Jennie Szaltis will host our first JWS Artist of the Year demonstration. She was recognized as a 2018 Artist of the Year for her service to JWS and her award winning art, and as she is a well known watercolor instructor, we can look forward to a colorful and instructive meeting.

Jennie has been a Jacksonville Watercolor Society member for over 20 years, and has served the organization as Show Chair, V.P of Shows, President. She is also a member of the Central Florida Watercolor Society and the Florida Watercolor Society.

Jennie loves the creative process and has been teaching art techniques since the 1980s. After studying Fine Arts at Mississippi University for Women, she opened *Studios for Creating*, a Visual Arts School,



There, she and her staff taught watercolor and the basic art medium to students of all ages. Today, she holds small, intimate classes for her students out of her painting studio in San Marco. Learn more about Jennie and the classes she offers at <u>www.jennieszaltis.com</u>.

Jennie will be demonstrating her favorite technique in watercolor: negative painting and the intrigue it can add to a painting..

- Plan from the beginning. It is important to save the space for it. It may not be a part of the beginning but you don't want to miss the opportunity.
- Build it. There are several layers to effective negative painting. The more layers, the more depth.
- There is a good deal of glazing involved and it is important to keep your layers clean.
- The most difficult part: KNOWING WHEN TO STOP

## An Editorial Perspective: Showing Your Work or DANG IT, YOU GOTTA HANG IT!!!

You <u>are</u> an artist. You attend meetings and watch painting demonstrations. You study art books and stare at paintings in museums and galleries. You go to workshops. You watch YOUTUBE painting videos.

In creating that painting, you worked to create something lovely, unique, or challenging, that shares **"the artist-you"** with those who view it. Perhaps they will like it, maybe they will be taken with your design or your concept, or your style, or your skill. Perhaps they will not be impressed. But people will stop and look and think, and may see something you see...or perhaps see something different. An art show is <u>communication</u>...of perceptions, observations, emotions, struggles and triumphs.

We are fortunate enough to belong to a watercolor society with some very skilled artists who are regularly recognized by winning awards—a well-earned achievement which keeps us in good artistic company and gives us all something to aspire to.

However, remember, **all** our paintings are meant to be juried and, hopefully, hung and enjoyed, along with those of the award winners!. **That's what makes a <u>SHOW</u> and that is what makes us all winners!**!

Get that painting framed and get it to take-in so we can stand in front of it and think about you and all it took for you to make it!

#### R. Tuni Weiss Artist of the Year - 2019 Jacksonville Watercolor Society

The Artist of the Year Award is a once in a lifetime honor awarded to a member who has given great service to the organization as well as displaying great talent

Born in New Jersey, Tuni married her husband, Jim, in 1979 and has 3 grown sons. A licensed teacher, she taught cosmetology in vocational schools in New Jersey, and lived in the Hudson Valley region of New York for 16 years before finally relocating to the wonderful city of Saint Augustine in 2003. With no art background, she launched a rich watercolor journey.

- 2009 Joined Jacksonville Watercolor Society, and received an an "Honorable Mention Award" in the first show she entered
- 2009-2020 Provided support for nearly every JWS show's take-in, even assisting entrants with corrective framing issues
- 2010 JWS Show Chairman.
- 2011-2015 VP of Workshops
- 2015–2019 President of JWS
- 2016 Began teaching the Outreach "Watercolor Class" at Westminster Woods in Julington Creek and, in return, secured a continuing venue for the JWS Fall Show in the Museum Gallery
- 2020 Co-VP of Shows.

In 2019 Tuni extended her watercolor focus statewide, and has been appointed to a position with the Florida Watercolor Society as Assistant Convention Facilitator.

She has taken many classes and workshops with local and world renowned artists, and has **received numerous awards including "Best of Show"**. She belongs to several art societies: The American Watercolor Society, St. Augustine Art Association, Tallahassee Watercolor Society, Southern Watercolor Society, National Watercolor Society, Florida Watercolor Society and Jacksonville Watercolor Society, and is proud to display her art pieces at galleries and shows and has paintings in private collections across the US and in museums in Texas, Florida and Ohio.

SWOP Shop This Month



Egyptian Art Review Cummer Art Museum February 2020

If you haven't made it to Egypt or The British Museum yet you must make it to the Cummer for this fabulous show of Egyptian Art from the Brooklyn Museum in New York. This is better than a book review as you can take your sketchbook with you and while you draw you can really get to know these pieces. Walk around them and breath in the magic of this art form. It's been around longer than any other form including both Greek and Roman art.

"Striking Power: Iconoclasm in Ancient Egypt" will be there through April 26th. Iconoclasm is the purposeful destruction of images for either religious or political reasons. People change little if ever. We still do this today. In business or politics they call this "Creative Destruction". (Read Joseph A. Schumpeter) There really is nothing new under the sun.

The stories portrayed in this collection are those of Hatshepsut (a woman) and Akhenaten. The long and short of it is that Hatshepsut believed in many gods while Akhenaten believed in only one god. Many think that he is the founder of Judaism. Depending on which movie or book **you've read may lead you to your chosen way of thinking. By the way Hatshepsut was a** wonderful architect. I think the guys were jealous! Many of the builders thought she was having **an affair with her "contractor" and fellow architect Senemut. Lot's of nasty graffiti on those walls! So then, even back in Ancient Egypt if you didn't agree with something you could smash it to** smithereens.

This space is way too small to go into a full discussion of Egyptian Art. Indeed it's often a full focused course of study. But to walk through the display is to get a feeling of something almost supernatural. The serene silence seems to talk to you from thousands of years ago in the past. We are all creatures making footprints on timeless sands, and now we have these somewhat unearthly images to remind us we're passing along too.

Every time I look at Egyptian art I want to listen to Aida! And dress like Cleopatra who murdered her sister for power. Some things never change. Sounds like "Family Feud" or "Cairo Housewives" doesn't it? But don't miss it. Then take a walk in our restored gardens and look at our Nile. The St. John's River is lovely this time of year!
