Let's Play Outside the Box

Don't miss Geri Groenert's demonstration at the April 23 Meeting, featuring Stonehenge Aqua black paper (www.legionpaper.com) and Fine Tec pearlescent paints. Black paper is an exciting new world. Instead of building shadows, one builds light,

one transforms negative space into positive space.



Geri Groenert is JWS Artist of the Year 2022 and Co-VP Programs & Workshops. Geri has had an interest in art from an early age. However it was not until she took an art class taught by a JWS member that her fascination with watercolors began.

Born in Abergavenny, a small village in southeastern Wales UK, Geri was raised in a USAF family and married a Naval pilot. Moving frequently she's lived throughout Europe, North Africa, the Caribbean, and the US. She's called St. Augustine home for the past 16 years. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Hello Fellow Artists!

I have been teaching several beginning watercolorists and have noticed some common pratfalls for those just starting out. These are the big three:

1. Using cheap paper and paints. I know it's tempting for beginners to cut corners or maybe just not realize that these two things could mean the difference between success and failure. Good paper can take a lot of abuse and if you need to lift or erase, a cheap paper just won't be able to hold up. Try to buy the best you can-everyone has a favorite paper but Fabriano (my fav), Arches, or Saunders are all good. The weight is not as important but it should be at least 140 lb. I will use 140 for a quarter sheet painting and 300 for a half or full sheet.

And stay away from student grade paints (Cotman's). They just will not perform as well and you will not be happy with the outcome.

- 2. Using too small a brush for the job at hand. Use the largest brush you can for the majority of the painting, especially in the early stages. You can't do a nice wash with a small brush. Save the small brushes for any detail work at the end.
- 3. Doing a wimpy watercolor. Pay attention to your darks and lights. If your painting is too much in the same value, nothing stands out. Remember- light against dark, or dark against light. Don't be afraid to make the darks dark- it will make all those lights you remembered to save stand out and sparkle.

MEMBERS' SUMMER NON-JURIED SHOW JULY 1-29, 2024 REDDI ARTS

JWS will once again have a Members' Summer Show, hosted by Reddi Arts,1731 Main St, Jacksonville. This is will be in July and will hang from Monday, July 1 to Monday, July 29. There will be a reception on Sunday, July 7(time to be announced).

This is a non-juried show—it is an opportunity to show and sell your artworks. We will relax our framing standards as we have done in the past for Member's non-juried show and allow framing of any material. The work should be done in watercolor, of course and if framed behind "glass", it must be plexiglass. Please have a wire hanger attached for ease in hanging, not fixed metal hangers. Paintings should be no larger than 28" in either direction.

There will be a **30% commission charged by Reddi Arts for paintings that sell, so price accordingly**. More information will be provided regarding take-in and times, etc in the weeks to come.

Important Note: We will be charging a \$15.00 entry fee **per person**. This is a change from our past non-juried shows and is in line with typical show fees. This is a per person fee and not per painting so you may enter two paintings and still only pay a one time fee for this show.
