

Sharpen your skills this summer! For all level of artists - from beginning to advanced!

We will start with a postage stamp-size pencil value sketch from photo references. We will do a 20 minute, one color value painting from reference photo. Next, we will do a 20 minute full color or limited palette painting from a sketch of the reference photo. After we take notes and sketches then we'll hide original photo. We will paint a grisaille watercolor starting with an under painting. We will use the photo referenced to the right or feel free to bring your own.





Pablo F. Rivera Bio

Pablo graduated from Cooper Union Art School in New York City where he also attended workshops at The School of Visual Arts and The Educational Alliance. Multi-disciplined artist, Pablo has exhibited his work in photography, sculpture and painting in New York, New Jersey, Connecticut, California and Florida. Locally, he has shown work at R. Roberts Gallery, St. Augustine Art Association, The Museum of Contemporary Art, Jacksonville, The Cummer Museum, Avondale Art works, Southlight Gallery, The Vault Gallery and the Ritz Museum, where his portraits, as part of Through Our Eyes show, just returned from an extended exhibit in South Africa. In this workshop you will have three days to explore and experiment! No pressure to complete a master piece. "What if?", "Why not?", and "Let's do it!" will be our mantra. We will experience the abandonment of mingling, running and splattering paint. We will explore mark making with stamps, stencils, tools found around your home, garage and in nature. We will be creating backgrounds on yupo and watercolor paper. One day we will use watercolors the next day fluid acrylics or acrylic inks. Once the paint is dry you will utilize negative and/or positive painting and lifting to use your underpainting to your advantage. A process with endless possibilities for the casual realists, impressionistic and abstract painters.

"Watercolor on yupo was never my favorite until I tried this technique. I start with no preconceived idea of what I will eventually paint. Yes, it's kind of scary but this technique is so fun you forget your fears."





Libit Jones Bio

The last 20 plus years have been devoted to exploring water media and its many possibilities. I've gone from using only transparent watercolors, to rolling on gouache, from watercolor to fluid acrylic and back to watercolor, and from hating yupo to loving it. As a teacher I am continually learning new things and am inspired with new ideas from my students. That is why I love teaching as much as I love painting.

Artist Statement: Art, like life, gives us plenty of opportunities to learn and to grow. I say, let's take advantage of them all.

The Jacksonville Watercolor Society would like to thank all the young artists who participated in our



GEORGE TOBI - REMEMBERED

George Tobi passed away this year and will be remembered fondly by those who knew him for his beautiful peaceful landscapes and his gentle manner.



He was a charter member of the Jacksonville Watercolor Society and actively participated in juried shows from 1983 through 2018. George was also on the JWS board and show committees during the 80's. He left a legacy of artwork over the 40+ years he was a member of JWS.

Before his passing, George donated art supplies and frames that he was no longer using to JWS and they were put to good use in our outreach programs at Westminster Woods. JWS is appreciative of the generous donation made in George Tobi's name and plans to use it for a George Tobi Memorial Award at future shows. At George's passing, his family asked that in lieu of flowers, a donation be made to Jacksonville Watercolor Society or other charity of choice.
